FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

Spring Projects & Permits

Spring often brings home improvements and new projects. Please remember to obtain the proper permits before getting started. Doing so helps you avoid higher fees and saves valuable time. If you're unsure whether your project requires a permit, feel free to contact City Hall—we're happy to help!

Site Disturbance

A Site Disturbance Permit is required when constructing a new road or driveway, or when performing any excavation to build a structure, create a new parking lot, or pave an existing one. This is a friendly reminder for anyone who may need a permit or is unsure whether their project requires one.

City Campground:

MEMO FROM THE MAYOR

I would like to share a brief update as spring arrives in Harrison. Several city projects will begin as the weather improves.

The Wastewater Treatment lift station and the force main between Lakefront Avenue and Garfield Avenue will be under construction beginning in May 2026. This project is part of our wastewater grant. The City is also expanding parking around town and adding new wheel stops (parking curbs) to improve safety in our parking areas.

Wastewater Grant Project Construction Notice

The Wastewater Treatment lift station and the force main between Lakefront Avenue and Garfield Avenue will be under construction beginning in May 2026. This project is part of our wastewater grant.

Land Acquisition for New Application Site

On March 17, 2026, the City of Harrison officially closed on 76 acres of land for the new land application site. This purchase was made possible through grant funding, allowing the City to move forward with improving our infrastructure.

Public Hearing Notice

The Planning & Zoning Commission will hold a public hearing for a variance on: *April 15, 2026, 6:00 PM at Harrison City Hall* Residents are encouraged to attend and provide comments or ask questions regarding the proposed request.

New Encroachment Permit Requirements

The City of Harrison held a public hearing on February 10, 2026, to establish new fees, deposits, and penalties for encroachment permits. These permits are required for all minor or major encroachments within the City's public right-of-way. Anyone wishing to use any portion of a highway, street, or alley for a private purpose must complete an encroachment permit application and pay the required fee and deposit. Applications are available at City Hall.

Dog Licensing & Animal Control

Dog owners must license their dogs by the first Monday in January each year, provide proof of a current rabies vaccination, and obtain a license within 10 days of acquiring a new dog. Dogs are required to wear the city-issued metal tag at all times. It is unlawful for dogs to run at large; they must be on a leash no longer than 8 feet or secured inside a vehicle. Dogs found running loose may be impounded.
