### **Fiber Optic Expansion**

Fiber optic service is coming to the Harrison city limits. If you have seen utility crews and trucks working around town, this is the reason. At this time, there is no confirmed completion date.

### **2025 Comprehensive Plan Approved**

The 2025 Comprehensive Plan was approved by the City Council on April 14, 2026. The City thanks the members of the Planning and Zoning Commission for the time and effort they dedicated to completing this.

### **Wastewater Treatment Plant Projects**

Sewer treatment plant improvement projects are beginning the bidding process for construction. Calls for bids have been published in the *Gazette Record*.

### **Local Business Hours**

More local businesses are now opening on weekends. Residents are encouraged to support businesses in the community.

### **Utility Meter Readings**

Water meters are now read twice per year. If usage exceeded the 3,000-gallon-per-month limit, the overage will be reflected on the current utility bill.

### **Camphosts Return**

The City welcomes back camphosts Bruce and Stacy, who are currently staying in RV Site #3. We are pleased to have them back this season.

### **City Council Action**

At the April 14 City Council meeting, Resolution 2026-01 was approved, authorizing the adoption of the Kootenai County Multi-Jurisdictional All-Hazard Mitigation Plan.

### **New Encroachment Permit Requirements**

The City of Harrison held a public hearing on February 10, 2026, to establish new fees, deposits, and penalties for encroachment permits. These permits are required for all minor or major encroachments within the City's public right-of-way. Anyone wishing to use any portion of a highway, street, or alley for a private purpose must complete an encroachment permit application and pay the required fee and deposit. Applications are available at City Hall.
