Question: "The Fruit of the Holy Spirit - What is kindness?"

Answer: Galatians 5:22-23 lists the fruit of the Spirit—the resulting character of someone who is allowing

the Holy Spirit to develop maturity in his or her life. The fifth characteristic, kindness, is called "gentleness" in the KJV.

The Greek word for "kindness" is *chrēstotēs*. It means "benignity, tender concern, uprightness." It is kindness of heart and kindness of act.

Kindness is the characteristic that led God to provide salvation for us (Titus 3:4-5; Romans 2:4; 11:22). Kindness leads God to give us green pastures, quiet waters, and the restoration of our souls when we're weary (Psalm 23:2-3). It is God's tender care that makes Him want to gather us under His wings, to protect us and keep us close to Him (Psalm 17:8; 36:7; 61:4; Matthew 23:37). God expressed kindness when He provided for Elijah and the widow of Zarephath during a drought—and He showed more kindness later when He raised the widow's only son from the dead (1 Kings 17:8-24). When Sarah exiled Hagar and Ishmael, God gave the outcasts kindness in the form of water and hope (Genesis 21:9-21). On multiple occasions, kindness induced Jesus to stop what He was doing and help others in need (Mark 6:34; Mark 7:29; Mark 10:46-52). And kindness leads the Good Shepherd to rescue us when we stray (Luke 15:3-7). In kindness He "gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that


have young" (Isaiah 40:11).

When we exhibit the kindness of God, we are tender, benev-

olent, and useful to others. Every action, every word will have the flavor of grace in it. To maintain this attitude toward those we love is hard enough. To express kindness toward those who are against us requires the work of God (2 Corinthians 6:4-6). That is why kindness is a fruit of the Spirit.

Unit 2—Faith and Salvation

Unit 2 makes the transition from hope regarding earthly, physical needs in unit 1 to our hope for eternal salvation. Abraham is a double-sided example in this regard. On the one hand, he is the preemient example of faith (lesson 7); on the other hand, he is an example of someone who tried to take personal control when doubts arose regarding lack of an heir (Genesis 16). We follow Abraham's good example and avoid repeating his attempt to take control from God as we lift our eyes above earthly circumstances to focus on the power of the gospel (lesson 6), how we have peace with God (lesson 8), and the scope of salvation (lesson 9).

We have exciting news about a new way you can contribute. We have partnered with Vanco Services which is an electronic giving resource which will assist members and friends who prefer another option to contribute to GSBC.

GSBC now offers electronic giving using the Vanco Online and Vanco Mobile app to make Tithes, Missions, Building Fund, Sunday School, Scholarship and Capital Campaign contributions. The following is a description of the electronic giving options.

Vanco Online giving is on the GSBC website greatersalembaptist.org under the HOME/GIVE heading. Click on the link and it is a simple step-by-step process, and you can sign up to track your giving.

Vanco Mobile is a free app you can download from the Apple App Store or Google Play and the app allows you to contribute via your mobile phone.

After you download the app, open the app and search for the church by entering *Greater Salem Baptist Church*.

- After you locate the church name, enter the following Invite Code YMU4J5
- You will need to complete your profile to register to make contributions by entering your name, address, phone number and email address.
- Completing the registration steps allows you to receive a receipt for your contribution, review contribution history, etc.
- Online/mobile contributions will be credited to your annual contribution statement during the month they are received

A gentle answer

As it does this year, July 4 fell on Sunday in 1937. While Pastor Eldred Johnston led worship that morning in Paulding, Ohio, local kids set off firecrackers nearby (restrictions were rare back then). Realizing he needed to act, the pastor slipped outside during a hymn and found the revelers.


But instead of scolding or shouting, Johnston stayed calm. "I used to enjoy shooting fireworks too," he said, adding that he knew it was a fun way to celebrate. "But many in this town are gathered in worship, and the listracting. All I'm asking is that you wait until church sorvings are every about noon, and then shoot fire


noise is very distracting. All I'm asking is that you wait until church services are over — about noon — and then shoot fire-crackers all you want." The pastor smiled at each youth and returned to church.

