

FE-ED UPDATE



FE-ED Report & Statistics For September 23, 2025

Do you ever have a day where you keep wondering "what next?" That's how the day began, checking the Second Harvest Heartland site and discovering the delivery semi was scheduled for 1:30-2:00 pm instead of noon!

We begin distribution at 2:00 pm and the Phoenix Learning Center (PLC) students arrived about 1:00 pm to assist us at this first drop of the school year. Monticello Help Center called with excess food that needed to be distributed ASAP, so we switch-ed our car for our truck with Belle at the high school and went to Monticello to pick up the excess food items.

We were short some key volunteers. The school bus with PLC students arrived and we had nothing for them to do, but it gave us time to exchange names and chat with them. 2:00 pm and still no truck so they left, their bus driver said he would buy them a scoop of ice cream at Culvers. We got notice that the semi had broken down with no idea of when it would arrive.

When the truck finally did came we had a lot of food, including meat from Grace Place, and the largest cabbage heads I have ever seen!! We lost some customers who had to leave but most stayed for the entire event which ended about 4:30 pm. We distributed 160 boxes.

We had an extra box, so Russ and I took it to drop it off to a neighbor in Buffalo. When we arrived we found him on the floor in the garage and we could not get him up. We got another neighbor to assist us. Thus ending an unusual drop from start to finish! Everyone came together to make sure we provided food to 424 people who needed it.

NOTE: The small freezer and large freezer in the church kitchen will be stocked with meat from Grace Place for our FE-ED food drops. There will be signs showing progress toward reaching the number of items we need. Please thank Grace Place for their generous donation. House of Grace has been our partner since we began. We are now helping Waverly Food Shelf and the Phoenix Learning Center on a consistent basis. The PLC school voted FE-ED as their favorite service activity last year.

We had 20 volunteers giving 94 hours to make this drop happen.

Finance Update



Can you believe it's Fall already? There's nothing exciting happening with the Finance Team right now. Below is a summary of the August Income and Expenses. September totals weren't available at time of print.

August Total Income \$9,315.93

Total General Fund (designated giving) \$7,525.93.

This includes Palabra Viva rent \$550.00, Apportionment Giving \$350.03; Sunday school giving \$100; RaiseRight income \$109.71 and other giving.

Total Building Fund Giving Income \$1,790.00

August Total Expenses \$9,326.36

This includes salary items \$4,838.82 for pastor, secretary, janitor, pianist, and all benefit costs. Trustees \$3,974.16 which includes utilities, maintenance agreements, and insurance. Other expenses of \$513.38 for office supplies and Apportionments paid to conference.
