Greater Salem Baptist Church of Disciples! Starting this edition and prayerfully every month of the GoodNewsLetter, I will take time to review the Sermons preached.

It is our prayer that you will be able to learn and/or feast from the Word of God as it was preached/proclaimed and, provided for the Body of Christ, as well as to the unbelieving world of potential disciples for Jesus Christ--One heart at a time and one family at a time.

On August 1st and 8th; the Church was reminded and challenged to love those in the Christian family, and those outside the Christian family (both inside and outside the Church). The apostle, Paul gives us 25 admonitions of true love displayed in action (Roman's 12:9-21).

We must remember that although our Spiritual guidance and power come from the Lord. He can only work effectively through lives that we subjected to Him (1Corinthians 9:25 -27

For the Christian, self-discipline is obedience to the Word of God, the willingness to subordinate everything in our lives: physical, emotional, social, intellectual, moral and Spiritual, to God's Will and Control. And for God's glory. In conclusion, Supernatural living is conducted in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ (Philippians 1:7). The call to practical holy living is the climax of this rich epistle. So if anyone can submit, to me the 25 admonitions that Paul gives us in Romans 12:9-21 by the end of September, 2021, you will receive a blessing.

On August 15th, we revisited the theme for 2021, Restora-

tive Joy, (Psalm 51:10-13).

By preaching through the book of Joy, which is Philippians. The joy of believing in Philippians 3:1-7 focused on "walking by faith and not by flesh." Paul instructed the Church of Phillipi and us, that we should not live by legal standards of traditionalism when following Christ Jesus. Paul warns us of the suffering of the flesh life (Philippians 3:1-2) then he tells us that if anyone should have confidence in the flesh I (Paul) should.

When we think about all the accomplishments Paul had, he could still be boasting about them (Philippians 3:3-6). But because of his conversion (Romans 9) Paul understood and wisely chose to reject having confidence in the flesh and count it as loss for Christ (Philippians 3:7).

Pastor Dan Hall came to worship with us on August 22nd, to remind us that "Victory is mine! (Ephesians 1:1-12). The Book of Ephesians was written to explain some of the great things and duties of Christianity and it reveals the things God has prepared for us who love Him (1Corinthians 2:9-10).

- Ephesians 1:12 Paul's greeting to the Ephesians of the Triune God on behalf of the believer:
- Ephesians 1:3-6, The Work of God The Father,
- Ephesians 1:7-8, The Work of God The Son and Ephesians 1:9-12, The mystery of His Will.
- All of these things give us the Victory, in order that we, who were the first to put our hope and trust in Christ, should be to the praise of His glory.

THE APPLE OF HIS EYE!!!

One of my favorite activities from childhood was fruit-picking; crab-apples and Granny Smith's in particular. While we picked from various fruit trees (plums, pears, peaches, etc.), apples, have remained to be my favorite fruit to date. Well, they probably run neck-and-neck to a skillfully-thumped watermelon. My siblings and I would plan for which trees we would freely shop from over a large radius of our neighborhood in West Louisville.

Most neighbors would welcome us kids to take as many apples as we could gather, but there were a couple of homes that were not so welcoming, and they would forewarn us to stay away. Nevertheless, we occasionally took a notion to disregard their warnings as for some reason they had the nicest yards, with trees that carried the biggest and prettiest fruits—more inviting to the eye. We kids would have to run for dear life, though, when we followed our self-indulgences.

A young friend named Victor would join the group, he was tall and much fun for everyone. My older siblings were sometimes reluctant to take me along for these ventures, fearing I would slow them down from their mission to gather as many apples as our pockets, pillow cases, and large bags could hold.

I reckon they anticipated the need and responsibility to protect me when they went for the forbidden trees, too. *After all*, mom had left me in their care and expected me to return the same way I left, *whole!*

Victor always welcomed me. He was smart to observe my small stature, and would quickly pick me up to place me on his shoulders. While my siblings thought they knew what they were doing, Victor, was the expert apple-picker, with a real plan to clean most fruit trees. His plan was to use his and my height and size to our advantage. With Victor being already tall, he would place me on his shoulders and he became even taller. My job was to move quickly, and shake, pick and pull all good apples within my reach. When my siblings began to see the abundance of apples falling, they were sure to awaken me early on Saturday mornings to add to their mission.

