“For surely I know the plans I have for you, says the Lord, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope.” Jeremiah 29:11

Long ago, God’s people, Israel, were taken from Jerusalem in bondage to Babylon by King Nebuchadnezzar. God, through the prophet Jeremiah, had been warning them of this day for some time, sent a prophecy of hope to a people who were fearful of the future and grieving over the changes in their lives. That’s why so much of what we know as Jeremiah 29 was relevant to God’s people then, and to God’s people called United Methodists, today.

I have returned from Leawood, Kansas and the United Methodist clergy gathering known as “Orders and Fellowship” at the Church of the Resurrection. Orders and Fellowship is a time that clergy come together to share, to learn, and support one another in our common ministries of the United Methodist Church. It is always a meaningful time, but this time was especially meaningful because of the stated topic of the gathering-”Living Water; Living Well; Clergy Wellness”-and the unstated topic: what will the future for the United Methodist Church be?

On February 23rd a Specially Called General Conference of the United Methodist Church will gather in St. Louis to determine the United Methodist Church official stance on the issues of human sexuality... especially relating to policies concerning the LGBTQ communities and how we include or exclude them in our churches and as clergy persons. It has been a source of sharp disagreement for decades, but it came to full contention during the 2016 General UM Church Conference. The Church was headed for schism, when Rev. Adam Hamilton and Rev. Mark Holland, from our own Great Plains Conference, put a resolution on the floor to have our Bishops create a Commission on the Way Forward. Miraculously, it passed. The Commission was formed, met, and has submitted three plans in which the United Methodist Church might move forward. Those three plans-The One Church Plan, The Connectional Conference Plan, and The Traditional Plan-will be discussed, debated and decided upon. (If you’d like to know more about these plans, stop by the church office and ask for the book “United Methodists Divided. Or come to either my Sunday morning class in the Chapel at 9:35 or my Wednesday evening class at 6:15 in Room 207 to more fully understand the issues and the plans.)

Dear Christian friends,

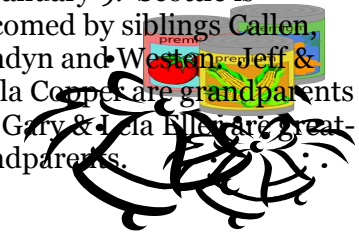

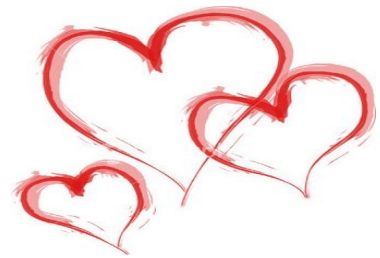
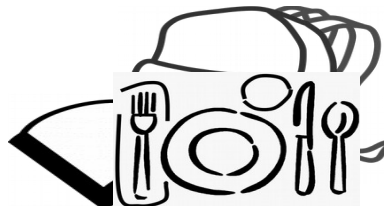

The ONE Event 2019: The Word

On the weekend of January 5th and 6th, several members of our youth group traveled to Salina for the annual ONE Event. This event is designed by the youth of the conference, for the youth of the conference. Each year they pick a theme and center everything they do around that theme. This year's theme was "The Word". The timing, for our youth group at least, couldn't have been more perfect.

The focus of our youth group has shifted from large groups talking about current events, to small group Bible studies. These studies consist of taking a look at a passage in scripture, studying it, and finding out how it applies to our lives. It has been incredible watching the kids learn to look at scripture in practical terms. This conference built off what we are trying to do and helped them see the importance in it.

One of the speakers challenged the kids to dig into their Bible each day, no matter the amount. Often times, kids, and adults, get scared off by the thought of opening their Bibles for several reasons. These reasons can be anything from not understanding what they are reading, to long names, to challenging topics. No matter the age, these reasons are all consistent. This speaker challenged the youth to see past these excuses and open their Bibles. She posed the question: How can you connect with God if you don't know God? I, for one, thought this was a great point. We like to call ourselves followers of God, but we forget to follow. What it means is this: How can you follow someone you don't know? How do we know God? Through His word.

Bible reading can be very scary, I get it. However, you have to ask yourself: Is what I am going to get out of this worth facing my fear? I can tell you that the answer to this is unequivocally yes. The scriptures will help reveal who God is to you. It will help you learn more about who you are called to be. It will help "the potter form the pot."

It can be very nerve-racking thinking about reading your Bible, especially if you never have. However, the way you get over that fear is to start. If you take the first step and start by reading something, it gets much better, very quickly. Begin by selecting a book and start with chapter 1, I suggest the book of John. You can read a chapter a day, a passage a day or even simply one scripture a day. It doesn't matter, just start. If all you read is one verse a day, that's great. That is one more verse that you know at the end of the day then you did at the beginning of the day. That is one more word given to us by God that you now know then you previously knew.

I want to encourage you to start. If you need help, find a plan that works for you. This will help keep you accountable. Find a partner to read it with. Decide what you will read, read it and discuss it. Find something that works for you. Just start.
