SNOW REMOVAL POLICY

- All commercial and residential streets will be cleared of snow when the accumulation is 2” or more. In case of severe storm, the City’s plows will open as many streets as possible.
- Main streets and emergency routes will be opened first, then residential streets, lanes, cul-de-sacs, courts, and parking lots.
- Residents are responsible for clearing their driveways and businesses their sidewalk areas
- Streets that are blocked by vehicles, boats, trailers, camper, etc. or by other obstructions such as wood, poles, machinery, etc. will NOT be plowed.
