### It's Advent; Christmas is Coming

"To us a child is born, to us a Son is given, and the government will be on His shoulders. And He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." (Isaiah 9:6) "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of Bethlehem a Savior has been born to you; He is Christ the Lord." (Luke 2:10 -11) On that silent night our Savior came upon the midnight clear as a baby to us. Come let us adore Him! Worship Christ the newborn King!

We have entered the holiday season with its vast variety of activities and events. We can sometimes be


so busy that we become overwhelmed in our individual lives and families and even with all that is happening in our congregation, working with our ministry partners, decorating our facilities for Advent/Christmas, the food drive, and Christmas Eve candlelight worship service.

In the midst of all of this, first and foremost, we need to keep in mind that it is all about Jesus Christ. The baby Savior quietly enters our world

with God making his grand and glorious announcement by means of angels from the realms of glory; angels we have heard on high. Not many in the world heard about a Christ child appearing, except a few shepherds quaking at the sight, and a few wise men from the east following a strange star in the sky. Most of the world was unaware of the birth of the Son of God. God is telling us and the whole world that we need to slow down, pause, be silent, and stand in awe of this miraculous birth. Put aside all of the hectic activity enough to pay attention to Jesus. While the activities of our congregation might seem like just more to do, most of them help us focus our attention on Jesus.

Advent is intended to be a season of reflection. We reflect on what God has done in the birth of His son; on what Jesus accomplished in His death and resurrection; on the violence and evil in the world that causes us to cry out to God to make things right—to put death's dark shadows to flight. So we immerse ourselves in His Word, and we ask for His presence.

Advent is a time of preparation. We are called to prepare our hearts for His coming. It isn't really about our traditions, Christmas parties, or even our happiness. It's about what God is calling us to. We are called to wait. And while we wait, we are to share the story of Jesus. We are to tell the poor in spirit about how the angels came first to the shepherds. We are to tell the meek about Jesus' mother, Mary. We are to tell those who mourn about the love and forgiveness that Jesus brings to us now. We are called to tell the world about the coming...the arrival...the dawning of a new day. Go and tell! Go tell it on the mountain.

God promises to be present in our lives— that part is predictable. But how God is present can be surprising; often showing up in startling ways or when we least expect it. I pray that this Advent brings you hope and joy in trusting God to work in your life as you wade through the business and celebrations of the season. I pray that you will be surprised by grace when you least expect it and that it causes your heart to praise Emmanuel, God with us. Oh, come, oh come, Emmanuel. May you all have a blessed Christmas.

# COUNCIL MINUTES

Council Meeting Minutes: November 8, 2022 — "Subject to Approval"

**Present:** Dan Olson, Diane Fried, Ilene Benham, George Simon, Charlie May, LaLita Tadena, and Nancy Purcell. Also present were Pastor Steve Hagler, Denel Ingraham, and Marcia Taes.

Call to Order: Treasurer, Dan Olson, called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

**Devotional:** LaLita shared a devotional on "Seed Sewing" based in part on 2 Corinthians 9:6 and John 12:24 followed by prayer.

**Approval of Minutes**: A motion was made by llene and seconded by LaLita to approve the October 11, 2022 minutes. Motion was unanimously approved.

**Treasurer's Report**: Dan presented the Treasurer's report.

Dan reported that \$713.00 had been received from an anonymous donor to help cover the cost of the Gratitude Dinner on November 13. Dan further suggested that we consider moving the building fund account and the money market savings account from Spokane Teachers' Credit Union, which is paying interest of 0.10%, to a Charles Schwab Money Fund and/or a U.S. Treasury Bond (I Bond). The Schwab account pays 3.26% with no minimum deposit. A five year I Bond pays 6.89% and requires a minimum investment of \$10,000. The I Bond cannot be sold during the first year and must be held for 5 years. If sold after one year and before the end of the 5 year period, there is a forfeiture of three month's interest.

After discussion, George made a motion, which was seconded by Diane, to invest \$10,000 from the Building Fund in an I Bond and the remainder from the Building Fund, and the money market account be moved to savings accounts at Charles Schwab to take advantage of the higher interest rates.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Steve continues to spend a large portion of his time on sermon preparation and preparation for teaching the Sunday morning Bible class on Revelation. He continues to preview the videos for the Friday morning Bible study and to attend the Bible study/breakfast on Friday. He writes an article for the monthly newsletter and attends the monthly Worship and Music Committee meetings. He visited with Pat and Caren Woods and Arlene Severance. He is working on the memorial service for Steve Bliesner, which is scheduled for November 19. He helped to serve lunch at the UGM men's shelter and urges everyone to volunteer to serve a meal.

**Properties and Maintenance**: See report as submitted by Charlie May. In addition, Charlie submitted a Snow Maintenance Agreement from Ponderosa Lawn and Plow. He reported that the cost for plowing for each incident is \$110.00, an increase of \$20 from last year. However, last year there was no increase. After review and discussion, Charlie made a motion to approve the contract with Ponderosa Lawn as presented; George seconded the motion; it passed unanimously. Charlie reported that Larry Tyler has agreed to shovel the sidewalks and use the snow blower where required.

**Worship and Music**: See report as submitted by Nancy Purcell. Nancy reported that church decorating for Christmas is scheduled for December 3 at 10:00 a.m. Chili will be served to all who help. She also asked for volunteers to help distribute the Advent devotionals. George, Ilene, Diane, Marcia Taes and Nancy volunteered to help. Discussion was had as to whether we should have service on Christmas Day, which falls on a Sunday this year. We will ask for feedback from the congregation. Christmas Eve service will be at 6:30 p.m.

**Congregational Ministries**: See report as presented by LaLita Tadena.

**Christian Education**: See report as presented by George Simon.

**Social Care and Concerns**: See report as presented by Diane Fried. Diane reported that our service at the Women's Shelter at UGM had been rescheduled from November 1 to November 8 because of possible COVID exposure. She reported five people had helped. She also asked about taking the canned food that had been purchased for community dinners to the UGM Men's Shelter so it could be used before it reached the expiration date. Council approved donating the canned food to UGM.

#### **Old Business:**

<u>Pastoral Call Committee</u>: See report as submitted by Marcia Taes. Marcia reported that serving on the Committee has been a challenge and a joy. Two candidates have responded to our posting on the LCMC website. They had hoped for a bigger response. The committee felt that one of the applicants did not fit Holy Trinity's needs. The Call Committee has a Zoom call scheduled with the second candidate on November 9. The Call Committee will decide after the Zoom call if they want to repost the call on the LCMC website. Please pray God will send Holy Trinity His chosen candidate.

<u>Gratitude Event and Dinner</u>: Dan reviewed the program for the event on November 13, which starts at 4:00 p.m. Dan reported that a turkey dinner will be served and they are planning for approximately 100 people. There will be speakers from Union Gospel Mission, Alcoholic Anonymous, TOPS, and Holy Trinity. Pastor Steve will open the program with prayer and close the program.

### **New Business:**

<u>Lutheran Class</u>: Council discussed offering a class on what it means to be Lutheran. It would cover the basis of our Lutheran faith and the teachings of Martin Luther. Pastor Steve has agreed to lead a class. It was

It was questioned whether it was ever referred to and if we needed one to be in compliance with our constitution and bylaws. The matter was tabled until our next meeting.

<u>Recruitment of New Council Members</u>: Discussion was had regarding possible candidates to serve on the Council. We will need to elect a president and a vice president, and/or possible members at large. Further discussion will be had at a future meeting.

Marcia Taes reported that she is working on a letter to send to the congregation regarding Christmas gifts for the staff. She will also purchase Christmas cards for the Council.




