C. USDA 1998 LID Assessment-DISCUSSION

The city currently owes the USDA \$152,227.25. To manage this debt, the city bills property owners, but not all pay their Local Improvement District (LID) bills. The annual payment to USDA is \$54,854, but collected revenue falls short due to a 1998 decision exempting certain properties from LID costs. USDA has proposed reamortizing the loan, allowing the city to pay \$24,000 each March for the next eight years, pending city agreement. The City Attorney will be reviewing what the city's options are.
