FANTASTIC FUN IN NYC WITH ORCHIDS

It was recently brought to my attention that there is a big orchid event in New York City that is worthy of mention in our humble newsletter. The New York Botanical Garden's 2026 Orchid Show, running until April 26th, has featured an unusual guest designer who has created incredible vignettes of mundane cityscapes festooned with glorious orchid plants! The familiar has become softly unfamiliar with such beauty surrounding and being a part of it. This guest "flower magician" is an anonymous gentleman, a floral artist, who has adopted the title Mr. Flower Fantastic, and to preserve his anonymity and to protect himself from allergies, he wears a full mask with a respirator attachment. He is a local New Yorker, ironically from the Jamaica area of Queens and whose mother is a native Jamaican! The event has been dubbed "The Orchid Show: Mr. Flower Fantastic's Concrete Jungle."

MFF, as he is often referred to, has taken such lackluster urban structures and transformed them into lush displays with tropical touches. He has a dumpster filled with garbage bags and decorated with phalaenopsis, a free-standing trash can sprouts a variety of orchid species, a fire hydrant drips with lavender dendrobiums and orchids gracefully flow down the front of a brownstone. A faux subway entrance includes cascading yellow *Oncidium* and a laundromat has front loading washing machines filled with orchids visible in the round glass doors like terrariums. There's a pizza place, a car wash, a simple park bench, a fire escape and a newsstand where visitors are offered handouts on orchid culture.

In addition to all the magnificent orchid exhibits, there are a number of other activities that complement the visual beauty of the show. Culture and conservation classes are offered, and there is an evening event featuring a DJ, cocktails and snacks.

We have all attended fabulous orchid shows and conferences worldwide and experienced displays that defy description. Many of us have even designed and built them! The photographs in our monthly publication ORCHIDS are breathtaking and for many of us, our individual greenhouses are a source of inspiration and visual wonder. Mr. Flower Fantastic's floral designs and artistry, however, are so differently captivating, beautifully reflecting the city style and culture of New York. It is a certainty that many local residents of the city as well as the surrounding areas will attend the show, but for the rest of us not traveling to the northeast, it is, indeed, a visual treat to visit the many websites and YouTubes featuring the marvelous creative genius of Mr. Flower Fantastic. So take a few minutes, head to Google and check it out. It's well worth it! Enjoy!
