Meet the Guest Speaker: Naoki Kowamura

Naoki Kawamura will speak to us on "How to Grow Award Winning Vandas." His orchids have received 24 American Orchid Society awards including culture awards that recognized the grower. His enthusiasm for Vandas inspired Motes



orchids to name one of their hybrids Papilionanda Naoki Kawamura. Naoki is a hobbyist grower taking time from work and driving from Venice to speak to us about vandas as a favor. We are forever grateful for his efforts.

Naoki has been growing orchids for a little over 20 years. His orchid growing journey began "After my friend bought a house, I asked her what she wanted for a housewarming gift. She said a white Phalaenopsis and mentioned a boutique orchid store in Portland, Oregon. I visited the store, and was overwhelmed with the variety of orchids, especially multi-growths Paphiopedilum micranthum, whose price tag was \$800. I just walked away with a white Phalaenopsis. A couple days later, I went back to the store and got myself a Dendrobium. As I tried to learn how to take care of it, I read a couple books. I also joined the Oregon Orchid Society to learn more from other growers."

Although he could not buy the Paphiopedilum micranthum, he acquired his first Paph at a society meeting. His collection grew quickly and soon his dining table became an orchid growing table. Due to the cold weather, all the orchids had to be grown indoors under lights in the winter. "They responded to the environment well, and I was able to rebloom them"

When he moved to a new house, the garage was converted to an orchid growing area. Over 100 Paphiopedilums and Phragmipediums grew under metal halide lights. The orchids were grown indoors year long but they didn't flower well. "What I didn't understand was the effect of the light spectrum". While struggling to get his orchids to bloom, he read on a blog about a lady in Michigan growing Vandas under lights successfully. He designed a pvc pipe structure "That was the beginning of my Vanda growing in Oregon." As his Vanda Collection grew he started selling his Paphs and Phrags. Then he met orchid growing friends from Florida on Facebook and later annual vacations became trips to the Tamiami International Orchid Festival and Redland International Orchid shows.

In 2003 Naoki accepted a National Sales Support Manager position in Florida and moved to Venice, "we managed to purchase the house without walking through it." His Orchid collection was shipped to a friend in Orlando and "he had helped them get acclimated to Florida sun". All of Naoki's orchids now grow inside the pool cage of his Venice home, a completely different environment than he was used to in Portland Oregon. "Little did I know that it gets cold here for Vandas". And so the journey continues.
