When I met Jami, she (re)introduced me to the music of a genius named Tom Lehrer. I had heard his songs before in passing, but she encouraged me to listen to the lyrics. One of them has stayed in my head all this time.

*"Spring is here, spring is here
Life is skittles and life is beer
I think the loveliest time of the year
Is the spring, I do, don't you?"*

Mr. Lehrer goes on to more gruesome thoughts in this song, entitled Poisoning Pigeons In The Park. It's awfully quirky, which makes it one of my favorites.

I bring it to your attention, however, because of its starting emphasis on spring. You see, we're starting Autumn, and as far as I know, Mr. Lehrer (nor anyone else) has written a really great song about Autumn in Eastern Washington. Oh sure, there's Autumn in New York, the jazz standard Autumn Leaves, even a fun tune called September by Earth, Wind, and Fire. There are depressing songs about Fall, that seem to tie the theme of falling leaves to love being lost, or Simon and Garfunkel singing about withering leaves that crumble in your hand.

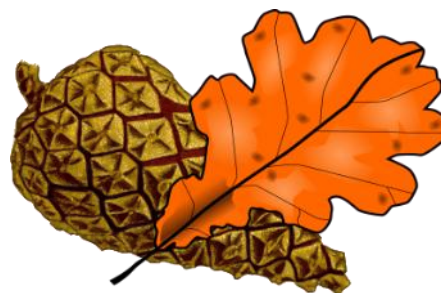
Psalm 85:11-13 reminds us...

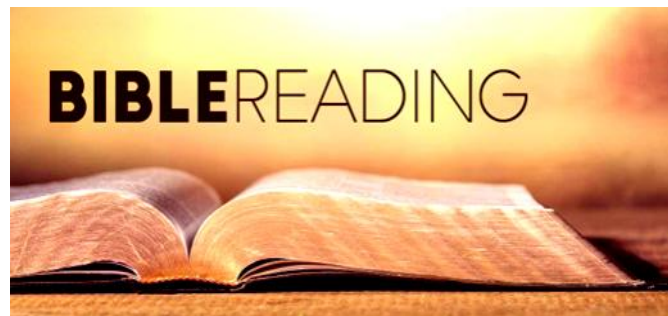
Our church choir is excited to welcome new and returning members! Whether you are a seasoned vocalist or a beginner eager to learn, there is a place for you in our musical family.

COUNCIL MINUTES

Council Meeting Minutes: August 11, 2026 *(Subject to approval)*

Present: Pat Woods, LaLita Tadena, Pastor Ed Backell, Nancy Purcell, Bob McMahan, Diane Bertholet, Charlie May, Jen Bomhard, George Simon and Sandy Hoveskeland. Vicki Egesdal was absent.

Call to Order: President Pat Woods called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m.

Devotional: Jen provided the devotional based on Psalm 118, verse 19 and how nature reveals to us the Lord's loving presence.

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Charlie and seconded by LaLita to approve the July 14, 2026 minutes as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Vicki provided the Treasurer's Report. Total income is higher than expected and expenses are lower than expected for this time of year. Plate offerings are higher than last year. A new benevolence account was added for individual assistance for church members. These monies will be administered at Pastor Ed's discretion.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: A motion was made by Nancy and seconded by Charlie to approve the August 2026 Treasurer's Report as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ed preached every Sunday. He met weekly with the Tuesday men's group and the Friday Breakfast and Bible study group. He met with Deanna regarding the funeral for Verna Bagby and he attended the funeral on August 1. He also met with Joey of the Be Bold for Jesus Conference to be held in Spokane October 2-3. He followed up with Jon, a new visitor at the church, and with Neil and Linda whom he met at the Bagby funeral. Verna's husband, Roger, has been attending church with his friend Dean. Table Talk is a new meeting that Pastor Ed leads on the last Thursday of each month. Three people attended on July 30. Pastor shared a letter he received from the NW District of the LCMC that they are praying for HTLC and anyone who suffered loss due to the recent fires in Spokane. He will read the letter to the congregation on Sunday, and it will be included with the next newsletter.

