Pastor Mark's Column

THE ACTS OF THE APOSTLES of the Holy Spirit

The community of believers was one in heart and mind. None of them would say, "This is mine!" about any of their possessions, but held everything in common...There were no needy persons among them. Those who owned properties or houses would sell them, bring the proceeds from the sales, and place them in the care and under the authority of the apostles. Then it was distributed to anyone who was in need. - Acts 4:32, 34-35

When I was in middle school, I attended a Christian school that changed my life. I was exposed to charismatic Christianity where they lean heavily on the authority of scripture and the power of the Holy Spirit. They spoke in tongues, performed faith healings, and spoke out against popular culture. Obviously this place wasn't a United Methodist school. They firmly believed in an insular faith: you were supposed to do the right thing and make believers. That was the task and it was as simple as that. They got it very wrong in many ways: they would kick students out if they got pregnant, teach that pop culture was utterly depraved, and they weren't concerned at all with helping their community. But they also got a few things right: leading a life of faith focused on spiritual growth and the power of the Holy Spirit.

I admit that even though the Christian school showed me the wrong way of living a life of faith they did introduce me to the Holy Spirit that still drives me today to be a better Christian and pastor. I still believe that spiritual growth and the power of the Holy Spirit are important to living a healthy life. I've gone through many difficulties in life, but the Holy Spirit's presence always brought me back to the faith.

The Spirit has been my rock during the good and the bad. It has been the shining light that good will overcome the evils of this world. That's why I think it's time for us to reconnect. It's time for us to reconnect with hope. It's time to reconnect with our faith. It's time to reconnect with the Holy Spirit. It's time for us to delve into the book of Acts to explore the third person of the Holy Trinity and Jesus' continuing presence in this world. *Spoiler alert!* Jesus lives in each and every one of us when we choose love instead of anger. Jesus lives in us when we choose hope instead of despair. Jesus lives in us when we choose healing over destruction.


The book of Acts reminds me somewhat of that Christian school. The Holy Spirit is prevalent and wild calling everyone into a life of faith through Jesus Christ. Miracles and spontaneous baptisms occur in the unlikeliest of places. This is very unlike United Methodists! Acts challenges our faith in uncomfortable ways. It depicts the very beginnings of Christianity, but not in a way that we would expect. You see, ancient historians didn't care about differentiating between fact and fiction. All the historians cared about was depicting the events in such a manner that you *felt* that you were there. Acts is a story changing our perceptions of how Christ is still involved in the world post-resurrection.

During the next six weeks, we'll explore the wilderness of Acts, catch up with the Holy Spirit, and use our imagination! The sermon series will follow the book "Acts: Catching Up with the Spirit" by Matthew L. Skinner. Skinner reminds us that this isn't a boring book chronicling the very beginning of Christianity (in fact Acts was written 50-60 years after Jesus' death and resurrection). Instead, Acts challenges us to think of how the good news of Jesus Christ changes the world! We'll have to use our imagination to expound and explore this wild world of miracles, angels, and healings. We'll explore the works of the Holy Spirit and discern how the Spirit is working in our lives. This series isn't a search for knowledge, but an adventurous search for Jesus' continued presence in our lives!



I invite you to join us in this adventurous spiritual renewal as we delve into the book of Acts. If you've ever wondered where

God is in this world of pain and hurt, then this is the series for you! If you've ever wondered where the Holy Spirit comes from and how the third person


• Does anyone know who borrowed/took the new, unopened **DEHUMIDIFIER** from the Janitor's Closet back in July?

First, I sent out giving statements to church members, if they had giving, and letters discussing our church parking lot. Also included was a quick form to fill in on how you are willing to support our church parking lot. Please make sure you fill out this form and return it in the self-addressed envelope or place it in the offering plate. We want to make sure there is church support before we move forward with anything.

Second, a reminder that we have to pay apportionments to our church conference each year. We are fairly low in our giving towards our apportionments through July (\$1,700 of the \$10,000 we need to pay). Your support towards this is appreciated. We need to avoid pulling money from our savings to pay this if we can.

We were so happy to be back at the Montrose Community Center after 2 months of being outside in the weather! It was a little challenging for the people to turn around in the parking lot with many vehicles parked there. The city streets are definitely getting better and we hope next month they will be greatly improved.

Our FE-ED booth at the "*Burgers in the Park*" event was well attended and we noticed more people from the Montrose community coming to this month's drop. Grace Place and Montrose United Methodist Church shared the booth since they are the FE-ED partners. Volunteers, Pastor Cathy and Pastor Mark handed out information, candy, and LED light bulbs.

FE-ED meets on the third Tuesday of the month at noon to place our order for the food items from SHH (Second Harvest Heartland) and review and make plans for the drops. We share a potluck meal and rotate between MUMC and Grace Place locations. Join us if you want to be more involved. We can always use more volunteers the day of the drop too.

Our community contributed a lot of extras:

- We received 15 large boxes of bread, 4-5 boxes of apples, 1 box of cauliflower, and 3-4 boxes of onions from the Waverly food shelf.
- We received fresh green beans from Dennis Epple's Farm (Diane Rux's brother).

- Untiedt's provided 55 bags of beautiful sweet corn,
 10 boxes of eggplant, zucchini, and 20 boxes of cantaloupe.
- We received a lot of frozen meat from Buffalo Food Shelf and KFC.
