MESSAGE FROM THE AMERICAN ORCHID SOCIETY PRESIDENT

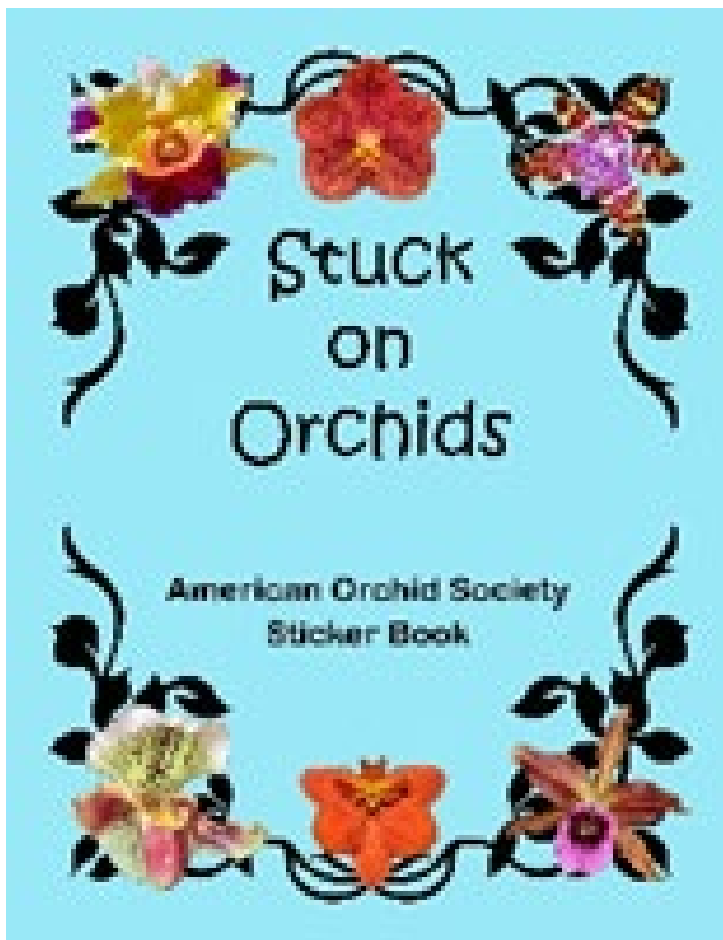

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Free Stuck on Orchids – Sticker Books Available

In 2024, the Education Committee voted unanimously to provide our Stuck On Orchids sticker books free of charge to any Affiliated Society that would like to hand them out at their orchid shows or meetings. We are able to do this because these sticker books have been funded by our Education Grant Program; however, we have to ask that the recipients pay for the shipping. Please note that because these books are being provided by a grant, they cannot be sold. We can ship 75 copies of the sticker books in a USPS Flat Rate Shipping box at a cost of approximately \$21.00 (Currently, we are only shipping to US locations ONLY).