Properties and Maintenance: See report submitted by Charlie May. The broken plexiglass on the reader board in front of the church was replaced at a cost of \$277.95. Charlie also reported that he received a signed Facility Use Agreement, Waiver of Liability and Assumption of Risk form from the representative of each user group at their meeting on July 18, 2026. Charlie reported that the carpets were cleaned in the AA meeting room using funds donated by the AA groups.

Worship and Music: See report submitted by Nancy Purcell. We will switch to the winter schedule of 10:30 a.m. worship service on September 13. Sunday School will resume at 9:30 a.m. on September 13.

Congregational Ministries: See report submitted by LaLita Tadena. The National Night Out event was cancelled for August 4 due to the air quality conditions caused by the fires in Spokane. This event will be rescheduled. A Bite2Go presentation was given after the July 12 church service. This program helps with food for the weekend and HTLC is sponsoring Bowdish Middle School. The monthly cost is \$24, and this is a 3-year commitment if you wish to participate.

Christian Education: See report submitted by Diane Bertholet. Adult Sunday School will return to the winter schedule on September 13. Wednesday Bible study will resume September 9. Friday breakfast and Bible study meets from 8:00 a.m. - 9:30 a.m. every week. Table Talk meets the last Thursday of each month at 10 a.m. in the Fellowship Hall.

Social Cares and Concerns and Care Team: See report submitted by Jennifer Bomhard. A group from HTLC served lunch at the UGM Men's Shelter on July 9. Tom Stevenson from Bite2Go gave a presentation of the program after the July 12 church service. The Care Team made home visits to Cher Brown and Arlene Severance during the month. Diane and Griffin are doing pet therapy at the UGM Women's Shelter. There are many opportunities to volunteer. Information on available opportunities can be found on the UGM website.

Special Events Committee: See report submitted by Bob McMahan. Barb Miller and Pam McMahan are two new members on the Events Committee and are helping with Special Events. The committee met with the Bagby family about Verna's service on August 1. Meetings were held to discuss details of the National Night Out Against Crime. The event was to be held outside, but it was canceled due to smoke and poor air quality. The event will be rescheduled for late September. The committee also met to discuss the October 16 Church Appreciation Dinner.

Approval of Committee Reports: A motion was made by Bob and seconded by Jen to approve the Committee Reports as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

Unfinished Business:

1. User Forms and Agreements: The recently revised forms for use of the church facility were reviewed. A change to both policies (members and non-members) titled "Facility Use -- Policy-Wedding & Reception" was discussed. It was agreed that #6a. should be deleted on both policies. This refers to replacing pictures or wall hangings that may have been removed for wedding pictures. Item #6 states that removal of pictures or wall hangings is prohibited. A motion was made by Bob and seconded by Jen to approve the forms with changes. Motion was unanimously approved.
2. Approval of Council E-mail Requests: Spokane Bible Church asked to use HTLC for Sunday afternoon services for their congregation as their church was evacuated due to the recent fires. Council approved

this request via email on August 6. A motion was made by Charlie and seconded by Jen to approve the email action. Motion was unanimously approved. They were able to return to their church building, so our facility was not used.

New Business:

1. Cancel Subscription to RightNow Media: Usage of RightNow Media by the congregation is minimal, so it was decided to cancel the subscription. A motion was made by Jen and seconded by Nancy to cancel the RightNow Media subscription. Motion was unanimously approved. Tracy will handle the cancellation.
2. Member Special Needs and Funding: Discussion was held on creating a benevolence fund for special needs of HTLC members. Currently we do not have a dedicated fund to help members of the HTLC congregation when they are in need. The fund will have a cap of \$4,000 and will be used at the discretion of Pastor Ed. The purpose of the fund will be explained to the congregation, and the congregation can decide if they wish to support the benevolence fund. A motion was made by Charlie and seconded by Jen to establish the benevolence fund. Motion was unanimously approved.
3. Adding Signer to HTLC STCU Account: STCU requires a council action to add an additional signer to the HTLC STCU account. Pat Woods agreed to be added. A motion was made by Pat and seconded by LaLita to add Pat to the STCU account as a signer. Motion was unanimously approved. Pat will work with Tracy to complete this action.

