**Question: What Sort of New Year's Resolution Should A Christian Make?****ANSWER:**

The practice of making New Year's resolutions goes back over 3,000 years to the ancient Babylonians. There is just something about the start of a new year that gives us the feeling of a fresh start and a new beginning. In reality, there is no difference between December 31 and January 1. Nothing mystical occurs at midnight on December 31. The Bible does not speak for or against the concept of New Year's resolutions. However, if a Christian determines to make a New Year's resolution, what kind of resolution should he or she make?

Common New Year's resolutions are commitments to quit smoking, to stop drinking, to manage money more wisely, and to spend more time with family. By far, the most common New Year's resolution is to lose weight, in conjunction with exercising more and eating more healthily. These are all good goals to set. However, 1 Timothy 4:8 instructs us to keep exercise in perspective: "For physical training is of some value, but godliness has value for all things, holding promise for both the present life and the life to come." The vast majority of New Year's resolutions, even among Christians, are in relation to physical things. This should not be.

Many Christians make New Year's resolutions to pray more, to read the Bible every day, and to attend church more regularly. These are fantastic goals. However, these New Year's resolutions fail just as often as the non-spiritual resolutions, because there is no power in a New Year's resolution. Resolving to start or stop doing a certain activity has no value unless you have the proper motivation for stopping or starting that activity. For example, why do you want to read the Bible every day? Is it to honor God and grow spiritually, or is it because you have just heard that it is a good thing to do? Why do you want to lose weight? Is it to honor God with your body, or is it for vanity, to honor yourself? Philippians 4:13 tells us, "I can do everything through Him who gives me strength." John 15:5 declares, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing." If God is the center of your New Year's resolution, it has chance for success, depending on your commitment to it. If it is God's will for something to be fulfilled, He will enable you to fulfill it. If a resolution is not God-honoring and/or is not in agreement with God's Word, we will not receive God's help in fulfilling the resolution.

So, what sort of New Year's resolution should a Christian make? Here are some suggestions: (1) pray to the Lord for wisdom (James 1:5) regarding what resolutions, if any, He would have you make; (2) pray for wisdom as to how to fulfill the goals God gives you; (3) rely on God's strength to help you; (4) find an accountability partner who will help you and encourage you; (5) don't become discouraged with occasional failures; instead, allow them to motivate you further; (6) don't become proud or vain, but give God the glory. Psalm 37:5-6 says, "Commit your way to the LORD; trust in him and he will do this: He will make your righteousness shine like the dawn, the justice of your cause like the noonday sun."

### What's in a name?

As the U.S. evacuated thousands from Afghanistan in August 2021, an Afghan woman gave birth on a plane. She named her daughter Reach — the name of the aircraft that brought her family to safety.

Many people name their children after loved ones or special events; a child born on Christmas might be called Noel or Holly. In Bible times, too, names often had meanings: Eve likely means “mother of all living”; Abraham, “father of many”; Isaac, “laughter.” Moses is a play on words with the Hebrew for “draw out” because Pharaoh’s daughter drew him from the Nile.

Of course, the most important biblical name is Jesus, which means “The Lord saves.” As the angel told Joseph, “[Mary] will bear a son, and you shall call his name Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins” (Matthew 1:21, ESV). The Christian church traditionally celebrates Name of Jesus on January 1. But every day, as we pray in Jesus’ name, we remember that what’s in *this* name is the salvation God offers to all.

# January 2022 Health Notes: COVID Rules Update

## Shorter COVID Quarantines: Update as of December 28, 2021

**The situation is changing rapidly as the coronavirus continues to spread and it can be hard to keep up. Below is updated information that may be useful to you, your family, and friends.**

The U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) shortened the recommended isolation time for people with COVID-19 who do not have symptoms from 10 days to 5 days, followed by 5 more days of wearing a mask in the presence of others. If you have a fever, the agency recommends you remain at home until your temperature returns to normal.

The CDC also updated quarantine recommendations. People who have been exposed to COVID-19 should now stay at home for 5 days instead of 10 days, followed by 5 days of mask use. Those affected by the quarantine changes include:

- Unvaccinated people
- People who received their second Pfizer or Moderna shot more than 6 months ago and have not yet received a booster
- People who received the Johnson & Johnson shot more than 2 months ago and have not yet received a booster

Close contacts who have been boosted do not need to quarantine but should wear a mask when around other people for at least 10 days.

