Sermon Notes from the Pastor's Pulpit

Pastor and First Lady Hackett

September 5 - October 3

Joy in Believing continued in the September 5, 2021, worship service as we focused on 'Counting the Cost in-spite of the loss' Philippians 9:9-11. Paul was sharing with us the secret by knowing and being found in Christ Jesus our Lord. The more we know Christ is by experiencing Him in the following ways:

- 1. We should value our relationship with Christ as more important than anything else (Philippians 3:8).
- 2. No amount of law (tradition) keeping, self-improvement, discipline, or religious effort can make us right with God. Righteousness comes only from God, and we are made righteous (i.e. right standing with Jesus Christ) by trusting Christ (Philippians 3:9)
- 3. No matter how much we suffer for the sake of righteousness we must have faith that we will be raised again to life through the resurrection (Philippians 3:10-11).

September 12 and 19, 2021, we were **'Pressing on to Jesus'** in Philippians 3:12-21. Now the passage of Scripture gives us six wonderful reasons to press on to the high calling of Jesus Christ:

- 1. We have an eternal future with Jesus Christ because of our relationship with Him (Philippians 3:12-14).
- 2. We have the opportunity to encourage others with an attitude of unity of the truth in the Word of God (Philippians 3:15-16).
- 3. We have the obligation to walk the walk in following Jesus' example we must have our life marked by the image of Christ and stamped by the Spirit, as followers of Christ (Philippians 3:17).
- 4. We must not become bad examples as enemies of the cross destruction is inevitable when we focus on earthly things (Philippians 3:18-19).
- 5. We must press on toward Jesus as aliens of the land for our destination is to be a citizen of heaven with Jesus Christ (Philippians 3:20).
- 6. Lastly, we will receive transformed bodies as we look to that day when the bodies of the saints will be redeemed and refashioned like the glorified body of Jesus and all made new (Philippians 3:21).

After completing Philippians 3 sermon series the Holy Spirit wanted the church to be further encouraged and reminded everyone 'How to live as a Winner in Jesus Christ'. This begins with having 'A Winner's Faith', September 26, 2021, in 1 John 5:1-5. The question may be asked, "What does a winner in Jesus Christ look like?" Glad you asked. A winner in Jesus Christ

Health Notes: COVID Update for November 2021

From the Nurses Ministry

Cancer screening

Many people wait until they have symptoms before seeing a doctor. But screening tests are used to find cancer before a person has any symptoms. Screening tests can help find certain cancers early, when they might be easier to treat. Getting screening tests regularly may find breast, cervical, and colorectal (colon) cancers early, when treatment is likely to work best. Lung cancer screening is recommended for some people who are at high risk.

It's safe to mix-and-match your booster shot

Check with your medical doctor or nurse practitioner if you have questions, since recommendations change as more data is gathered about the effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has approved booster shots for all adults who got the one-shot Janssen vaccine and a select group of fully vaccinated Moderna recipients. The CDC also has approved a "mix-and-match" approach, giving booster-eligible people the option of getting a new dose of any approved COVID vaccine, regardless of the one they initially received.

For those concerned about getting a booster shot, Dr. Hartlage of the Louisville Health Department reviewed the CDC's recommendation for booster doses for those who have completed their initial two-dose series at least six months ago. People who are eligible are:

- 65 years and older
- 18+ who have underlying medical conditions

18+ who live in high-risk settings

"If you completed your two-dose series six months ago, now is the time to look into getting a booster shot leading into the holiday season," she said. "It's safe to mix and match the vaccines, which are available at many providers in the city."

