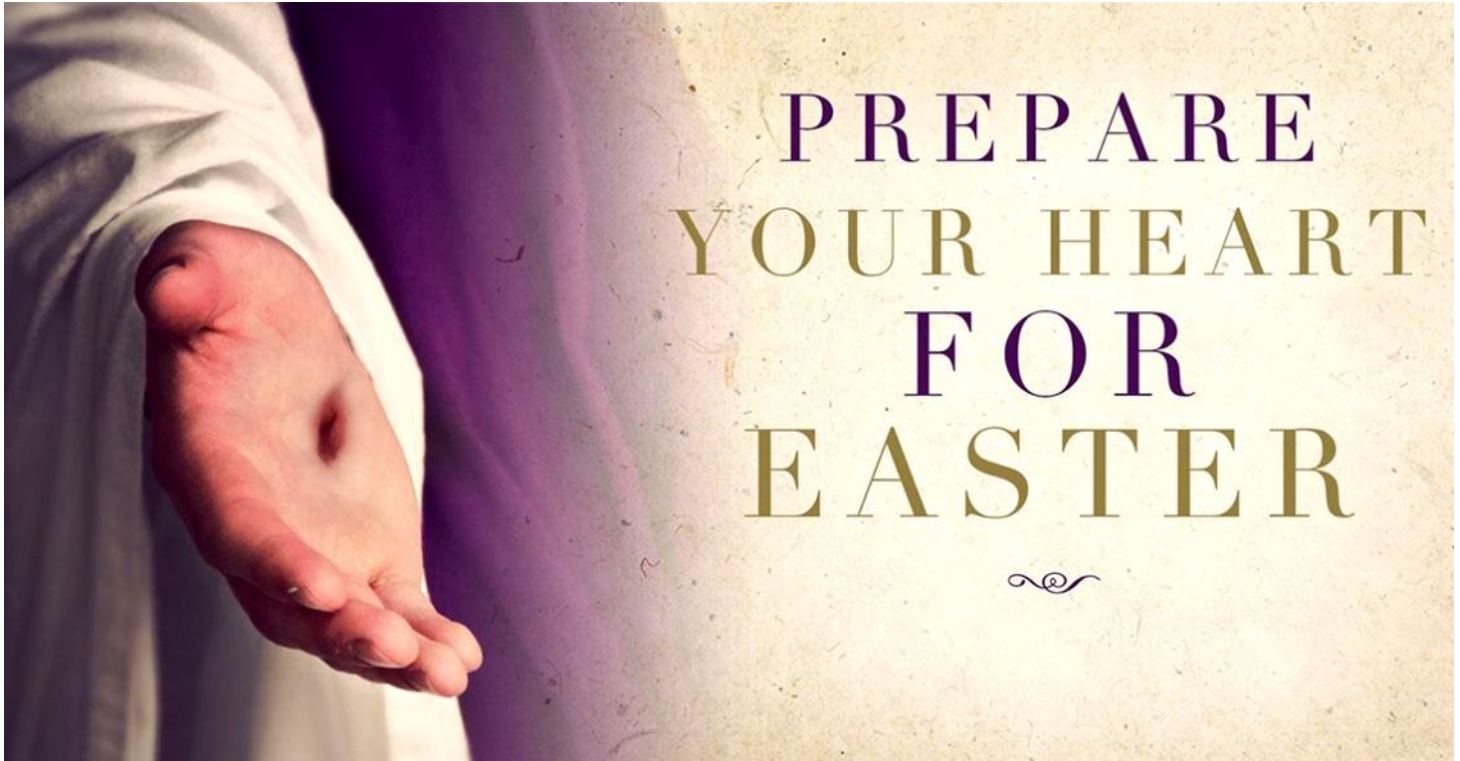

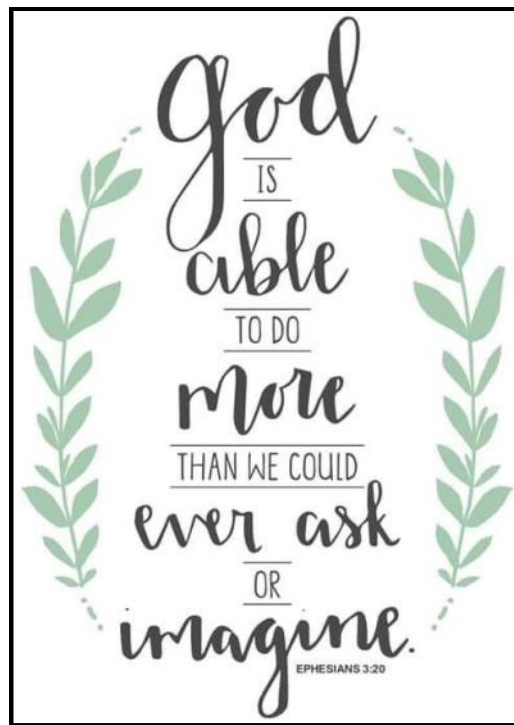

## Encouraged by the Cross

When you look at the world, are you encouraged or discouraged? There continues to be mass shootings. Politicians and celebrities alike are facing numerous misconduct charges. Our culture continues to deteriorate morally. Wars still rage and terrorism continues around the world. Many still feel the sting of recession or are living with food insecurity. These are only a few major negative factors in our world. But remember, "For God so loved the world that He gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). That's good news! That's encouraging! It's hopeful! C.S. Lewis wrote, "If I find in myself a desire which no experience in this world can satisfy, the most probable explanation is that I was made for another world...Probably earthly pleasures were never meant to satisfy it, but only to arouse it, to suggest the real thing." That real thing is Jesus. He gives us a reason to live and fight for love and compassion in a world that no longer cares. He gives us a reason to take up our cross and follow Him (Mark 8:34).



When you look at the Christian Church, are you encouraged or discouraged? Some churches seem to have abandoned the Bible as God's Word and authority, and embraced the ways of the world instead of the Way of Christ. Worship attendance and Christian Education have declined. Christians are persecuted for their faith. Our Lord's Great Commission doesn't appear to be the Church's main mission. But remember, "Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, in order to make her holy" (Ephesians 5:25b-26a). That's encouraging! It's hopeful! Jesus has poured his

Holy Spirit into His Church and will not let the gates of hell prevail against His Church.