If you did not quickly grasp the moral of this story, allow me to explain further. Everyone is important—especially in the Body of Christ. As God's children, we each have the ability and responsibility to encourage and uplift others. For instance, when we receive Saving Faith, the Holy Spirit comes to indwell us. He gives us Spiritual Gifts and enables us to share these gifts with others, ultimately building the Body of Christ Jesus, (the Church) and glorifying our Heavenly Father. I see the Awesome Holy Trinity, can you? (See Romans 15:1-6 & 1Corinthians Chpt.12)

Did you know that our Heavenly Father has also chosen fruits that are part of His very Self, and essential for His children? — What are these fruits that God so graciously shares with His

beloved children? You will find them in His Word, *Galatians* 5:22-23, But the fruit of the Spirit is Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness and Self-Control.

Which of these Fruits have you struggled with? *Patience*, *Self-Control*? Be Encouraged (See Philippians 1:6, being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus)!

There are nine fruits of the Spirit, but Our Good Lord is One God—and He Is the epitome of Oneness (God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit). He classifies His fruits as One Fruit of the Spirit. Why? Because we cannot have one without the other. It is impossible to contain only one of the above listed fruits, and if you do happen to see one without the other; you should know that either you have not spent enough time around the individual to see faithfulness, patience, etc., or you, my dear, have stumbled across what is bad fruit /or artificial fruit, and not our Good Lord's Fruit of the Holy Spirit! Notice how they all follow Love? God is Love and look at all He freely gives us when we are in Him (Salvation, see Ephesians 1:3-14). Oh, yes-Lord, we Thank You—Halleluiah!!!

When yielding to the Holy Spirit, one will find that The Fruit of the Spirit works in perfect agreement with our Spiritual Gifts. We do not have to go from block to block in search of His fruits; His fruits are always quite evident. We do not have to run for dear life when partaking in His fruit; His fruits are prevalent. *And*, unlike watermelon being good only a few months each year; God's essential fruits are inexhaustible and good year round. Key word, "inexhaustible." In other words, we have One Supplier Who Knows what we need, how much we need, and when we need it (See Philippians 4:19, But my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus).

Fruit bearing is part of our sanctification process as we remain in Christ Jesus. Therefore, the change does not happen overnight with all nine fruits, such as, the instantaneous change that happens at Salvation. We definitely receive all nine fruits, as they will always accompany the Holy Spirit. But, they become more and more evident in the believer over time, as He shapes and molds us into being more Christ-like. He gives us Love, and we will have to show, express and receive Love, He gives us patience, but we are going to be placed in situations to practice and grow our patience, He gives us Joy, but does not exempt us from trouble and sorrow to increase His Joy, He gives.... You get the point, *Right?* (see Romans 10:9, John 15:1-17, John 16:33 & 2 Corinthians 12:9)

EDUCATING OUR KIDS

This is the second in a series of answers to questions posed by a GNL staffer interested in the education and development of our youth. This month's Q&A were asked of Sister Hilda Kendrick-Apiah, an award-winning, dedicated, and distinguished educator, who is always seeking ways to enhance educational opportunities for the youth here at her Greater

I. How do you stress the importance of education at an early age?

Students need to be shown their interests at an early age by bringing the interests to the forefront and aligning students with their interests. Before the pandemic, I would invite many professionals in the classroom to speak and share their professions, such as doctors, lawyers, policemen, firemen, chemists, dental hygienists, business owners, and factory workers. They would stress the importance of education which had assisted helping them in their various fields.

2. When your student is not motivated, how do you encourage him/her?

You motivate a student by showing personal interest in the student and developing a positive relationship with the student. You show excitement in the little gains the stu-

dent demonstrates.

3. Do you promise, bribe, threaten, shame students that are not trying or working up to their potential? What works, what doesn't work?

You try to be positive with the student to motivate the student. Sometimes it works, sometimes it does not. One cannot change the student's home environment.

4. When the student states "the teacher doesn't like me" or "the teacher is not being fair" or "the teacher is not respectful," how do you address that with the student? How far up the chain (of command) do you go? Who do you believe? How do you fact check (what really happened)?

You ask the student why he or she thinks the teacher is not being fair. You discuss ways the teacher has encouraged the student and shown respect. You have an open relationship with the student's parent and administrators to discuss the student.

