As you may noticed in your utility bills, the price increase for the 2024/2025 Fiscal Year has now taken effect. This change was approved at the Budget Public Hearing on August 22, 2024.

The new residential basic rate is now \$117.26 per month.

Fall Cleanup Reminder:

Residents of Harrison, please be mindful of city ordinances while using the streets and parking areas.

- **Trailers/Boats:** Must be attached to a vehicle if on public streets or property (City Code 5—2-42)
- **Obstructions:** No items like lumber, logs, or machinery may obstruct streets or avenues (City Code 3-2-3A)
- **Garbage:** No garbage or rubbish containers should be placed in alleys (City Code 3-1-3B2)
- **Inoperable Vehicles:** It's unlawful to leave wrecked or dismantled vehicles on public streets for more than 48 hours.
