Greetings in the Name of Christ!

As I write this, the last vestiges of winter are falling to the ground in the form of fat, fluffy, snowflakes. It is the last day of winter and I have no doubt that as spring arrives tomorrow, a sunny day will ensue. I'm certainly not complaining. The moisture that is falling is desperately needed by rural and city folks alike, and when I couple that with the anticipated sunshine tomorrow, Hays, and prayerfully the fields around it, will be as green as a St. Paddy's Day shamrock.

We have just passed St. Paddy's Day but it seems like only yesterday that we gathered together on St. Valentine's Day to begin the season of Lent with a well-attended Ash Wednesday Service on February 14th. We followed that up with a sermon and study series written by Max Lucado entitled "He Chose the Nails". Each Sunday we considered topics such as "He Chose to Forgive Us", "He Chose to Love Us", and "He Chose to Give Us Victory". We are now considering our own choices as we enter into the most holy week of the year.

So, as you consider this most holy week, I invite you to choose to participate in these services below:

- **Sunday, March 25- Palm Sunday-** both services will feature the children's Palm Parade remembering and celebrating Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem. The service will also feature our Chancel Choir presenting the first part of the Easter Cantata "Jesus, the Resurrection of the Messiah" by Mary McDonald and Rose Aspinall.

- **Holy Thursday Service- March 29 7:00 p.m.-** Come and experience the love and grace of Jesus as we remember and celebrate his final meal with his disciples in an upper room. All are welcome at his table as we serve Holy Communion on this special night.

- **Good Friday Service- March 30 7:00 p.m.-** We will experience the passion of Christ as we remember and celebrate his amazing act of love for each of us as we consider his betrayal, suffering, and crucifixion during a Service of Tenebrae (Darkness).

- **Good Friday to Easter Sunday Prayer Vigil-** at the culmination of the Good Friday Service, a prayer vigil will be held in the Chapel. You are encouraged to participate in the prayer vigil by signing up to pray for an hour or more. Please call the church office for available times. There will be someone in the Chapel from that time until 8:30 a.m. on Easter morning, praying and giving thanks to Christ for his sacrifice for each of us.

- **Easter Sunday Worship- Sunday, April 1, 8:30 and 10:45 a.m.-** Come and celebrate the victory of Christ's resurrection! This majestic and meaningful service will not only feature the second half of the Easter Cantata, "Jesus, the Resurrection of the Messiah" but will also include my sermon entitled "Unafraid: Living with Hope and Courage in Uncertain Times" based on Adam Hamilton's study of the same name.

- **Easter Sunday Children's Easter Egg Hunt** on the West Lawn- Sunday, April 1 at 9:35 a.m.- bring the children and grandchildren for this fun filled time! Then stay for a meaningful Easter worship experience for the whole family.

- **After-Easter Study and Sermon Series, "Unafraid: Living with Hope and Courage in Uncertain Times"**- begins April 8th at 9:35 a.m. in the Chapel or April 4th at 6:15 p.m. in room 207 (Milers). This is an important study (and sermon series) for these times. I hope you'll be a part of it!

Last year we sent 44 kids to church camp. Because of the generosity of our church family, we were able to pay for half of the registration fees (one camp per child). Last summer we covered \$4,472 dollars of registration fees. The average church camp costs \$240 so our children and their families are VERY APPRECIATIVE of the support and financial backing of our church.

We will have one more camp fundraiser before the camping season begins so mark your calendars for our Annual Camp Sunday and Bake Sale on April 22. Every baker in the church is welcome and invited to bake and bring goodies. After both services, the Children's Advisory Board will have the bake sale set up in the Welcome Center/Parlor area. All free will donations will be used to pay for half of kids' registration fees. Anyone interested in church camp is invited to visit the camp table that will be set up in the Welcome Center/Parlor beginning March 25.

This past month we, as a nation, encountered yet another senseless act of violence that took 17 innocent lives. We ourselves encountered a threat that caused fear and uncertainty in the secure place we like to call home. As the past month has unfolded, we have watched as this generation of youth has taken up the call for change. Whether we agree with their platform or not, they are right, something has to change. Our very own youth have been called to step up in their own way.

Romans 12:10 tells us to be kindly affectionate to one another with brotherly love, in honor giving preference to another. This past month, we began to challenge the youth to change the world, more like change someone's world. During one of our programming sessions, we discussed what we saw, heard and felt during the week of the threats and violence. I was blown away by what the kids had to say and what their insight into possible solutions. We agreed that change had to happen, and that the youth would be the catalyst for change. That's where our challenge originated.

We now begin each group by asking the question how they changed someone's world. We have them share out loud not to boast about our good works, but to inspire each other. Over the past month, I have been amazed to hear the little acts of kindness the kids have come in with. We have had stories of kids leaving their usual study partner to work with the lonesome outcast, we have had stories of kids sitting outside school simply to say hi to random students as they enter the school, and we have had stories of kids sitting with someone at lunch who usually sit by themselves. There are countless others, but the point is that our kids, the kids of our church, are doing something that is going to change the world. They aren't doing it through political means, but rather by showing the love of Christ on a daily basis, the only true way change can happen.

My challenge for you is this: don't let this challenge stay within the youth of our church. As adults, get outside your own circle and notice those that are in need of a little brotherly love. Then show them the love they so desperately need. While it may seem like a tedious task to reach one person at a time, it isn't. As soon as you reach one, that turns into two. The two of you doing the same will turn to four, then to eight, then to sixteen and so on. Before you know it, a movement has started and it can't be stopped. I challenge you to step up and match the intensity of our youth in making a difference in this world.

From our director, Annie Dieselberg:

It is an exciting but intense season at NightLight and so would appreciate your prayers.

Please pray for the 8 Ugandan trafficked women who finished their pre-trial hearing Wed. Two of the traffickers were present, but thank God they allowed them to sit in a separate room and watch on video. We had a wonderful day celebrating their courage and speaking out for justice, as well as thanking the police who also worked hard on their behalf. The women will be able to return home now, but still have to wait for official letters releasing them and for interviews with IOM to support them. Going home is a big transition. Pray as they prepare for reintegration.

There is one more Ugandan trafficked woman who is waiting for her case to move forward. She has already been with us many months and is weary of waiting. Pray that the officials keep focused and move her case forward.

Pray for the Colombian woman who will need to return before her visa expires. Often times the Colombian traffickers are connected to the drug cartel and it is dangerous for the women and their families. She is afraid for her mother's safety, especially since a family member is connected and the one who recruited her for the trafficker. Pray also that she takes the time to make a wise choice about her next steps when she returns. She is young and making plans which are probably not the best for her. Our team will try to guide her and connect her to a NGO for assistance but it's always the women's choice.

Pray for the two Tanzanians in our care who have complicated cases with their own and their children's documents. Pray for their protection and for peace and healing in the wait. Also for the Liberian and her son who are also waiting for progress on their case.

We interviewed 4 women in the detention center and all four agreed to report their case of being trafficked to the police. Pray for the right timing for them to be interviewed by the police and to be identified as trafficked. There are still another 9 women waiting for us to interview them and 9 more arrested this week.

Please pray for the team that cares for all these women in so many ways. We have a new staff member starting this week. Pray for protection, wisdom, unity, perseverance and love for the team.

Donations have dropped and yet needs are even greater. Pray that God raises up the people with the heart, passion, and commitment to give. Thank you so much!