Member Items:

1. Be Bold for Jesus Conference Table: This conference will be held at the Spokane Convention Center on October 2-3. Local churches were asked if they would like to have a table with materials to represent their church. The table needs to be staffed for the entire two-day conference. Teams would need to be at the table starting at 7:30 a.m. and ending at 9:30 p.m. both days. Pastor Ed will be at the table most of the time. He will make an announcement after church service Sunday to see if there is interest.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ

Grace and peace to you in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

Our hearts are heavy as we think of you and your community in the aftermath of this devastating fire. We know that no words can adequately express the sorrow, uncertainty, and sense of loss that accompany such a tragedy. In moments like these, even those who have long trusted in God may find themselves asking difficult questions and wondering where God is in the midst of such suffering.

The Scriptures do not shy away from these questions. The Psalms give voice to the cry of God's people: **"How long, O Lord?"** (Psalm 13:1). There are times when God can seem very far away, when the circumstances around us appear to contradict everything we believe about His goodness and care.

Yet faith does not mean that we must pretend that everything is all right. Faith means that, even when we cannot understand what God is doing or cannot feel His presence, we continue to cling to who God has revealed Himself to be. Our circumstances may change, but His promises do not.

At the heart of our faith is the cross of Jesus Christ. There, God Himself entered into our suffering and bore the brokenness of this world. Jesus knows what it is to weep, to experience loss, and to cry out in anguish. And because He has risen from the dead, suffering and death do not have the final word.

In these difficult days, may you be strengthened by the promise of God's Word: **"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble"** (Psalm 46:1). Notice that the Psalm does not say that God's people will never experience trouble. It assures us that God is present *in* the trouble.

There may be days ahead when God's presence is easier to see through the kindness of neighbors, the generosity of friends, the courage of first responders, the compassion of those who help rebuild, and the love shown within the congregation. In these acts of care, may you recognize small reminders that God has not abandoned you.

Pastor Backell, we pray especially for you as you walk alongside your people. May God give you strength to listen to their grief, wisdom to know when to speak and when simply to be present, and courage to proclaim the hope of Christ when circumstances seem to offer little hope. May the Lord sustain you as you shepherd people through questions and sorrow that cannot always be answered.

And to the congregation: do not be afraid to lean upon one another. There will be times when one person's faith is strong enough to carry another who is struggling. Bear one another's burdens. Pray for one another. Weep with those who weep. And remind one another of the promises of God when those promises are difficult to see.

Above all, hold fast to Christ. **"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever"** (Hebrews 13:8). The fire may have changed much, but it has not changed the Lord who holds you in His hands.

We pray that, in time, the Lord will bring healing from this devastation and open new opportunities for your congregation to be a source of hope, compassion, and Gospel witness within the community. The road ahead may be difficult, but you do not walk it alone.

May the Lord give you strength for today, hope for tomorrow, and the assurance that nothing—not tragedy, loss, suffering, or even death—can separate His people from His love in Christ Jesus.

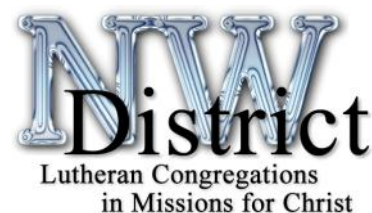

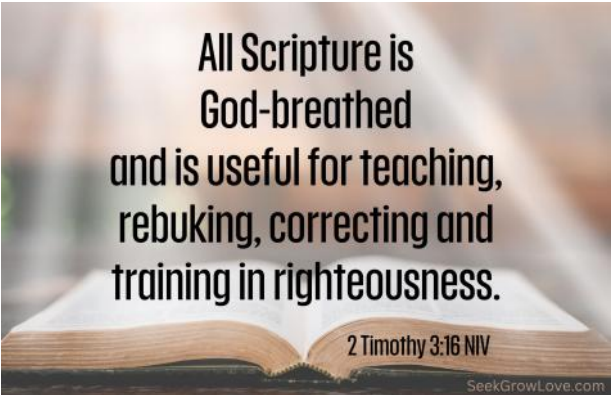
