Flight Expo QR Codes

Have you notices those odd looking squiggly boxes on a restaurant menu, billboard or TV ad?



Scan with your Smartphone to go to our Flight Expo, Inc. website.

Those strange squares are Quick Response (QR) Codes. Think of them as a modern day bar code that a computer or smartphone can interpret faster than plain text. Most QR Codes are shortcuts to websites or apps. They were created to make sharing information easier but can be challenging the first time you encounter them. Here's how to make the QR code work:

Apple Smartphones

- 1. Open the Camera app and point it at a QR Code.
- 2. Tap the QR Code image with your finger.

Android

- 1. Download Google Lens or Google Photos.
- 2. Google Lens, open your photo of the QR code, and it will automatically scan the picture.
- 3. Google Photos, open an image of the QR code, press the three-dot menu in the right corner of your screen, and select "Search".

With all QR codes, only scan if you know and trust the organization sending them. Occasionally, they can be used by scammers to redirect people to malicious websites. Use common sense and you'll be just fine.

2023 National Championship Air Races

This year will mark the final Reno Air Races taking place at the Reno Stead Airport in Nevada on September 13-17. Bill Stead, a World War II Veteran, started the closedcourse pylon air racing event in 1964.

Spectators will have the opportunity to enjoy several hands-on educational displays and military demonstrations. More than 150 airplanes and pilots are expected to attend, racing in six different categories:



Unlimited Class Formula 1 Class Jet Class Sport Class Short Take-Off and Landing (STOL) Class T-6 Class

Although this will be the last year for air racing at the Reno Stead Airport, an Airshow is planned for 2024 to celebrate the race's 60th Anniversary.

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Move the STOOF

Flight Expo, Inc. was very fortunate to have an S2F Tracker (STOOF) donated to the program. The American Wings Air Museum at the Anoka-Blaine Airport can no longer store the plane. We are currently raising funds to move it to Princeton where it can be restored by mechanics, Build A Plane students, and veterans.



Transporting the Stoof from the Anoka-Blaine Airport to Princeton will involve a 64 mile trip under the cover of darkness during the early hours of the morning when fewer cars are on the road. Prior to making the

journey, we will send out a road surveyor to assess our route and make adjustments as necessary. The Stoof will be towed behind a small semi. One challenge will be making sure the tires are at the correct air pressure. During the move, we will increase and decrease the pressure as necessary to overcome obstacles such as underpasses and overhead electrical wires. Moving at a cautious 15-20mph, we anticipate it will take us most of the night. An alternate destination will be selected prior to the move in case the trip takes longer than expected and we need to move the aircraft off the road before morning rush hour begins.

Once moved, restoration will begin!
