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Greetings in the Name of the Risen Christ!

In these unprecedented days, we are most assuredly putting John Wesley's "Three Simple Rules" to the test, as we attempt to "Do no harm. Do good. (and) Stay in love with God." We are also tested when we attempt to live out the Hays 1st United Methodist Church mission to 'share the Word of God with all people through spiritual growth, worship, fellowship, and service.' There is an invisible beast that is sickening and killing people world-wide, attacking young and old. It seems that the best way to fight this virus is to distance ourselves socially from one another, trying to maintain at least six feet of space between us to prevent the virus from jumping from one to another and spreading unabated to others.

And so, we stay at home as we continue to 'Shelter in Place', and even though our worship is now online at home, we wonder as the Psalmist David did long ago, "How long, O Lord?" (Psalm 89:46a) I, for one, miss seeing each of you on Sunday mornings and throughout the week. I miss our handshakes and hugs. I miss coffee and cookies and good conversations with my church family. In short, I miss you all and even though I see a number of you via the interactive platform known as ZOOM, nothing is the same. But still I am resolute that we must protect one another from an unseen enemy, this pandemic that to date has sickened over 1.5 million and killed over 90,000 people in our nation alone. It preys on the most vulnerable, and by all accounts, is a gruesome way to die. And as insidious as that is, it is most often spread by those who do not realize that they have the virus...until it is too late.

So what can we do? We can and will do no harm by being diligent in not spreading this virus by religiously washing our hands, by wearing masks when out for essentials, and by being happy at home. We fight back by continuing to Shelter in Place until it is truly safe to come back, not only for those who are healthy, but also for those who are most vulnerable. We will do good as we continue to "share the Word of God with all people" through our online and on air worship services. We will 'grow Spiritually' by participating in new Bible studies and prayer groups that will be available online. We will join together in fellowship by hosting virtual coffees and calling family, friends, and neighbors to say 'hi-how-are-you' on the phone. And we will serve the needs of the church and community by sharing what we can with those who have lost their job or are in need. By joyfully doing all of the above, we will stay in love with God and neighbor.

To help us in all of these endeavors, beginning June 7th, I will begin a sermon series that will be based on Galatians 5:22-23a... "By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control." Each Sunday, I will highlight one of the nine fruits of the Spirit throughout the summer and contrast it with our need for these spiritual fruits during this pandemic. 1. Destruction of Ecosystems
2. Global Warming and Climate Change
3. Dependence on Fossil Fuels

Stewardship of Creation:

The goodness of God's creation, and the value given to every part of it, call people to respect, protect, and care for the creation and all interrelated aspects of it.

1. **Environmental Racism:** The negative impacts resulting from the degradation of the natural world have fallen disproportionately on marginalized communities and vulnerable groups.
2. **Sustainable Policies and Practices:** The church supports local, regional, national, and international cooperative efforts aimed at redressing the ecological harms humans have wreaked on a global scale.
3. **Food Justice:** Food systems that are ecologically sustainable, locally oriented, and equitably distributed are urgent policies. We also affirm food sovereignty, which promotes the rights of all people to healthy, culturally appropriate food.
4. **Caring for all Creatures:** We support the respectful and humane treatment of animals.
5. **Protecting Space:** Our charge is to be responsible stewards extends well beyond humankind's immediate environs and encompasses our own solar system and other galaxies.
6. **Affirming Science and Traditional Wisdom:** We affirm the value of science and reason in providing deeper understandings of the origins and functioning of the cosmos.

We will continue to present each of the principles in future issues of The Outreach. We hope that this information is both helpful and inspiring as we explore the United Methodist Church's official positions on societal issues, casting a vision for a just and equitable world.