Individuals who fall into those groups should discuss getting a booster dose with their healthcare provider.

has the birthmarks of a believer. Here are five tests to ensure true believers of their salvation:

- 1. Faith test what do you believe? Is our doctrine in line with the Word of God? (1 John 5:1)
- 2. Life test how do we live? Do we keep God's commandment? (1 John 5:2-3)
- 3. Love test do we love our brothers and sisters? (1 John 4:7-11 and 1 John 4:20-21)
- 4. Growth test are we overcoming more and more as we walk with the Lord? (1 John 5:4-5)
- 5. Sin test do we avoid sin, or do we continue sinning and consider it acceptable? (1 John 1:5-10 and 1 John 3:4-9)

Lastly, on October 3, 2021, in our worship service we discussed 'A Winners Testimony' as we live for Jesus Christ 1 John 5:6-13. Our testimony must be in complete harmony with the **Spirit** of Truth as it concerns the **water** and the **blood** (1 John 5:6-8) then be anchored in **God's** testimony which means to accept what He says is true, accept who He is, and this involves trusting Him (Jesus Christ) completely and committing one's life to Him: Jesus has and is testifying about **Himself** (1 John 5:9-10). When this happens our testimony always leads to **eternal life** that God has given. His purpose is no longer to tell them how to find life but instead to assure them (believers) that they do have eternal life (1 John 5:11-13).

Grace:

Transforming and Sufficient

This year, GSBC's Women's Ministry's theme is "God's Grace". We have been studying to understand God's Grace indepth, and we have been truly blessed through the richness of His Word.

What is Grace? Those who first approach this question may feel confident that they know the answer by merely stating, in short, "favor of God."

I believe that it is fair to say that all Christians are aware of God's grace; we hear of it, pray for it, speak of it, and even believe in the definition of "grace." Before I go in-depth into the sufficiency and transforming aspect of grace, we must understand that grace doesn't end after salvation. Christians must realize that we also live by God's grace daily, and the misunderstanding or confusion is, "what takes place to make it happen?" I have defined the words you will see relating to grace in this article to clarify the main subject of "grace."

The "Grace of God": is the unmerited favor of God (shown to the undeserved)

Sufficient: adequate or enough

Transforming: to change or convert; (character, nature, behavior, mindset, attitude, life circumstances, condition)

One of the most familiar passages of scripture about grace relates to saving grace, *Ephesians 2:8-9 NIV* "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God, not by works, so that no one can boast." The verse clearly explains that our salvation exists because God showed favor towards us (sinners/undeserved people) through our faith (believing in Him and the work on the cross 1 Cor. 15:3-4). The gift did not require or need anything from humanity, and we have no reason to boast or take credit for the eternal gift provided for us. We *do not* deserve it, and nothing we do can earn it – BUT for His grace, we have been saved!

The grace of God does not stop there, it is **transforming**, or a metamorphose of life. Paul informs us with thanksgiving, *Philippians 1:6 NIV*, "Be confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." We must be confident in Christ and not in ourselves: and in His promise that what God started (by His grace) He will carry it through until He comes back for His people. I do not see any requirements or needs from humanity stated here either.

We know that God's grace is His unmerited favor shown towards the guilty, those who deserve judgment. We must also understand that works do not bring about Salvation; prompt God to be gracious, enable us to earn, or receive credit for His blessings. Our awesome and loving God is gracious towards us because He is generous, and that is His character, period! The penalty has already been paid. If there was a cost for saving grace and grace beyond that, Jesus Christ, our Lord, and Savior paid it all on the cross! He is the propitiation for our sins (1 John 2:2). We are considered bankrupt/broke when it comes to paying for our sin-debt, and there is nothing we can do or offer to pay the price for our sins.

Once we genuinely belong to Christ, He gives us everything we need; His grace is **sufficient**. All that Christ has made available to us spiritually, to live godly; it is enough, **2 Peter 1:3**, "His divine power has given us everything we need for a godly life." Let us not be deceived in thinking that being a faithful churchgoer, feeding the homeless, serving in ministry, scripture memorization, prayer, or our spirituality are the means of our blessings from God; this is not so. Remember, there is nothing we can do. Our merits or demerits do not determine whether God will extend His grace and blessings upon us. The truth is, we must work out our salvation with fear (reverence) and trembling for the glory of God and not for wrong motives of receiving praise, credit, or His blessings. We must do these things to acquire and pursue holiness, spiritual maturity, knowledge, and desire to live a godly life for His Name's sake.

Be encouraged that despite our sin nature, disobedience, demerits or merits, Jesus Christ loves us *unconditionally*, and He shows us grace JUST BECAUSE HE IS GOD... period!!!