Recounting that experience in Liberty magazine, Johnston said he half-expected to hear defiant explosions. Instead, the kids waited respectfully until worship was over. When conflicts loom, may we heed that example — and this advice from Proverbs: "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger" (15:1, NIV).


What you need:

HAVE YOU STARTED YOUR JOURNEY WITH CHRIST???

Some of you might not yet know God in a personal way through His Son. You might think of yourself as a Christian only because you were taken to church as a child. Or you might take comfort from the fact that you were baptized as an infant and confirmed.

Family and church connections are an important part of religious life, but those experiences don't make a person a Christian.

Centuries ago, a religious leader named Nicodemus approached Jesus to find answers to his own spiritual questions. Nicodemus said, "We know that you are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do unless God is with him." (John 3:2) Jesus' response seems surprisingly unrelated to Nicodemus' comments: "Jesus answered and said to him, most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the Kingdom of God." (John 3:3)

Their conversation underscored the contrast between physical life and spiritual life, In the Garden of Eden, when God began to fellowship with Adam in the cool of the day, Adam had not yet disobeyed God. He was in a state of complete innocence. But after Adam disobeyed God by eating of the forbidden fruit, a fundamental change took place. A great barrier to fellowship between God and man damaged their relationship. When God made Himself available for fellowship with Adam as He had done in the past, Adam expressed his awareness of his disobedience by hiding from God. (Gen 3:8-10)

Sin had created an insurmountable chasm where once there had been an intimate union between God and man. The same alienation has persisted since that fateful day. All of us were made for fellowship with our creator, but we have chosen to go our own way. The Bible says that "all we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way." (Isaiah 53:6)

The tragic result of this rebellion against God is spiritual death. Adam was told beforehand, that on the day he ate of the tree of knowledge of good and evil he would surely die. (Genesis2:16-17) Adam ate of the forbidden fruit and at that moment he died spiritually. Although he lived on physically for many years, his ability to fellowship with God had been damaged by the consequences of sin.

That is why Jesus' words to Nicodemus were such good news. Jesus told him that each of us can be made alive again on the inside. God's Holy Spirit can come inside us and restore our fellowship with God. But how does this happen?

The Lord is eager to forgive your sin, restore your fellowship with God, and give you the gift of eternal life. But there are some Biblical requirements.

<u>FIRST</u>, we must admit that we are sinners and cannot save ourselves. The Bible tells us that "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." (Romans 3:23)

<u>Second</u>, we need to recognize the seriousness of our sin. Our human tendency is to rationalize and grade on a curve by comparing ourselves to others. But God sets a standard of perfection in which no one can please Him based on self-effort. The Bible says that "our righteousnesses are like filthy rags:" (Isaiah 64:6)

"The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Romans 6:23)

The Good News is that Christ suffered the consequences of our sin. Making it possible for us to have eternal fellowship with Him. The apostle Paul wrote, "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that, while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:8) This means that Jesus Christ, who never did anything wrong, gave His own life on the cross so that the penalty of sin could be paid, and His righteousness applied to us. (2 Corinthians 5:21)

THIRD, It is not enough just to know that Christ died for us, we need to act on this by receiving Him as Savior and Lord. The Bible says, "As many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name." (John 1:12)

Are you ready to make that decision? If you are, you can go to <u>Jesus</u> in prayer and share with Him your desire to receive forgiveness for sin and the start of an eternal relationship with Him.

Jesus, I admit that I am a sinner. Thank you for dying on the cross to pay the penalty for my sin. I now receive you as my Savior and Lord. Take control of my life and make me the kind of person You want me to be. Amen.

If you prayed this prayer with sincerity, you have the assurance that Christ is in your life. The apostle John wrote, "These things have I written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life." (1 John 5:13)

Now, you can spend time with God, God wants to spend time with you..


