Seasons of the Church Year

Nature has its seasons. We live in an area where we often get to experience the full impact of each one. I would say this year winter is not disappointing. It has been a few years since I have seen this much snow piled all around us. The arctic temperatures are like the cherry on top of the snow sundae.

The church year has its own seasons. They start with Advent, move us through Christmas, on through Epiphany, and then land us smack dab at the door of Lent. Lent is a forty-day season, not counting Sundays because they are classified as "little Easters." Lent concludes with the big Easter celebration where shouts of "Alleluia!" and "He is Risen!" fill our worship.

Depths of Love

The Season of Lent is a time of self-reflection, of spiritual examination. While that is a healthy and necessary exercise, we don't examine ourselves in isolation. Instead, we are invited to lay our lives alongside the life of Jesus. It is a sobering exercise to say the least. And yet, what we discover in this examination of his life and ours, is not condemnation or recrimination. Instead, we are overwhelmed, the farther we go on this journey with him, by the depths of love he has for all of us. Lent is a time for getting our spiritual house in order, that is true. But above all, it is an invitation to once again commit to love like Christ loves.

Ash Wednesday begins our Lenten season. This year it falls on Valentines Day, February 14. What a great day to be able to celebrate and remember our love for each other and the depth of love God has for each of us. There will be a gathering time from 6:00-6:15 p.m. in the sanctuary. The service will begin at 6:15.



Dillons Community Rewards Program

Dillons supports local charitable organizations through their Community Rewards Program by giving the opportunity to use Dillons shopping card rewards and direct them to the organization you choose. When you use your Dillons Card, any transactions will be directed to-

wards the organization you select. If you select First United Methodist Church in Hays, it receives a quarterly donation check from Dillons/Kroger based on a percentage of spending. Currently, the amount the Church receives is approximately \$500 per quarter.

If you are interested in participating and want to direct your rewards to go to the Church, you need to have a Dillons online account. If you do not have an online account, you can easily set one up using your email address and your Dillons shopping card at the Dillons website. The steps to link your rewards to the Church are as follows:

- 1. Go to https://www.dillons.com
- 2. Sign into your account or create a Dillons Account.
- 3. Search for Community Rewards.
- 4. Use the Search Box to find "First United Methodist Church" in Hays, KS. Click on the "Enroll" button.
- 5. Any transactions that you make going forward will be applied to the organization you select.

New Year Affirmations-Rebecca Barlow Jordan

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" Isaiah 43:19 (NIV)

Each time a new year rolls around, I still feel the nudge somewhere in my spirit to make my "lists." I don't call them "New Year's resolutions" anymore. I've broken too many. Still, I can't help evaluating the previous year to see if there are some things I could do better or some attitudes I could change. Like most, I long for my life to emanate Christ's character more and more.

One day I was reading in Psalms and noticed that the Psalmist writer, David, wanted those same things. But his "list" did not smack of self-motivated resolutions, but of affirming commitments. David's shepherd heart knew the power of trusting in God through all kinds of difficulties. Even in the midst of danger, he determined to choose the right action and attitude.

Now as I stand on the threshold of each year and face new choices, I try to adopt some of those same affirmations David wrote about here in Psalms: How will I choose to handle adversity? "I will bless the Lord at all times" (Psalm 34:1 NASB). What will I think about? "I will meditate on your wonders" (Psalm 119:27, NASB). How can I make God known? "I will tell of your greatness" (Psalm 145:6, NASB).

Working on those commitments–and so many others–requires more than an "I will" on my part. It means trusting that on the other side of "I will" is Jesus' promise of, "I can."

Jesus wants to do a new thing through us, not just at the beginning of each year, but at the start of each day.

Faith step: Scan through the Psalms and make a list of attitudes and actions that begin with "I will." Then decide which commitments you will choose to make this year. For encouragement, memorize Philippians 4:13.
