Greetings in the Name of the Christ Who Calls!			
I have returned from the United Methodist Great Plains Annual Conference in Wichita, and I must say, I'm glad to be back in the friendly confines of Hays! For those who aren't aware, the Annual Conference is (obviously) a yearly event in which an equal number of United Methodist Clergy and Lay delegates gather together for celebration, singing, praying, and sitting! And I would be less than honest if I didn't include the breaking of bread together. We United Methodists do know how to eat!			
I went to Wichita on Tuesday of last week for a day of training in the area of clergy mentoring that I do through the Transition into Ministry (TiM) program. While there, I was surprised to be given a small plaque recognizing my work in that area, and while it's not a 'leg lamp', it was an honor to be recognized.			
On Wednesday, the Annual Conference session began with a wonderful worship service. It's an awe-inspiring thing to hear 1500 or so United Methodists sing together some of the great hymns and songs of the faith. The theme of Annual Conference was 'Therefore, go!' from the Great Commission of the Risen Christ (Matthew 28:19). I was amazed at the work that the people of the United Methodist Church do for the glory of God and God's people in the world as they and we, have taken the Risen Christ's call to "Therefore, go", seriously and joyfully.			
One of those groups that had a huge impact on me that were both serious and joyful is the Great Plains Annual Conference Micah Corp. Micah Corp is a group of United Methodist college-aged interns who "Do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with God" (Micah 6:8). They work to connect Kansas and Nebraska with social justice issues, especially with our representatives in Washington, D.C. They deal with issues of poverty, food insecurity, immigration, and injustice in whatever forms that present themselves and injustice seems to abound, these days.			
I was given the opportunity to sign a letter of Christian concern regarding what is happening to children and their families as they approach the United States for safety and security. The representatives of Micah Corps will deliver those letters of Christian concern to our senators and representatives in Washington, D.C. If you share my concern about the new U.S. policy and practice of separating children from their families as they come seeking political asylum for safety and security, you can sign a United Methodist Micah Corp letter of Christian concern to be delivered to our senators and representatives by contacting me or by simply coming to worship next Sunday.			
Much more will be reported regarding the Great Plains Annual Conference and the things that transpired. However, it will be in a later newsletter. In closing, I'm happy to state the Annual Conference culminated with the setting of clergy			
appointments. Each year United Methodist Bishops appoint clergy to a particular church for the upcoming year. 
