A Fresh Beginning for a New Year

The covenant commitment of the first Sunday in January has been a Methodist tradition throughout their history. This day was a clear reminder that their journey with God was intentional. It is something they chose and reaffirmed at every opportunity they got. John Wesley and early Methodists met to recommit themselves to be faithful in their walk with God. Their practice which has continued through the years is backed by scripture where God continually calls his people to remember his faithfulness and recommit their lives to him.

In honor of this tradition, we at Hays First UMC will have a covenant Sunday at the beginning of the year 2026. Not just filling a slot on a schedule but living a life that positively impacts the kingdom of God. Your presence and your gifts matter. Remember, your willingness to step forward can encourage others and bless our congregation while extending the reach of God's love. As we move into a new year, may we remember whose we are and what we are called to do. Let this season of covenant renewal lead us into richer faith and committed service. May we follow Christ with renewed energy, ready to serve wherever he leads. Purpose to renew your covenant with the Lord this coming month. Happy New Year 2026!

FEASIBILITY STUDY

RESULTS

Dear Hays First,

This past fall our church contracted with Church Development, an organization that has helped hundreds of congregations plan capital campaigns, to do an official feasibility study regarding a proposed capital campaign for needed renovations in our building and expanding the ministry of our church into the community. Thirty people were interviewed and over 100 people participated in the survey.

THE REPORT INDICATED MANY POSITIVE THINGS ABOUT OUR CHURCH:

94% of those responding believe the church meets their spiritual needs. Church Development likes to see this percentage be above 60%.

94% of those responding believe the church meets their fellowship needs for community. Again, Church Development likes to see this percentage be above 60%

88% of those responding believe the pastor and the leadership of the church are able to make wise decisions about the future of the congregation.

FINANCIAL FORECAST FROM CHURCH DEVELOPMENT

In addition, while many members need more information regarding the scope and costs of the projects listed in the survey, there is overwhelming support for the vision of renovation and connecting with our community. Based on information about supporting financially a capital campaign, Church Development believes if we held a capital campaign we have a **90% probability of raising over \$1,000,000!**

These results led our church to contract with Church Development to come alongside and help us conduct a successful capital campaign to support the mission of God within us.

HOW WILL THE CAPITAL CAMPAIGN BE ORGANIZED? HOW CAN I HELP?

Everyone is encouraged to come and join a campaign team.

Serving on a team is a short-term commitment as each team will meet only 3-4 times over a 12 week period.

Below is a list of the six working campaign teams.

PRAYER - The Prayer Team creates a special prayer we can pray together throughout the campaign.

EVENTS - The Events Team plans parties for smaller groups to gather and exchange information about the campaign.

THANKS - The Thanks Team has a great job: figure out how to say “Thank you!” to those who contribute to the campaign.

YOUTH - The Youth Team discerns how to involve youth in the vision of our church and how to cultivate generosity and gratitude.

AMBASSADOR - The Ambassador Team makes connections with members before Commitment Sunday to make sure they have all the information they need, and they answer any questions.

COMMUNICATION - The Communication Team works on the campaign slogan, logo, newsletters, and campaign brochure.

*These six teams — Prayer, Events, Thanks, Youth, Ambassador, and Communication — form a memorable acrostic “PETYAC.”
