

## **Pastor Mark's Column**

Whenever you cry out to me,
I'll answer.
I'll be with you in troubling times.
I'll save you and glorify you.
- Psalm 91:15 CEB

In times of profound sorrow and confusion, we often find ourselves at a loss for words. The recent horrific school shootings in Minneapolis have left our nation grieving and searching for answers that seem painfully out of reach. In these moments, we are called to remember the ancient practice of the Psalms, which gives voice to our deepest laments. The Psalms do not ask us to hide our pain or our anger from God; instead, they invite us to bring our raw, honest cries into God's presence, trusting that we are heard and known even in our despair.

This deep knowing is at the heart of our relationship with God. Psalm 139 reminds us that we are fully seen and fully loved by our Creator, who searches us and knows us intimately. In the shadow of such senseless violence, it can feel impossible to believe that God is present. Yet, the witness of scripture is that God meets us precisely in the rubble of our brokenness. We are not called to understand, but to trust that God's love encircles us—ahead and behind—even when the path forward is shrouded in grief.

Our faith does not offer easy answers, but it does offer a refuge and a hope that the world cannot give. Psalm 91 speaks of abiding in the shelter of the Almighty, a promise not of a life free from trouble, but of a God who is with us in the midst of it. This is the "but God" moment we cling to: the world is filled with fear, \*but God\* is our refuge; the news is overwhelming, \*but God\* promises to answer when we call. This hope equips us not to ignore the pain around us, but to face it without falling into despair, supporting one another as a community that grieves together and hopes together.

As we move forward, let us be a people who call upon the Lord, not only for our own comfort but for the strength to be agents of God's healing and peace. Let us extend the safety we find in God's shadow to those around us who are fearful and vulnerable. May we, empowered by a God who knows our name and calls us beloved, have the courage to work for a world where such tragedies are no more, reflecting God's glory through acts of love, compassion, and relentless hope.

# FE-ED REPORT FOR THE August 26th FOOD DROP

We celebrated the 10th Anniversary of FE-ED this month!



FE-ED had an entry in the *Celebrate Montrose Home Town Days Parade* with our parade walkers from House of Grace and Montrose UMC giving out bottled water (with FE-ED labels showing monthly drop information) and goodie bags with candy from MUMC. Russ Johnson, our *Wright County Outstanding Senior Citizen Volunteer of the Year*, was seated in the back of the pick-up truck and tossing out candy too. Russ has been a member of FE-ED for all 10 years, as well as many other volunteer organizations that nominated him for this special recognition award!

FE-ED sponsored the Roasted Corn Booth at Celebrate Montrose Home Town Days festivities Friday, August 15th. The roasted corn, donated by Untiedt's, was enjoyed by many, and the Mexican Street Corn option added this year was a hit! Our FE-ED volunteers wore their new FE-ED T-shirts provided through a grant from Grace Place Collaborative and the Delano Youth Hockey Association. What a blessing to have the shirts to get the FE-ED logo in front of the community.



Ten years is a long time to hold at least one food distribution each month, even through Covid-19! We are giving out close to 10,000 pounds of food from Second Harvest and our local partners each month. That's a lot of food!

We served 40 families at our very first distribution and now reach 160 - 180 families per month! Thank you to our dedicated volunteers who have made FE-ED possible, continuously growing and vibrant for a decade!

We held the August drop in the MUMC parking lot as the community center was being used for the primary election. I believe our driver was new as it took a very long time to locate our purchases. We had ordered 2 mystery pallets, so we were surprised by what was added to our order. Even though it was a warm day, our volunteers made it a fun experience and did not get overheated.

We had 25 volunteers giving 102 ¼ hours to make this drop a success! A total of 160 boxes were packed with cabbage, onions, carrots, baby Yukon gold potatoes, apples, cantaloupe, zucchinis, cucumbers, kale, Bok choy, sweet corn, pasta, rice, some sweets, breads, frozen meats and milk.
