Blessed are you

The Beatitudes receive little attention, lamented novelist Kurt Vonnegut. "But, often with tears in their eyes, [Christians] demand that the Ten Commandments be posted in public buildings. And, of course, that's Moses, not Jesus. I haven't heard [anyone] demand that the Sermon on the Mount, the Beatitudes, be posted anywhere."

Jesus' Beatitudes have much to teach about selflessness, mourning, peacemaking and more. Jim Berger, author of *Being Sermon on the Mount Christians*, explains that those teachings were once "viewed as a mandate for the faithful." Post-Reformation, they became less law-like and more of a "liberating directive." Berger writes, "For Jesus, being and doing are inseparable. The Sermon is at once theory and praxis. It is not enough to read it or hear it. Jesus intends it to be how we live."

Superimposed Love

Maybe you've heard how salvation is like a **total solar eclipse:** God doesn't see our sins because Jesus' holiness covers them completely. Or maybe you've heard how trials can cause an "eclipse of faith."

At WorldChallenge.org, Pastor Gary Wilkerson explains that

in Greek, *eclipse* means "I am absent" or "I cease to exist," because people once thought the gods temporarily extinguished the sun. "For Christians, a 'spiritual eclipse' is a dark hour when God seems to be absent from our lives," Wilkerson writes.

Wilkerson points to Peter being sifted like wheat, Elijah and Jeremiah facing extreme discouragement, and David collapsing morally. Amid Satan's attacks, "God seems completely absent," writes the pastor. "In that dark moment of eclipse, the devil has created such chaos we can't possibly see a way out." During times of testing, Christians must cry out to God and trust his faithfulness.

Completing the eclipse analogy, Wilkerson shares Titus 3:4, the "love of God our Savior appeared" (NIV). The Greek meaning of *appeared* here is *superimposed*, he writes. God looks on our fraught-filled times of eclipse and "superimposes his divine love over us."

In Week 32, Read the book of Matthew April 7, 2024's Lesson - Emmanuel Is Born - Matthew 1:18-25

An angel told Joseph about Mary's pregnancy. The Old Testament prophets had already foretold the virgin birth of Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." Joseph was obedient to God and didn't abandon or reject Mary.

During Week 33, Read the book of Mark April 14, 2024's Lesson "Hosanna!" Mark 11:1-11

Jesus' entry into Jerusalem for the Passover celebration marked the beginning of His final days. He fulfills the prophecies of the coming Messiah.

During Week 34, Read the book of Luke April 21, 2024's Lesson "The Lord's Supper" - Luke 22: 7-23

The Scripture passage focuses on the institution of the Lord's Supper. Jesus sent Peter and John out to find a place to celebrate, which had already been prepared for them. It was here that Jesus had His last supper with His apostles.

During Week 35 Read the book of John April 28, 2024's Lesson, "The Living Word" - John 20: 1-10, 19-20

The disciples were afraid and locked themselves in a room. They did not expect a resurrection. When Jesus appeared to them, they greatly rejoiced.

APRIL HEALTH NOTES FROM THE NURSES MINISTRY

Signs and Symptoms of Colorectal Cancer

Last month we discussed things you can do to prevent and screen for colon cancer. Below are signs and symptoms you should look for. Remember, if caught early, colorectal cancer can be treated and cured.

If you have symptoms, they may include:

- A change in bowel habits.
- Blood in or on your stool (bowel movement).
- Diarrhea, constipation, or feeling that the bowel does not empty all the way.
- Abdominal pain, aches, or cramps that don't go away.
- Weight loss and you don't know why.

If you have any of these symptoms, <u>talk to your doctor</u>. They may be caused by something other than cancer. The only way to know what is causing them is to see your doctor. Don't wait!

Updated guidance on COVID and respiratory diseases

Four years have passed since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. Much has been learned and COVID-19 is no longer the emergency that it once was. Its health impacts increasingly resemble those of other respiratory viral illnesses, including influenza and RSV. As a result, the Center for Disease Control has updated guidance on what to do when you have a respiratory virus:

- 1. Stay home and away from others (including people you live with who are not sick) if you have respiratory virus symptoms such as fever, chills, fatigue, cough, runny nose and headache, among others.
- 2. You can go back to your normal activities when, for at least 24 hours, both are true:
 - a Your symptoms are getting better overall, and
 - b. You have not had a fever (and are not using fever-reducing medication).
- 3. When you go back to your normal activities, take added precaution over the next 5 days, such as taking additional steps for cleaner air, hygiene, masks, physical distancing, and/or testing when you will be around other people indoors.
- Keep in mind that you may still be able to spread the virus that made you sick, even if you are feeling better.
- ♦ If you develop a fever or start to feel worse after you have gone back to normal activities, return to number 1, 2 and 3 above.

Older adults are now able to receive an additional dose of updated COVID-19 vaccine

The Centers for Disease Control recommends that adults ages 65 years and older receive an additional updated 2023-2024 COVID-19 vaccine dose. Adults 65 years and older have a much higher hospitalization rate from to the disease.

