City Hall: City Hall will now be open on Fridays from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.. Utility Bills are due on April 15th. Our next City Council meeting is April 9, 2025 at 6:00 PM.

Community Clean-Up Day: Mark your calendars for our upcoming Community Clean-Up Day! It's a great opportunity to come together and make Harrison shine. Details on the date and location will be shared soon—stay tuned!

Local Option Tax: The City of Harrison imposes a local option tax (LOT) on lodging rentals, liquor by the drink, prepared meals, and all taxable retail sales. To conduct sales within the City of Harrison, a business must apply Local-Option Non-Property Tax Permit.

Open Burning: Burning of paper, grass, brush, lumber or other burnable refuse shall be prohibited between June 1 and September 30 unless a burning permit is issued. The burning of paper, grass, brush, lumber or other burnable refuse shall be permitted without a permit between October 1 and May 31.

- Did you know that no public tree within the city limits of Harrison can be removed without prior consent of the Mayor and/or the City Council? (Ordinance 341, 9-10-1996)
- Machinery: The operation of any machinery, equipment or mechanical device so as to emit unreasonably loud noise which is disturbing to the comfort or repose of any person between the hours of ten o'clock (10:00) P.M. and seven o'clock (7:00) A.M. Harrison City Code 3-3-3B 5.
