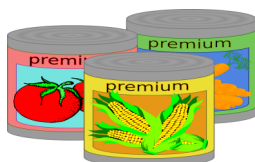

An announcement from Pastor Craig

The last three years have been some of my best in ministry. The kind spirit of Hays America has been felt. Dayna and I have been the beneficiaries of a church that knows how to care and come together for another 150 years. I have been blest to call myself pastor of Hays First UMC.

However, change is afoot. On July 1, 2024, I will become the Senior Pastor of Trinity UMC in Hutchinson, Kansas. For those who remember my story, Hutchinson is the area where I grew up. I am a graduate of Haven High School. My dad, who is 95, still lives in the house he and my mother built in the late 1950's about five or six years before I was born. I have two siblings in that area, and I have three grandchildren who will be 45 minutes to an hour away.

I was not actively seeking an appointment away from Hays until I saw the Trinity opening. In consultation with Dayna, I submitted a letter of consideration for this appointment. It took the cabinet and bishop several weeks to discern my gifts and graces for ministry and Trinity's needs before I was asked to accept this new appointment.

The process for discernment of a new Senior Pastor is already in the works. Please pray for your Staff Parish Relations Committee as they work alongside the District Superintendent and Bishop.

Endowment Moment

The operating document that governs the activities of the Permanent Endowment Committee outlines six general funds. This month's Endowment Moment will focus on two of these general funds of the Church's Permanent Endowment. **Building Fund:** Income from this fund shall provide for capital improvements, major repairs, equipment, furnishings or decorations for any properties owned by the church.

Non-endowed Building Fund: The Permanent Endowment Committee may determine certain undesignated ministry funds or unspent income be placed in this fund and not endowed, with the entire portion eligible for expenditure for such purposes as may be determined by the Permanent Endowment Committee. Gifts to any of the funds can be made at any time during one's lifetime or as a bequest.

One Word Prayers for Lent

Very early in the life of the church, followers of Jesus began observing a season we now call [Lent](#), a 40-day season of spiritual preparation for the holiest of days in the Christian calendar: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Silent Saturday, and Easter Sunday. Lent often involves [spiritual discipline](#) and practices such as [fasting](#), meditating, or [giving something up](#). It is a time of intentional, [focused prayer](#) and contemplation. Could using one-word prayers for Lent be helpful?

In the clamor and frenzy of our daily lives, it's difficult to mark this season of confession, repentance, and humility as we'd like. But it's not impossible if we have a plan for Lent. One way is to select one-word prayers.

Lent one-word prayers can be offered silently or whispered during daily activities—while dropping kids at school or waiting on hold. They can offer a prayerful respite in the most mundane moments. All it takes is a little intention, a momentary awareness, and sometimes a helpful trigger or reminder. Maybe before opening the mail. Or after hearing a car horn or barking dog.

So, here are one-word prayers for Lent I suggest for praying throughout the days and weeks leading up to this year's observance of Christ's Passion. Let them bring [meaning to the Lenten season](#).

Week 4 of Lent: **Mercy**

Let this word make your fourth week of Lent a continual cry for mercy, for yourself and for others.

Week 5 of Lent: **Break**

As you pray into the fifth Lenten week, you may have become more aware of your sins and shortcomings, [habits and tendencies](#) that aren't helpful to you or pleasing to God. Speak the word "break" often in the course of your days, asking the Lord to break up those patterns and proclivities.

Week 6 of Lent: **Need**

Among the blessings of Lent is a deeper and broader awareness of how much we need the powerful presence of Jesus in our lives. Repeating the word "need" as often as possible can become a petition for God to "meet all your needs according to the riches of his glory in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 4:19 NIV).

Week 7 of Lent: **Jesus**

In the final week of Lent, as you prepare for the events of [Holy Week](#), speak the name of Jesus, invoking His presence, praising His beauty, and asking for His blessing and working in your life and in the lives of those around you.

Try it. Sprinkle each of these one-word prayers for Lent through your days, hours, and minutes between now and the annual observance of Christ's Passion. Then you may be more ready than ever for the glorious celebration of Resurrection Sunday.

Lord, the resurrection of Your son has given us a new life and renewed hope. Help us to live as new people in pursuit of the Christian ideal. (From New Saint Joseph People's Prayer Book)
Glory and praise to you, Risen Savior, for you bring light to our darkness, joy to our sorrow, and the fullness of love to our reluctant hearts.

Share the message of Easter with your family, friends and children

Don't forget what Easter is all about. Share the message of Easter with everyone in your life. Read the Easter story in [the Bible](#). Put some coins in a plastic Easter egg and then tell your children about the price that Jesus paid for us. As you dye eggs, talk about how the red eggs represent God's sacrifice for us, the blue eggs are a reminder of the sky He made, the green eggs represent the grass He created, and the white eggs are a symbol of having a pure heart for God. And as they enjoy their candy, talk about the sweetness of Jesus. Make the fun traditions a celebration of God's amazing gift of love for us—His Son.

Make any of these Easter acts of kindness a part of your yearly Easter traditions or try a new one every year. Easter is the season to be grateful for the blessing of a risen Lord, and for the opportunity that gives us to be a blessing to others.

Plus, sometimes it's a rare treat for folks to have a home cooked meal. Even if your family traditionally heads to a restaurant for Easter, you can still invite someone along.