When we look at things in the world and in the Church that might be considered discouraging, in Christ we can be encouraged and encouraging to others. We see opportunities to love others and share the Good News of salvation. Wherever there is fear, God's perfect love drives out fear (I John 4:18). "The one who is in you is greater than the one who is in the world" (I John 4:4). "Now to him

who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us, to Him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen" (Eph. 3:20-21). We have God's gifts to do God's work.

The last week of this month we call Holy Week. It is holy because Jesus Christ sanctified the time and events we observe with his suffering, death, and resurrection. This is God's plan for our salvation. This is our opportunity to share Christ and encourage others. It's easier on

Easter Sunday, but we really can't get to Easter without going through Holy Week with Jesus. We need to travel with Jesus from Palm Sunday (His entrance into Jerusalem) to Maundy Thursday (The Last Supper) and Good Friday (His death on the cross). Without the crucifixion, there can be no resurrection. The world sees the cross as a discouraging negative. Bible believing Christians see the cross as God's way for us to have eternal life. That's encouraging and hopeful!

## Pastor Call Committee Update

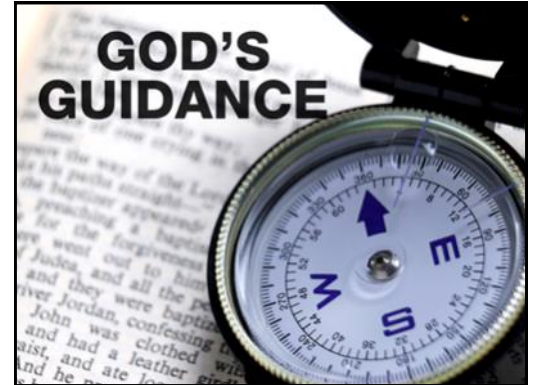

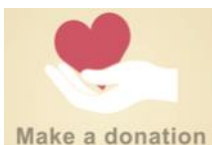

# COUNCIL MINUTES

## **Council Meeting Minutes: February 20, 2024 — “Subject to Approval”**

**Present:** Dan Olson, Diane Fried, Charlie May, LaLita Tadena, George Simon, Denel Ingraham, and Nancy Purcell. Also present were Pastor Steve, Pat Woods, and Marcia Taes. Ilene Benham was absent.

**Call to Order:** President, Dan Olson, called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

**Devotional:** Denel presented a devotional from “He Chose the Nails” by Max Lucado, based on Matthew 7:11 on all the gifts God gives us, including the gift of the cross and so much more. Denel closed the devotional with prayer.

