SEPTEMBER HEALTH NOTES FROM THE NURSES MINISTRY

Social Media and Youth Contact Information Needed

SOCIAL MEDIA AND YOUTH

There are good things about social media – but also many risks and things kids and teens should avoid. They don't always make good choices when they post something on a site, and this can lead to problems. To help them find balance, it's important to talk with your youth about how to use social media.

Mental Health Effects:

Spending too much time on social media can have negative mental health effects. Sometimes it's not just how much time kids spend on social media but how it's used that can affect them. For example, seeing how many "friends" others have and the pictures of them having fun can make kids feel bad about themselves or feel like they do not measure up to their peers.

Kids may see online ads or content that are inappropriate for their age. They could be exposed to content that not Christian and goes against what they have been taught. Spending too much time on social media can mean there is less time for doing homework, reading, exercising, sleeping, spending time with loved ones, or enjoying the outdoors.

So, what can parents do?

- It is important to be aware of what your kids do online. But snooping can alienate them and damage the trust you have built together. The key is to stay involved in a way that makes your kids understand that you want to make sure they are safe.
- Tell your kids that mean behavior is not ok. Ask them to always tell you about any harassing or bullying messages that they receive, or others post.
- ♦ Tell your kids not to share anything on social media that they would not want their teachers, future bosses and yes, grandma to see.
- Privacy settings are important. Go through them together to make sure your kids understand each.
- Help them to understand that passwords should not be shared, even with friends.
- Do not "friend" strangers. This is a plain, simple and safe rule of thumb.
- Help keep kids grounded in the real world by putting <u>limits on media use</u>. (Such as no devices at the dinner table or set a time that devices are to be turned off).

And do not forget – Setting a good example through your own virtual behavior can go a long way toward helping youth use social media safely.

Dr. Carter G. Woodson

September 15, 1915

Carter G Woodson, the Father of Black History, founded the Association for the Study of Negro Life and History, now the Association for the Study of African American Life and History.



James Meredith

September 10, 1962 The United States Supreme Court ordered the University of Mississippi to accept James Meredith as a student.

September 25, 1962 Governor Ross Barnett, in defiance of the court order, blocked Meredith entrance to the University,

September 30, 1962 Federal troops, sent by President Kennedy, escorted James Meredith onto the campus.



Gen. Daniel "Chappie" James

September 1, 1975

Daniel "Chappie" James, a former Tuskegee Airman, became the first Black four-star general in the United States Air Force.

CHURCH BUILDING PROJECTS....Completed and Proposed

Church Building Projects That Have Been Completed

- 1. Repaired soft panels in overhang (12 ft total) on east side of building corner only.
- 2. Installed dirt in low spot -on east side of building only. Grade area once dirt is installed. If leak continues where area has been repaired, additional costs will be necessary to explore the problem.
- 3. Removed & replaced entry place on roof. Church/owner supplied the door.
- 4. Removed old ceramic tiles and replaced with Pergo floor vinyl flooring (7x8) area only.
- 5. Eastside of Church entrance only, installed vinyl soffit panels in a (4x8) window sash inside & outside. Total of four window sashes only.
- 6. Removed existing shingles, old nails & drip edge from roof. Replaced with 3-dimensional roof shingles.
- 7. Installed underlayment, drip edge & flashing on shingle roof that is being repaired only.





Commitment forms for replenishing funds utilized in replacing the sanctuary roof and other recent building repairs are available. Over 25 Thousand Dollars in pledges have been made so far. You can make a one-time, weekly, or monthly gift toward your total annual gift.



STONE TABLETS

The tablets of stone symbolize God's giving of the Law to Israel through Moses on Mount Sinai (Horeb). They're often shown with Roman numerals I through III on the left tablet and IV through X on the right. This represents the Ten Commandments with the first three focusing on God and the final seven focusing on other people. The image of the stone tablets also may represent the entire Old Testament



We All Need Hope!!!

"The greatest need in our world today is the need for **hope**." —Billy Graham

WHEN HOPE IS LOST

Have you ever felt like everything is crumbling around you? When hard times come, it's surprising how quickly our plans are disrupted. In the blink of an eye, we can find ourselves with failing health, depleted resources, or shattered hopes and dreams.

When the future is dark and unknown—when all earthly hopes are fading—that is the perfect time to look up! "Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord, and whose hope the Lord is" (Jeremiah 17:7).

HOPE CANNOT OUTLIVE ITS SOURCE

Do you want hope that never fades? Then you need to find your hope in a *source* which never fails. As long as we look to temporary things for our satisfaction and joy, our hope will always be fleeting and fragile. But when we anchor our hope in God, it will remain eternal and strong, because He is the same "yesterday, and to day, and for ever" (Hebrews 13:8).

OUR GREATEST NEED

What is the one thing we need more than anything else? God, who designed us, breathed life into us, and knows all about us has declared that our greatest need is *a changed heart*.

Even though our first parents were created in innocence, they chose to disobey God and sinned against Him. Every new generation has inherited their fallen nature and followed their rebellious example. Because of this, we find ourselves spiritually "dead in trespasses and sins ... having no hope, and without God" (Ephesians 2:1,12).

WE CAN HAVE LASTING HOPE

For hope to be renewed, our relationship with God must be restored. Somehow, the defilement of sin must be washed away, and our deceitful hearts must be made new. People have many ideas about how this can be done, but God has already provided the *only* way. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by Me" (John 14:6).

When Jesus died on the cross, He laid down His life as a sacrifice for our sin. He suffered the wrath of God in our place, and shed His blood so we can be cleansed and forgiven. He then rose from the dead, signifying that God ac-

cepted His sacrifice, and proving that sin and death have been defeated!

To have the sure hope of eternal life, we must put our complete trust in what Jesus has done. We cannot "earn" our way back to Him with good works. Only a perfect righteousness—that of Jesus—is enough. When we put our trust in Jesus Christ, God forgives our sins and covers us in the righteousness of Jesus. We receive God's salvation as a gift of His grace.

WILL GOD MAKE EVERYTHING PERFECT?

Those who trust in Jesus Christ are promised an eternal paradise which exceeds anything we can possibly imagine (1 Corinthians 2:9). In that day, "God shall wipe away all tears ... and there shall be no more death, neither sorrow, nor crying, neither shall there be any more pain" (Revelation 21:4).

Until then, believers are assured that God is always with them in every difficulty. He has promised, "I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Hebrews 13:5). This gives God's children the confidence to say, "The Lord is my helper" (Hebrews 13:6).

If we start to feel overwhelmed by life's ups and downs, it is good to remember that we can trust the almighty God in every circumstance. Peace comes from "casting all your care upon Him; for He careth for you" (1 Peter 5:7).

FIND YOUR HOPE IN JESUS CHRIST

If you realize that you need the hope only God can provide and are ready to turn to God in repentance, what is stopping you from admitting your sin to God, and asking Him to save you? Right now, right where you are, you can talk to Him in your own words, expressing to Him your need and desire for His free gift of salvation. There is forgiveness and hope in Jesus Christ!

"God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16).


