## Perspective

I was encouraged to write this article to inform about what is happening with our denomination. The Hays Post and other news outlets have run stories recently about the United Methodist Church, the postponement of General Conference, and the formation of a breakoff denomination. My hesitancy in writing is that I may only complicate the issues by conveying misinformation. That is not my intention.

General Conference is the only body of the United Methodist Church that can officially set policy and make revisions to our Book of Discipline. It has been postponed. This is the third postponement stemming from the impact of Covid worldwide. While Covid has waned and countries are opening back up, the work of granting Visas to enter the US is backlogged. The UMC is a worldwide denomination. There are no viable alternatives to getting a fair representation to the General Conference. Hence the postponement.

A breakoff denomination has been forming over the last several years. The Global Methodist Church is planning to embark on May 1, 2022. In my perspective there are more unanswered questions about the shape this denomination will take then there are answered questions. Everything from who the clergy will be to how clergy will be found for local churches is still unsettled. Additional areas of uncertainty include autonomy for each local church, what does the connection between churches look like, what role will Bishops hold, and until a deciding body is formed, who makes decisions and sets doctrine.

Some congregations have already made moves to disaffiliate with the UMC. Initially it looks like 20 congregations from the Great Plains Conference (Kansas and Nebraska UMCs) will break off. I surmise many of these congregations have been displeased with the UMC for many years and are particularly adamant that the conversations about inclusion of LGBTQ+ cease. Again, my sense is that they also desire autonomy, less connection, and more ability to function independently.

My call to First UMC in Hays is that we are better together. I have found a congregation over the last 8 months that is willing to lean into our differences and walk alongside each other. Sometimes the heat will rise, but the goal is to continue to walk out of the room as sisters and brothers in Christ. While the denomination seeks new paths and reformation, I encourage us to remain steady while conversations continue. Honestly, my focus is on you. What are the conversations we need to engage in for mission and ministry to be vibrant and life changing?

The leadership on the Administrative Board of Hays FUMC is currently engaged in digging deeper into a vision and the values that will carry our congregation into the future. It is a beautiful mix of both conservative and progressive thought. I have been encouraged by the ways we have sat at the table together.

Together, we can continue the work of being Christ's disciples and building up the Body of Christ.