5. How do you speak with teachers, assistant principals, and administrators in a Christian and calm manner and still get your point across and feel like you are being heard?

You constantly walk as a Christian walks and remain calm and pray before you open your mouth. The way a teacher walks demonstrates his/her mannerisms.

6. How do you make teenagers complete homework, complete projects and work on their virtual classes without standing over them? How do you get them to be responsible and independent?

Constant modeling helps students to complete assignments by showing how an adult must complete work. Informing teenagers you believe in them and you want them to inform you when tasks have been completed. You tell them you are available to assist them in any way. Tell them they may socialize with their friends when they have completed the projects.

7. Do sports or extracurricular activities help or are they a hindrance to academic studies?

Sports and extra-curricular activities can be a major assistance in academic studies. Many colleges expect future students to have been active in high school. A personal experience occurred when two of my students who needed financial assistance, I paid for summer camp for them in basketball and soccer. As a result of summer camp, they received good scholarships. One is an attorney and the other one is a nurse practitioner.

8. What do you do if your student is a better athlete than academic? How do you help?

You find ways to tutor the student. You can make tutoring related to athletic plays.

9. How do you teach your student to avoid distractions (inappropriate relationships, rebellious spirit, overruling parental wishes?)

You work with the student to teach self-discipline. I never criticize the parents. A student who has alcoholic or drug addicted parents, you explain that the parents want a good life for the student. You encourage the student to think before he/she acts to avoid a rebellious attitude. Students may need personal counseling by a professional counselor or psychiatrist.

10. How do you celebrate academic achievements vs birthdays, State Tournament wins, etc.?

A teacher needs to send a personal note. I inform students that all children are gifted, some just open their packages sooner. I remind the student of that information when I send a personal note of congratulations on an academic achievement. I encourage the student and state that I believe in them..

11. When should you allow your student to get a part-time job? What are the requirements of grades vs. hours worked?

A student should be allowed to get a part time job mainly in the summers. If the student continues to work during school hours, he/she must get adequate rest and keep up the grades. Academics are the priority.

12. If your student has fallen off-track and made some mistakes, how do you get them moving in the right direction?

You motivate the student by explaining all people make mistakes along their journeys. You do not want to be the dog, FIDO. where you **F**orget **I**t and **D**rive **O**n. Be motivated to correct and improve from mistakes made. Most students will not always make A's on tests, students must forget about the previous test and work hard on the next test.

13.Is it "do as I say and not as I do", or leading by example? It is a combination of both. Sometimes students need to do as the adult says to avoid disasters, such as car wrecks, or getting in trouble with the law, etc. Mainly, the educators needs to lead by example.

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

brothers and sisters in Christ. We were created to do good works and to expect good works (see Ephesians 2:10). Many have had such bad experiences in life to the point that makes him/her suspicious when good things are presented to them. This is unfortunate, because our Good Lord tells us to think good thoughts and look after the interests of others (see Philippians 2:4). Love always protects, trusts, hopes and endures (see Philippians 4:8 & 1Corinthians 13:7).

Encourage! Provoke good works as the scripture says, and meet regularly with other believers, especially as the day draws near. This day drawing near is speaking of Christ Jesus' return/ His 2nd coming. YES, LORD—Hallelujah and, *Amen!!!* Encourage and support those that may be weaker in faith and may be experiencing a difficult time in their life. Likewise, if someone has done something nice and wonderful, encourage them to keep going and keep doing! A thoughtful compliment goes a long way, not a misplaced-inappropriate compliment to the point of extreme, nor one which makes someone feel awkward or uncomfortable. We have some degree of discernment as believers (see Hebrews 10:24-25, Galatians 6:10, Romans 12:2 & Romans 12:9).

Encourage some more! We should not withhold encouragement because we *personally* feel it would make someone proud. We do not have the ability, nor authority to humble anyone—the Holy Spirit has never failed to do *His* Work. The same Holy Spirit that blesses the believer with Spiritual Gifts and Fruit of the Spirit, is the same Holy Spirit that will discipline and humble His children when necessary (*Hebrews 12:5-13*).