**Approval of Minutes:** A motion was made by LaLita and seconded by George to approve both the minutes from the January 9, 2024, meeting and the special meeting on January 29, 2024, as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

**Treasurer’s Report:** Dan presented the Treasurer’s report.

**Pastor’s Report:** Pastor Steve reported that with the season of Lent, extra time as been spent on preparing for midweek services as well as the normal sermon and preparation for the Sunday morning worship. Additionally, he prepares for teaching Sunday School and writing an article each month for the newsletter. He also attends church council meetings, Worship and Music Committee meetings, and the Friday morning Bible study and breakfast. He meets with Tracy on Thursdays. This month he met with five members of the congregation, who stopped by his office. He made phone calls to Rita Smith and Al Marsh and then met personally with Al and gave him communion. A suggestion was made of several other members he might visit.

**Properties and Maintenance:** See report submitted by Charlie May. Additionally, thank you to Denel for coming with his tractor and spreading the gravel which was delivered for the overflow parking for AA. Charlie will speak to AA about parking for Palm Sunday and Easter and the need to use the overflow lot. A spring cleaning will be scheduled probably after Easter.

**Worship and Music:** See report submitted by Nancy Purcell. Thank you to George and Charlie for delivering Lenten devotionals to inactive or shut-in members. We will only be ordering Easter Lillies for decorating the church this year. Both Safeway and the Plant Farm indicated that mums would not be available to order this year.

**Congregational Ministries:** See report submitted by LaLita Tadena.

**Christian Education:** See report submitted by George Simon.

**Social Care and Concerns:** See report submitted by Diane Fried. Diane reported that 319# of food have been delivered to the Food Bank for 2024. We are doing a Lenten service project for Union Gospel Mission entitled "Easter Blessings for UGM." A check has been received from Thrivent for \$250.00 for the same and a list of items needed was in Sunday's bulletin. We will be collecting needed items through Easter Sunday.

**Care Crew:** Diane reported that she had attempted to contact the Fletcher family, Kirsten Peterson, and Cheryal Brown. She spoke with Cher on January 31 and discovered she had been hospitalized for three weeks. She had been unconscious and in intensive care for about 10 days. Doctors have removed a cancerous lesion and she is recovering. Keep her in prayer. Diane further reported she had left a Lenten Devotional for Fletchers on February 11 and Keri had called to thank her. On February 13 Diane visited with Arlene Severance and gave her the Lenten devotional and communion. Arlene hopes to be able to attend church when weather is better.

## **Old Business:**

Call Committee: See report submitted by Marcia Taes. Marcia reported they are in the process of making arrangements to fly Pastor Jackson and his wife to Spokane from Texas the weekend of April 12-14, 2024. She will let us know when plans have been confirmed. George, Charlie, and Dan have agreed to meet to put together a tentative salary package before that time.

Budget: Dan reported that the \$400 that was shown on the proposed budget for LCMC District and National was actually the amount sent to them for the combined years of 2022 and 2023. The actual yearly amount that had been approved was \$200 to each entity per year. Dan asked Council if he should change the proposed budget to show a donation of \$200 each for LCMC National and District, as well as \$200 for NALC (North American Lutheran Church), if the congregation approves a dual roster for Holy Trinity. After discussion a motion was made by George and seconded by LaLita to revise the proposed budget that will be presented to the congregation at the annual meeting to reflect a donation of \$200 each for LCMC National and District and the NALC, for a total of \$600. Motion passed unanimously.

## **New Business:**

Quorum for Annual Meeting: Nancy reported that she and Diane had reviewed the church directory and determined that we have 61 voting members. A quorum is 30% of all voting members so we will need 19 people in attendance at the annual meeting to conduct business. The council approved the report.

Resignation of LaLita Tadena: LaLita tendered her resignation as a member at large of the Council effective February 20, 2024, with one year of her term remaining. Council had approved the appointment of Pat Woods to fulfill LaLita's remaining one-year term at the Special Meeting on January 29, 2024. LaLita is running for Vice President at the annual meeting to be held on February 25, 2024.

**Group Mailings:** George reported he had spoken with Tracy about problems she encountered in sending group mailings to the members of the congregation. Dan indicated he was also aware of the problems and he and Tom Purcell had spoken. After discussion, Charlie made a motion to hire Gabe Petrina, Vega Discovery, LLC, to see if he could fix the problem. George seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

**User Groups:** Charlie reported he and George had met with the user groups in January. A good discussion was had. Charlie reported the problems of clean-up and unsupervised use of the nursery and the AA and NA groups promised to speak with the people causing the problems. They also asked the groups to be sure that the last person to leave the building be sure that the front doors were securely locked and closed, even if they had not used them to enter. It was explained that sometimes the doors did not latch completely and sometimes people left via the front doors. They also were made aware that lights were being left on and again promised to check as they appreciate being able to use our facilities. They will also ask the groups not to unplug the camera in the classrooms off the fellowship hall.

