

February of 2022, Harley Carnes of NJ donated his Wag Aero Cubby and his Commonwealth aircraft into Flight Expo, Inc.'s Build A Plane program.

The Cubby was built by a B-17 gunner who passed away befor he could see his Baby Fly. It was always his dream to build and own a Cub.

When we arrived on the field in NJ, the Cub was sitting outside with about 6 inches of snow on her. Cool thing about this field is that this is where Harrison Ford took his tail wheel endorsement.

The maintenance person was extremely nice in letting us move the aircraft into his heated hanger and take it apart to load into the trailer and van. We had to travel to another airport in NJ to pick up the Common Wealth aircraft. After much juggling, love & patience we were able to load both aircraft into our 24' trailer. The Common Wealth wings went on top of the trailer for the trip home.

Currently the Cubby has been shaken down, cleaned inside (working on the outside), inspected inside of the fuselage. (Found a mouse nest, bees nest and a few other bugs—cleaned them up—but saw no damage).

The wings still need inspection this fall.