Some folks may need a little more encouragement than others, and we will never know all that a person may be dealing with, or struggling with (see Hebrews 3:13, But encourage one another daily, as long as it is called "Today", so that none of us may be hardened by sin's deceitfulness). God gave the believer the ability to encourage for a reason as this is part of letting our Light shine, this is one of many ways we worship God as we Love Him with our whole being and Love our neighbors as ourselves. (see Matthew 5:16 & Matthew 22:37-40). This Light should shine everywhere we go, not just at Church, but at work, home, driving, and yes, communicating on the phone and through other social media, too.

Everyone is important to Christ Jesus and we are more successful and gain so much more when we work together to glorify Him (Romans 15:5-6); It is what our Holy, Just, Fair, Righteous, Thoughtful, Amazing and Loving God created us to do. There should be no animosity, division, gossiping, or jealousy, amongst God's children (the Church) as He gives every one of us Spiritual Gifts. We should intentionally look for someone to place on our shoulders. Of course, it does not have to be physically as one may not have the physical strength. But, every single one of God's children has the Super-natural Strength of the indwelling Holy Spirit to uplift others, Spiritually. When we began to exercise our Spiritual Gifts, we will find that there is no time for nonsense, and only a little time left to do what Christ Jesus has commanded us to do, His Great Commission, make disciples! Matthew 28:16-20).

For many people, the pandemic redefined work, with more employees logging hours from a home office — or kitchen table. Boundaries between job and personal life blurred, as did any sense of being "off duty."

Most of us prefer clear divisions between our tasks and time. While such separations may help with scheduling, they are artificial human constructs. "Whatever your task," says Colossians 3:23 (NRSV, emphasis added) — whether in public or private, family or job, spiritual or worldly activities — "put yourselves into it as done for the Lord." Verse 17 tells us to "do everything" in Jesus' name, "giving thanks to God the Father through him."

That means even work and worship interlock. As Rick Warren writes, "Work becomes worship when you dedicate it to God and perform it with an awareness of his presence."



What you do:


- Knot the string at one end. Add beads in this order: blue, white, gold, green, yellow, red, Gray, orange

QUESTION: HOW CAN I BE SAVED???

ANSWER:

This simple, yet profound, question is the most important question that can be asked. "How can I be saved?" deals with where we will spend eternity after our lives in this world are over. There is no more important issue than our eternal destiny. Thankfully, the Bible is abundantly clear on how a person can be saved. The Philippian jailer asked Paul and Silas, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" (Acts 16:30). Paul and Silas responded, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31).

How can I be saved? Why do I need to be saved?

We are all infected with sin (Romans 3:23). We are born with sin (Psalm 51:5), and we all personally choose to sin (Ecclesiastes 7:20; 1 John 1:8). Sin is what makes us unsaved. Sin is what separates us from God. Sin is what has us on the path to eternal destruction.

How can I be saved? Saved from what?

Because of our sin, we all deserve death (Romans 6:23). While the physical consequence of sin is physical death, that is not the only kind of death that results from sin. All sin is ultimately committed against an eternal and infinite God (Psalm 51:4). Because of that, the just penalty for our sin is also eternal and infinite. What we need to be saved from is eternal destruction (Matthew 25:46; Revelation 20:15).

How can I be saved? How did God provide salvation?

Because the just penalty for sin is infinite and eternal, only God could pay the penalty, because only He is infinite and eternal. But God, in His divine nature, could not die. So God became a human being in the person of Jesus Christ. God took on human flesh, lived among us, and taught us. When the people rejected Him and His message, and sought to kill Him, He willingly sacrificed Himself for us, allowing Himself to be crucified (John 10:15). Because Jesus Christ was human, He could die; and because Jesus Christ was God, His death had an eternal and infinite value. Jesus' death on the cross was the perfect and complete payment for our sin (1 John 2:2). He took the consequences we deserved. Jesus' resurrection from the dead demonstrated that His death was indeed the perfectly sufficient sacrifice for sin.

How can I be saved? What do I need to do?

"Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved" (Acts 16:31). God has already done all of the work. All you must do is receive, in faith, the salvation God offers (Ephesians 2:8-9). Fully trust in Jesus alone as the payment for your sins. Believe in Him, and you will not perish (John 3:16). God is offering you salvation as a gift. All you have to do is accept it. Jesus is the way of salvation (John 14:6).