An additional dose of the updated COVID-19 vaccine may restore protection that has waned since a fall vaccine dose, providing increased protection to adults ages 65 years and older.



Praying for Our New Pastor for 30 Days

Praying for our Pastor Prayer Prompts

Week 1

Sunday Scripture Reading: Deuteronomy 6:5; Matthew 6:33 Pray that our new pastor will love God with all his heart, soul, mind, and strength. Pray that God's Spirit will work in his heart in power and that he will value and follow biblical priorities.

Monday Scripture Reading:1 Timothy 1:5, 3:7; Ephesians 6:10–12 Pray that our new pastor will cultivate strong character and uncompromising integrity. Pray that his testimony will be genuine and that he will never do anything that he would need to hide from others.

Tuesday Scripture Reading:Mark 1:35; 2 Timothy 2:15– 16 Pray for our new pastor's personal walk with God—that his soul and spirit will be nourished and strengthened in his quiet time with God, beyond his sermon preparation.

Wednesday Scripture Reading: Malachi 2:7; James 1:5–6; John 17:15 Pray that our new pastor will counsel and teach with discernment through the wise use of Scripture and faith in God's power to work. Pray that he will be protected from the effects of sinful or negative attitudes that he encounters as he counsels

Thursday Scripture Reading: Ephesians 5:23–33 Ask God to protect our new pastor's marriage and keep it strong as a model of Christ's relationship with the Church. Pray that our pastor will tenderly cherish and lead his wife and that she will respect and encourage her husband, submitting to his leadership.

Friday Scripture Reading: Isaiah 61:3 Pray that God will heal any hurts that our new pastor has suffered in the ministry. Pray that he will serve the Lord with gladness and encourage the congregation to worship God with a joyful, surrendered spirit.

Saturday Scripture Reading:Ephesians 6:4; Colossians 3:20–21 Pray for our new pastor's children; especially that the pressures of the ministry will not discourage or embitter them. Pray that our pastor will provide godly leadership in the home, not based on fear of what others will think, but according to scriptural truth.

Week 2

Sunday Scripture Reading: 1 Timothy 3:1 Pray that God will instill in our new pastor a clear sense of calling and purpose. Pray that he will wholeheartedly desire the role of overseeing and shepherding our congregation, understanding the profound responsibility that comes with it. Let our prayers be petitions for unwavering commitment and a deep passion for our church family.

Monday Scripture Reading: Jeremiah 3:15 In your prayers, pray that God provides our new pastor with the wisdom and insight needed to nurture the spiritual growth of our congregation, guiding them on the path of God's truth. Pray that his teaching is both nourishing and enlightening, leading the congregation to a deeper understanding of God's ways.

Tuesday Scripture Reading: Ephesians 4:11-12 Pray that our new pastor is empowered to equip and uplift the church, aiding in the spiritual growth of believers and fostering unity within the body of Christ. Pray that he will be strengthened with the ability to teach, guide, and encourage, contributing to the overall maturity of the congregation.

Wednesday Scripture Reading: Hebrews 13:7 Pray that our new pastor will lead with joy, knowing that he is entrusted with the care of souls, and that his efforts will bear spiritual fruit within our congregation. Intercede for his leadership, that it will bring spiritual prosperity to both him and our church family.

Thursday Scripture Reading: Colossians 1:9 Pray that our new pastor's pursuit of spiritual understanding is unwavering, enabling him to guide the congregation in alignment with God's will. Let our prayers be a plea for discernment and insight, that he may lead with wisdom and make decisions rooted in spiritual understanding.

Friday Scripture Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:12-13 Pray that our new pastor will be respected and loved within the congregation, fostering an atmosphere of unity and peace. Pray that his efforts to guide and instruct are received with open hearts, resulting in a congregation that supports and loves him and one another.

Saturday Scripture Reading: 1 Peter 5:2-3 Pray that our new pastor will shepherd the flock with a willing heart, leading by example and prioritizing the spiritual well-being of the congregation over personal gain. Let our prayers include blessings for humility, that his leadership will reflect servant-hood rather than seeking personal benefit.

YOUTH BIBLE STUDY HIGHLIGHTS



What a wonderful Youth Bible Study Lesson we had on Wednesday March 20th. The younger youth ages 5-8 learned that Jesus Loves Them. They learned the true meaning of Easter. Easter is not all about The Easter Bunny and Jellybeans. It is all about our Lord dying on the cross for our sins. Each egg that was picked from the basket had a



scripture inside explaining who Jesus is.. - Sis. Lynn Fleming

The True Easter Story The youth who attended the



Bible Study Class for ages 9-12, on March 20th, learned all about the true Easter Story in a unique and very interesting way. The teachers, Sister Brenda Hackett and Sister Jacque Austin, collaborated to co-teach the lesson. They captured the attention of the students right away by presenting a brightly colored red basket that was adorned with a beautiful bow tied on top. The basket was filled with plastic eggs of all different colors and designs. These weren't just any Easter Eggs though; they were special eggs with a special purpose. Of course, it was reiterated to students that we know rabbits don't lay eggs and the eggs have no significant meaning in this true Easter Story. The eggs only served as props!

