FRIENDLY REMINDERS:

Spring Projects & Permits

Spring often brings home improvements and new projects. Please remember to obtain the proper permits before getting started. Doing so helps you avoid higher fees and saves valuable time. If you're unsure whether your project requires a permit, feel free to contact City Hall—we're happy to help!

Business License Renewals

A friendly reminder that all business licenses expired on January 31. If you have not yet submitted your renewal, please do so as soon as possible. This applies to all businesses and short-term rentals located within the corporate limits of the City of Harrison.

Local Option Tax: If your business operates within Harrison city limits, you are required to collect and remit the Local Option Tax to the City of Harrison. Payments are due on the 20th of each month. All businesses holding a City of Harrison Local Option Non Property Tax permit must submit a monthly City of Harrison Local Option Non Property Tax Return along with a copy of their corresponding Idaho State Sales Tax Return.

Burn Pile: The City of Harrison is no longer accepting burnable refuse at the Wastewater Treatment Plant as we begin staging equipment and materials for the upcoming wastewater project.

Dog Licensing & Animal Control

Dog Licensing

Dog owners must:

- License their dog by the 1st Monday in January each year
- Provide proof of current rabies vaccination
- Obtain a license within **10 days** of acquiring a dog

Dogs must wear the city issued metal license tag at all times.

Dogs at Large

It is unlawful to allow a dog to run loose. Dogs must be:

- On a leash no longer than **8 feet**, or
- Confined in a vehicle.

The Mayor may impound dogs running at large.

New Encroachment Permit Requirements

The City of Harrison held a public hearing on February 10, 2026, to consider establishing fees for encroachment permits, as well as associated deposits And penalties. Encroachment permits apply to both minor and major encroachments within the City's public right of way.

Any person desiring to use any highway, street, or alley or any part thereof, for any private purpose, must fill out the encroachment permit and pay the application fee and deposit. You can pick up the application at City Hall.

Harrison Community Ambulance Association

At the most recent City Council meeting, the Harrison Ambulance Association provided an informative presentation about their services and ongoing efforts within our community.
