Awakened by His Coming

As we enter the advent season this year, I find myself very grateful for the spirit of renewal moving among us at Hays First. Over the past months, we've seen God restoring joy, healing divisions, and bringing new excitement for his work. This is the Lord's doing, and it fills me with hope as your pastor. I have hope because I see God has come to dwell with us. The advent season reminds us that God is always coming. He comes into our world, into our church, and into the quiet corners of our hearts. We light candles, with each of them telling a story of faith and reminding us that Christ's light still breaks through even the longest nights.

The season of Advent invites us to wake up and see the world with fresh eyes. As we draw near to Christmas, we remember that God's coming into the world is not only a story of long ago; it is a living reality that still stirs hearts today. This year's Advent theme, "Awakened by His Coming," reminds us that God's arrival in Christ changes everything. Each week of Advent opens our eyes a little wider to the mystery and meaning of Emmanuel, God with us.

On the first Sunday of Advent, we are Awakened to Watch (Matthew 24:36–44). Like the faithful who kept watch for the Messiah, we are called to live alert and ready. However, our alertness is not filled with fear, but with hope. We are reminded that God still breaks into ordinary moments with extraordinary power. On the second Sunday, we are Awakened to Repent (Matthew 3:1–12). John the Baptist's cry from the wilderness echoes into our world today: "Prepare the way of the Lord." Repentance is not just sorrow for sin; it is the joyful turning of our hearts back toward God, clearing away whatever blocks the path of His love.

The third Sunday calls us to be Awakened to Joy. Even before Jesus was born, Mary's heart sang with joy: "My soul magnifies the Lord!" (Luke 1:46–55). Joy doesn't depend on perfect circumstances, rather, it springs from knowing that God keeps His promises. We light the pink candle of joy because we believe that God is near. On the fourth Sunday, we are Awakened to Believe (Matthew 1:18–25). Joseph's quiet faith and obedience remind us that believing is not only agreeing with God's plan but trusting him enough to act upon it. Love and belief walk hand in hand as we make room for Christ in our hearts and homes.

On Christmas Eve, we are Awakened to Rejoice once more (Luke 2:1–14). The long night of waiting gives way to light and celebration. The angels' song fills the heavens, declaring the good news that "a Savior has been born to you." We rejoice because God has come to dwell with us. This Advent, let us open our eyes and hearts to the one who comes to awaken us to hope, to repentance, to joy, to belief, and to celebration. May every candle we light remind us that Christ's light still shines in our darkness, calling us to awaken and follow him. May we carry that light beyond our church walls as we share it with our families, neighbors, and all who long for hope.

Join us on Christmas Eve when we gather as one family of faith, to lift our candles and voices in celebration of the One who came to dwell among us. Come, Lord Jesus and awaken us to Your coming! May this Advent and Christmas fill your hearts with the wonder of Emmanuel — God with us. Amen

Misson News

A \$500 donation was made to the annual Community Thanksgiving meal. A \$1000 donation in food items was collected and delivered to Feed Hays on 12/8/25 including: 3,000 to go containers, 3,600 forks, 24 – 280z packages of cookies, 20 pounds of grated Parmesan cheese, 84 – 10# cans of spaghetti sauce or about 72 gallons.

A \$1,500 donation was made to First Call for help to include \$500 toward The Second Mile Fund to assist travelers passing through with fuel and food or residents associated with one of our local churches to receive assistance with food, rent, utilities or hygiene items. The Second Mile Fund is administered by First Call for Help and was created by the Ellis County Ministerial Alliance.

The youth will be assisting with resupplying the Paper Pantry with hygiene items including laundry detergent, soap, shampoo, paper towels, toilet paper on 11/19/25. They will be shopping for these items and delivering them with a \$1000 donation to buy these items. People receiving SNAP benefits cannot buy these items with that program. A \$1000 donation was made to the Community Assistance Center to help restock their food pantry

Cold Weather Shelter—Hays Hearth

Winter is fast approaching, and we are getting the shelter up and going. There are a few changes this year.

First of all, we are changing the name. Rather than using "shelter" in the name, this will now simply be The Hays Hearth. This is a place to stay safe and warm throughout the winter.

The shelter will still be open form 8 pm to 8 am, but the dates are going to be different. First of all, we will be open every night from December 1st through the end of February, regardless of temperature. Second, we will be open any night in November and March that is below 30 degrees.

Rather than three shifts this year we are moving to only having 2. There will be an 8 pm -2 am shift, and a 2 am-8 am shift. We still want to have 2 people on for each shift as much as possible, but this year we will encourage you all to take turns sleeping some during your shifts if needed.

If anyone would like to volunteer, the main portion of the training has been moved online to an excellent training provided by the Red Cross. The link to find this training, as well as an info sheet on how to get registered for it can be found at this link: https://www.ourecma.com/the/-hearth. There will also be several on-site training times available to make sure people are comfortable and competent in the use of the facility.

New changes for this year-we are switching out the beds. We will also be adding a Keurig and providing coffee and some other drinks for it. We are adding cameras to the sleeping area so it will be easier to keep an eye on that space, and we are looking at adding lamps or some other form of softer lighting for the kitchen. Another huge development is that First Baptist has done a ton of work over the summer to secure the funding and the contractor to install a shower in the basement. This truly adds incredible benefit and usage to the facility.