**Easter Breakfast:** The question came up as to whether we would have an Easter breakfast this year. Denel said yes and he would find people to assist. Charlie volunteered to help and Marcia Taes said she was sure Chuck would also help. If you are interested in helping, please talk to Denel.

**Pastor Shortage:** Denel then read a letter from the LCMC District regarding the shortage of pastors and if anything could be done to solve the problem. We need congregations to assist the seminaries in training and teaching the pastors. Not enough people applying and many drop out before finishing. Richland Lutheran has been helping in the training for many years by supporting interns. As a church, we need to be doing our part to fill the need. Pat Woods said he would speak with the Pastor in Richland to see how their program works and how Holy Trinity might be able to reach out and help.

# Special Council Meeting Minutes

## **Special Council Meeting Minutes: January 29, 2024 — “Approved”**

**Present:** Dan Olson, Diane Fried, Ilene Benham, LaLita Tadena, George Simon, Denel Ingraham, and Nancy Purcell. Charlie May was unable to attend.

**Call to Order:** President, Dan Olson, called the meeting to order at 10:03 a.m. and opened with prayer.

Dan stated that the purpose of the meeting was to review the 2024 budget, review the slate of Council members to be elected at the annual meeting, vote on transferring funds to the building fund; review of the Agenda for the annual meeting, and any other concerns the members of Council may have.

Dan presented a copy of the proposed budget for the church for fiscal year 2024. It was noted that, as presented, we have a deficit for the year 2024. If we are to have the funds to call a new pastor, it is important that giving be increased. George made a motion to accept the proposed budget as presented. The motion was seconded by LaLita and unanimously approved. Charlie had previously reviewed the budget and sent his written approval by email.

### **The following slate of officers was presented to Council:**

- George Simon – President – 2 years
- LaLita Tadena – Vice President – 2 years
- Sandy Hoveskeland – Secretary – 2 years
- Nancy Purcell – Member at Large – 3 years

LaLita will be resigning as a Member at Large of Council with one year of her three-year position remaining. Pat Woods has agreed to fill that one-year vacancy. George made a motion to accept the slate of officers as presented and to approve the appointment of Pat Woods to fill the remaining one-year term for the Member at Large position upon LaLita’s resignation. Diane seconded the motion and it passed unanimously. Charlie had sent his written approval of the slate of officers.

There was discussion to transfer \$1,000 a month to the building fund to have funds available when the need arose for repairs and replacements. George made a motion to transfer \$1,000 a month to the building fund as reflected in the 2024 budget to be used for repairs and replacements. Ilene seconded the motion and it was approved unanimously.

Besides approving the budget and the slate of officers to be presented at the annual meeting, Council also approved presenting to the congregation for review joining the North American Lutheran Church. If approved by the congregation, we would be a dual rostered church, i.e., belonging to both the LCMC and the NALC.

Council reviewed the requirements to be considered an active, voting member of the congregation for purposes of determining a quorum for the annual meeting. Nancy and Diane will review the roster and present to the council at its next meeting the number to determine the quorum.

Ilene asked if there were any candidates being considered by the Call Committee for filling the pastoral vacancy. George reported the Committee had had two Zoom Meetings with Pastor Emmanuel from Texas. He reported that the Committee would like to meet Pastor Emmanuel in person and that the cost to fly he and his wife to Spokane, three nights’ lodging, and rental car would be approximately \$2,000. Nancy made a motion to approve up to \$2,500 for the Committee to fly Pastor Emmanuel and his wife to Spokane, and to provide lodging, and car rental while they were here. LaLita seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

**Adjournment:** Meeting closed at 11 a.m.

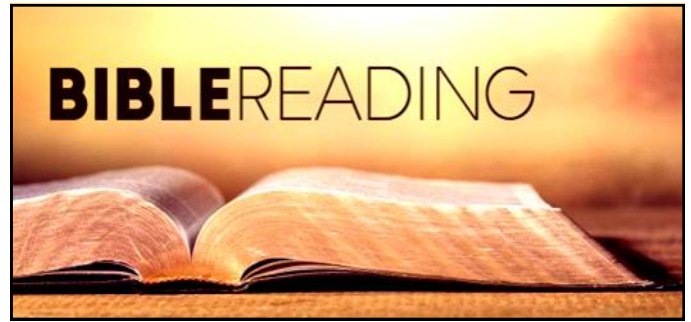