As Sister Hackett read the story of the events leading up to the crucifixion of Jesus, she passed the basket around so each student could select an egg. The eggs in the basket were numbered one to twelve and each egg contained a symbol representing the twelve parts of the Easter or Resurrection Story. After the students selected the correct egg labeled with the number identified by Sister Hackett, they opened the egg and revealed what was inside for all the class to see. Sister Austin read the corresponding scripture for that event to the class. For example: Egg #1 contained leaves. When Jesus was about 33 years old, He rode a donkey into a city called Jerusalem. The people were so excited to see Him! They called Him their King!

The leaves represent the branches carried by members of the crowd who waved branches and shouted cheers of praise to Jesus when He entered Jerusalem on the donkey. The crowd shouted "Hosanna, to the Son of David!

Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna to the highest heaven." Matthew 21:9.

The lesson continued until all eggs were opened and the events explained. The other symbols included:

Egg #2: Silver coins -representing the terrible act of Judas betraying Jesus for thirty pieces of silver.

Egg #3: A small cracker - representing the Passover that was going on during that time.

Egg #4: A small piece of soap - representing Jesus washing the feet of the disciples.

Egg #5: A small cup - representing when Jesus prayed and asked, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from Me; yet not as I will...."

Egg #6: A strip of leather- representing the leather straps and whips that were used to beat Jesus.

Egg #7: Thorns - representing the crown of thorns that was placed on the head of Jesus.

Egg # 8: Three nails and picture of a cross - representing the nails they used to nail Jesus to the cross

Egg #9: Dice - representing the soldiers gambling for Jesus clothes.

Egg #10: Gauze/ piece of white cloth- representing the linen used by Joseph to wrap the body of Jesus.

Egg #11: A Stone - representing the stone used to secure the tomb, that they thought would keep Jesus from escaping.

Egg #12: An EMPTY Egg -representing the empty tomb which was empty because Jesus had risen!



Y & F GAME NIGHT: SATURDAY, MARCH 30









Christian Symbols



VICTOR'S CROSS

Also called the conqueror's cross, the victor's cross is composed of the Greek cross, recognized by its four equal arms, adorned with Greek letters in each quadrant. The top left letters stand for Jesus and the top right letters stand for Christ (the horizontal lines above them indicate that they are abbreviations). The four letters across the bottom spell the Greek word for conqueror.

SOMETHING Something

Use scrap paper to fuel new growth and make a gift that keeps on giving.

What you need:


- Scrap paper
- Water
- Herb or flower seeds
- Blender
- Strainer
- Cookie sheet
- Towel
- Adult help



What you do:

- 1. Tear the scrap paper into strips and place in a bowl. Cover the paper with water and let it soak overnight.
- 2. Pour the mixture into a blender and blend about 10 seconds.
- 3. Strain and squeeze the paper pulp to remove excess water. Place in a bowl.
- 4. Sprinkle seeds over the pulp and mix to incorporate them into the pulp.
- 5. Shape the pulp into a flat layer on the cookie sheet. Use a towel to soak up excess water. Allow the paper to dry completely.
- 6. Tear paper into shapes or fold into a card. You can plant the paper directly into soil. Water it and then watch your plants grow!







I once read this arresting 300 year old epitaph while sauntering through the cemetery at the Old Tennant Meeting House in Manalapan, New Jersey:

Behold and see as you pass by As you are now so once was I As I am now so you will be Prepare for death and follow me.

Reportedly a cemetery visitor once wrote these words in chalk on that very memorial stone:

To follow you I'm not content Until I know which way you went.

The writer of Hebrews speaks even more candidly when he declares that it is "appointed for men to die once and after this comes judgment" (9:27 NASB). That is an appointment you and I won't miss!

Do you keep all your appointments?

I'll never forget my chagrin as I suddenly remembered that I was supposed to be speaking to a hundred men at a local church barbeque at the very moment I was teeing up on the public golf course! To my knowledge this was the only appointment to speak I've failed to show up for in forty years.

There is one appointment none of us will miss—our appointment with death.

My cousin lived to 101 years, but he still kept his appointment with death. My young grade school friend did not avoid his appointment with death on the day he drowned in the Missouri river. For this appointment everyone will be "present and accounted for." Thankfully, we only do it once.

But what follows the appointment is the real problem—"After this comes judgment."

Atheist Fredrick Neitzche asserted: "When I die, I rot." True, the body awaits its final state while decaying in the ground, but that's not all there is to it. Judgment is next.

This judgment will result in hell for most people, sadly. They will go there not because they are not respectable citizens, but because they refuse to come to Christ on His terms.

Anglican Jeremy Taylor described the awful eternal aspect of hell like this:

A death without end; An end without end; For death shall ever live And their end shall never begin.

The appointment with death is for a moment in time, but the consequences of our rejection of Christ last forever. Hell is eternal because those who reside there will never stop sinning. And God, who is sinned against, will never stop being just.

Do you keep all your appointments? You may be known for failing to do so. But your appointment with death followed by judgment will not be missed. And you don't know when that will be.

Be certain you are ready.
