

Move the STOOF

Our Move the STOOF Campaign is well underway! In three short months we have raised a total of \$5535.00! We still need additional funds.

As many of you know, the S2F Tracker (or STOOF) has been donated to the Flight Expo program. It currently resides at the American Wings Air Museum at the Anoka-Blaine Airport. It will be dismantled and scrapped if it is not moved.

This aircraft was instrumental during the Cold War. The primary threat to US Navy ships at the time was the Soviet submarines that hid under the vast ocean waters. Using a search radar mounted on the bottom of the fuselage, the plane traveled hundreds of miles of ocean on each patrol.

Our goal is to bring the aircraft to Princeton by the end of the year. To accomplish this goal, we need your help! The total estimated cost to move the aircraft keeps going up. The first company wanted \$12,000; the last company I just spoke to, the estimate was over \$30,000.

We also would consider in-kind donations; ie: Moving services, trailers, knowledgeable personnel, hotel stay for these people. Anything will help us make this move.

L4 Piper Cub Donation

Known for its lightweight frame and ability to make short takeoffs, the L4 was first used by the US Civil Aviation as its main training plane.

By 1941, the US Army Air Corp used the plane to observe and correct artillery fire.

At the beaches of Normandy, during WWII, the Piper Cub directed Allied Navy gunners while also transporting authorities. As the war continued, the aircraft was fitted with anti-tank rocket launchers (such as a Bazooka) for bold attacks on the enemy.

Following WWII, the Piper Cub played a vital role in the Korean War by evacuating casualties.

Now the plane is considered a War Bird and often used to commemorate the battles of the Second World War.

We look forward to restoring it to its former glory.