### Why the recommendations changed

The CDC revised its recommendations amid the rapid rise of Omicron, which has quickly usurped Delta to become the dominant COVID-19 variant nationwide. The new, highly contagious strain accounts for about 59 percent of new infections in the United States. Cases across the country skyrocketed in the month of December, and experts expect them to increase substantially in the weeks following the holidays. In mid-December, more than 120,000 people on average were diagnosed daily with COVID-19. The disease has killed more than 810,000 people over the course of the pandemic.

In addition to the quick spread of Omicron, the CDC used evidence of early transmission to make their new recommendation. Data suggest that those infected with COVID-19 are most contagious 1 to 2 days before symptoms develop and 2 to 3 days after they arise. In other words, people are most contagious right after they're infected.

Practical matters also played a big role in the CDC's decision. While reports from around the world hint that Omicron is milder than previous variants, the volume of potential infections poses a threat to a U.S. healthcare system already under enormous strain.

The more severe Delta strain also still accounts for about 41 percent of all new cases in the U.S. as of December 25, the CDC reports.

Health officials considered the country's economic health, as well, as increasing cases and prolonged quarantine times could seriously harm business and industry in the coming months. In many cases, they already have. Air travel, for example, was severely hampered over the Christmas holiday, with thousands of U.S. flights disrupted or canceled due to sick staff.

"The Omicron variant is spreading quickly and has the potential to impact all facets of our society," CDC director, Rochelle Walensky, MD, MPH, said in a December 27 statement. "CDC's updated recommendations for isolation and quarantine balance what we know about the spread of the virus and the protection provided by vaccination and booster doses. These updates ensure people can safely continue their daily lives."

### Isolation vs. quarantine

Though isolation and quarantine are similar, there are some key differences.

**Isolation** is intended to keep infected people away from the uninfected. If you test positive for COVID-19, it's recommended that you isolate, or stay home for 5 days. If you live with others who are not infected, try to stay in a separate room, use a separate bathroom, and avoid sharing household items. Keep track of your symptoms and wear a mask indoors.

Day 0 of isolation is considered to be the first day your symptoms appear, or the day of your positive COVID-19 test. If symptoms never appear or they start improving within 5 days, it's okay to leave your home and continue masking for 5 more days.

If your symptoms worsen quickly or you have a fever that doesn't subside, contact a healthcare provider. Seek medical help right away if you experience emergency symptoms such as breathing trouble or chest pain.

**Quarantine** is for people who have come in close contact with an infected person. Close contact is considered to be within 6 feet for at least 15 cumulative minutes during a 24-hour period.

As with isolation, the recommended quarantine period is now 5 days, followed by 5 days of mask usage around other people. During quarantine, you should stay at home, look out for symptoms, and take a COVID-19 test on Day 5 if possible. If you are unable to quarantine after close contact, you should wear a well-fitting mask for 10 days.

You do not need to quarantine but should wear a well-fitting mask for 10 days if you:

- Are boosted
- Have received your second dose of Moderna or Pfizer in the last 6 months
- Got the Johnson & Johnson shot within the previous 2 months

In these cases, the CDC recommends testing on Day 5, as well.

### Celebrating Epiphany

Epiphany, from the Greek word *epiphaneia*, means an appearance or manifestation. Many Christians celebrate this festival each year on January 6, the 12th day after Christmas. Epiphany ends on Ash Wednesday, when Lent begins.

Epiphany marks the coming of the Magi, or wise men, to worship the baby Jesus. Because the Magi were Gentiles, Epiphany symbolizes the first recognition of Christ by non-Jews. It's a reminder that Christ came as the light — and Savior — of the whole world.

The traditional color for Epiphany is green, indicating life, growth, hope and eternity. Symbols for the season include a light, candle or star; a crown or three crowns; three gifts; and a globe. In the modern church, Epiphany has become a time to focus on reaching out and “showing” Jesus as the Savior of all people. It's also a reminder to engage in Christian community and to heal divisions among God's children




