Christ Has Risen! Christ Has Risen, Indeed!

It was the Easter greeting that launched hundreds of white, helium filled balloons to the heights of our Sanctuary. The hope of Easter Sunday and the Holiest of Weeks that proceeded it was a special time in the life of the church. But, to me, what makes Easter even more special is what happens after Easter. In other words, has Easter and its meanings made a difference in your life? Has it made a difference in the life of the Church? And maybe most importantly, has it made a difference in the life of the community, nation, and world. You see, the Easter message must be about how good overcomes evil, and about how humankind is saved because of it.

I'm a big fan of J.R.R. Tolkien and love his "Lord of the Rings" series. Tolkien was a master storyteller, and in his epic tales, I believe Christian readers find the gospel message of Easter: good overcomes evil, and humankind is saved because of it. A 'prequel' to the Lord of the Rings, is a book written by Tolkien in 1937 entitled, *The Hobbit: An Unexpected Journey*. Tolkien wrote it as the Great Depression snatched away hope from average people, the Dust Bowl raged, and the evil of fascism in Italy (Mussolini) and in Germany (Hitler) were overwhelming people of good. A hobbit, (think human rabbit), named Bilbo Baggins is chosen by the good Wizard Gandalf to do the most dangerous job on the unexpected journey, to reclaim for the Semitic-looking Dwarves their homeland that was taken from them by an evil dragon named Smaug. When asked why he chose a timid hobbit for the task this is what he said:

"Some believe it is only great power that can hold evil in check, but that is not what I have found. It is the small everyday deeds of ordinary folk that keep the darkness at bay. Small acts of kindness and love. Why Bilbo Baggins? Perhaps because I am afraid, and he gives me courage." The Dwarves still didn't think he was up for the task and wondered why he would agree to come with them on such a dangerous journey. Bilbo responded: "Look, I know you doubt me, I know you always have. And you're right. I often think of (my home) Bag End. I miss my books. And my armchair. And my garden. See, that's where I belong. That's home. That's why I came back, because you don't have one. A home. It was taken from you. But I will help you take it back if I can." To me, this is a microcosm of the Easter message, taking back our home; the one taken from us by the wily serpent of Eden. It takes great sacrifice... through the small, everyday deeds of ordinary folk to keep the darkness at bay. Jesus would say it this way: "Greater love has no one than this, that one lay down his life for his friends." John 15:13

I believe that Tolkien wrote the *Hobbit* in the uncertain and seemingly hopeless time of 1937. In some ways, I believe the feelings of uncertainty and hopelessness are similar today. But we can be certain of this hope: The Easter message of how good overcomes evil, and about how humankind is saved because of it, is alive and well. It is lived out in the small acts of kindness and love by everyday people who sacrifice self for others.

I pray that, in Christ's Holy Name, you will be a 'Bilbo Baggins' for those who are in need, especially in need of hope. May we continue to do small acts of kindness and love in this uncertain world, so that evil might be kept at bay, and balloons might rise on Easter morning.

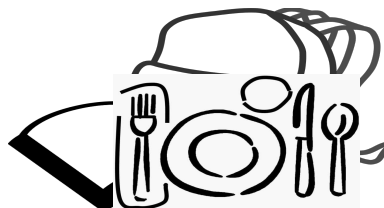

Circle News

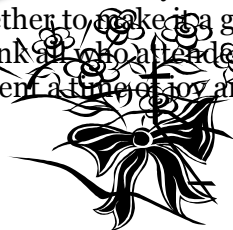
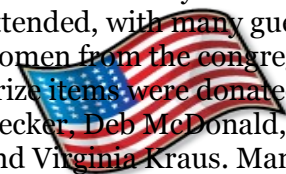

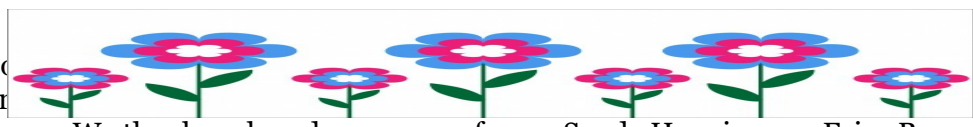
KIDS CORNER

D H a THAI are all well and that God has been blessing you abundantly in this season. It has been a There is much to celebrate and much to pray for. I don't know the exact number of trafficking cases that have come into our hands and were sent to home countries in the past two months. But I know it's a lot. We currently have roughly a dozen trafficked women in our care, and several with children. We praise God for the breakthrough in the government that these women can be properly cared for and justice brought to their situations. Please continue to pray for NightLight and the country of Thailand. More new women have been coming to our free salon. We praise God for the relationships that have been building for years. We have also been receiving increased favor from the bars, as we build relationships with the managers and girls.

There is much on the horizon for NightLight, as well as me personally. As you're reading this I am likely on my way to Swaziland (recently renamed "eSwatini") for a two-week trip. I have been excitedly anticipating this journey for a few months now. I am looking forward to catching up with old ministry partners and reconnecting with the girls at Hosea's Heart. The main purpose of this trip is to relax and debrief my time so far in Thailand, and to pray and discern into what the Lord has for me long-term. I have a strong desire to return to southern Africa, but I need direction and clarity from God. Please pray for my heart in this, and that I will have peace either way.

Another exciting update! Earlier this year, I was accepted into Liberty University's Online graduate school program, to work on an MA in Human Services Counseling: Marriage and Family Counseling. I am passionate about education and I love to learn, so I am thrilled to have the opportunity to be further equipped in my calling to empower women throughout the world. I will be starting courses this summer. If any of you are aware of scholarship or grant opportunities for master's programs, please let me know.
