Meet our Guest Speakers: Orchid Mounting Demonstration and Workshop by the Flamingo Gardens Orchidteers

You've heard us talk about the Orchidteers at Flamingo Gardens. The Orchidteers have been mounting and maintaining the orchids at Flamingo Gardens for eight years. They are volunteers of the Horticultural Department and are associated with Flamingo Gardens Orchid Society.

The Orchidteers have mounted over five (5) thousand orchids at Flamingo Gardens, from exotic species and hybrids to native Florida seedlings. There was no handbook on how to make a Botanical Garden an orchid destination, however these volunteers have been successful placing orchids throughout the Gardens. They have learned through trial and error what works and doesn't work. They will have some recommendations for us on the "easy" orchids to mount on your trees and palms.

The Orchidteers also save orchid "divisions" that fall from trees. They will do a no-frills demonstration on their way of mounting an orchid division on a piece of wood, and will be available to help us mount our own orchids during the workshop.

FGOS Members: Have an orchid you wish to mount? Bring it in along with a mount of your choice. The Orchidteers will have some mounts and Phalaenopsis for sale, reasonably priced. Bamboo, cedar shakes, fencing boards and some cork tubes - all pre-wired and ready for you to mount your orchid.





- ★ **Coryanthes** (ko-ree-AN-theez) A genus of 44 species of epiphytes with extraordinary flowers from the American tropics commonly called bucket orchids, related to *Stanhopea* and *Gongora*, it was described by Hooker in 1831, the name derived from the Greek meaning "helmet flower" in reference to the helmet-shaped epichile of the lip.
