

• 7-12 Foot Pole (weight 4 lbs) Extended, it is used for rescuing animals from waterways, trees, storm drains, etc. Retracted, it is used as a longer heavy-duty restraining pole

Sears began her animal care and control journey in 2002, as the program manager for Capital Michigan State University. In addition to being a certified animal control instructor, she is a nationally certified animal control officer, and holds additional certifications in euthanasia, chemical immobilization, and Fear Free. She is a member of the Ohio Animal Welfare Federation, Ohio County Dog Wardens Association, National Animal Control Association, the Northwest Dog Wardens Association, and the Association for Animal Welfare Advancement.

Promoted to shelter manager for Capital Area Humane in 2006, she remained there for three years before moving to Green Bay, Wisconsin, to become the director of animal welfare for the Bay Area Humane Society. She continued her humane work as the field program manager for PetSmart Charities in Phoenix, Arizona, from 2014 to 2016. Moving to Ohio in 2016, Sears became the vice president of operations for the Toledo Humane Society until she assumed duties as the director of Lucas County Canine Care and Control in Toledo.

Kelly earned a Bachelor of Science in Interdisciplinary Studies in Community Relations from

control officers." Kelly said. "After over 20 years in the field, one thing I know is we can never stop learning if we want to make animal welfare the best it can be for the people and animals we serve."

Cody Mace began his animal care and control career as an animal control officer for the Polk County, Iowa Sheriff's Department in 2018. He joined Cedar Rapids Animal Care and Control the following year, serving as field services officer for the next three years. In late 2022, he accepted a promotion to lead animal control officer, where he continues to supervise field officers and acts as the


field training officer. Additionally, Mace routinely attends community meetings in Cedar Rapids, where he discusses newly drafted municipal code with members of the public, fostering transparency and a better understanding of the department's role in the community.

Cody is heavily involved in community outreach and is often a guest speaker at corporate safety training for community workers and first responders who encounter animals; is a guest speaker at in-service training sessions for the Cedar Rapids Police Department; and is a guest speaker at numerous area schools where he educates and builds relationships in the community.

Mace graduated from Kirkwood Community College with a degree in Applied Science/ Humane Officer in 2017. He is also a 2022 graduate of the Public Employees Leadership Institute at Iowa State University, where he studied Supervisory Techniques and Skills. He became a certified animal control instructor in 2023, before joining Animal Control and Care Academy as an instructor.

"As an ACCA instructor," Mace said, "I most look forward to meeting animal control officers, helping them strengthen their skill sets, build confidence, and contribute to the professional development of the animal control industry."

Kelly Sears made her instructor debut in Springfield, Missouri in late February where she graduated her first round of ACCA Basic ACO certified animal control officers. Cody Mace is being worked into the training schedule and will be teaching ACCA courses in the near future.
