Let me share it here:

"I urge you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, [which is] your spiritual service of worship. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what the will of God is, that which is good and acceptable and perfect." {NASB}

This brought to mind an interesting conversation I had. The comment that particularly stands out in my mind is something like, "You know, as I make my to do list for the day, I don't put spiritual goals on that list. I don't mark down how many people I'm going to share Christ with..."

That really grabbed my attention! I wonder how many of us *plan* to incorporate specific spiritual activities into our lives? I know, for example, that I have a general weekly schedule; I know when I'll be spending extra time in study, I know when I plan to write my sermon and prepare for my


Sunday School lesson... but how often do I make room for the movement of the Holy Spirit in my everyday life?

I ask that God would use me whenever the

that I'm missing because I'm preoccupied

COUNCIL MINUTES

Council Meeting Minutes: May 13, 2025 — "Subject to Approval"

Present: George Simon, Dan Olson, Denel Ingraham, Pastor Ed Backell, LaLita Tadena, Vicki Egesdal, Charlie May, Pat Woods and Sandy Hoveskeland. Nancy Purcell and Diane Fried were absent.

Call to Order: President George Simon called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Devotional: Denel Ingraham gave the devotional based on Mark: Chapter 7, verse 37. He hath done all things well; he maketh both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak. He is with you always. Denel also referred to a book titled "Where in the World is God?"

Approval of Minutes: A motion was made by Charlie and seconded by LaLita to approve the April 8, 2025, minutes as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Dan presented the Treasurer's Report which was reviewed and discussed by the Council. Current assets are \$186,887 compared to \$180,007 on April 30, 2024. Unearned givings are \$34,133 yet to be recognized compared to \$30,800 at this time last year. Building use is \$4,468 compared to \$4,366 at this time last year. Plate offerings January through April 2025 are \$46,998 compared to \$39,324 January through April 2024. Pastor's salary to-date is \$9,000 and \$5,625 has been contributed to his retirement account. Net loss from January through April 2025 is \$13,846 compared to a net loss of \$11,252 at this time last year. Donations received at the Easter breakfast were \$300 compared to \$246 last year. Vicki Egesdal started working with Dan to learn procedures for taking over the Treasurer's position in January 2026.

C. Schwab VIGAX Investment Fund: \$19,282.54



Pastor's Report: Pastor Ed preached and taught every Sunday. Adult Sunday School has completed 13 of 22 weeks into Psalm 119. The series will not be completed before the summer break, so Pastor asked for opinions on whether to print the remainder of the sessions for personal devotion or to end it now and start something new in the fall. The consensus was to consider Psalm 119 completed and start something new in the fall.

Pastor Ed and Jami have attended small group meetings in David and Christel Seybold's home and Pat and Caren Woods' home. Other small group meetings are being planned. Pastor helped host Sober Karaoke on Saturday, April 26. Attendance was not as good as the Karaoke previously held on a Friday night. Next time it will be scheduled for a Friday. He met with Deanna Lane regarding the service for her father, Dan Winchester, which will be held June 6 at 12:30 p.m. at Holy Trinity. He also met with others for counseling, fulfilled prayer requests, and followed up with visitors who had completed a yellow card during church attendance.

Properties and Maintenance: See report submitted by Charlie May. About a dozen people helped spread bark in the shrub beds at the church on spring clean-up day. Thanks to all who participated! Avista put up their own pole on the NW corner of the church grounds. We will leave our pole in place and use it as a flagpole to fly the Lutheran flag. One of the AA members brought in equipment and spread the gravel in the back parking lot. This volunteer effort was much appreciated! Charlie will look at the hot water tank to assess whether it will last another few years. He will address a conflict with a user group about noise in the kitchen conflicting with a meeting in the Fellowship Hall.

Worship and Music: See report submitted by Nancy Purcell. Nancy thanked all who helped decorate the church for Easter, provided Easter lilies and mums, and helped cook, serve and clean up after the Easter breakfast. Ava Andreasen completed the Instruction for Confirmation with the Redeemer Lutheran Church group and was confirmed by Pastor Ed during the worship service on May 4. The summer worship schedule changes on May 25. Sunday worship service will begin at 9:30. The winter schedule resumes on September 7.

Congregational Ministries: See report submitted by LaLita Tadena. Sober Karaoke was held in the fellowship hall hosted by Pastor Ed and Jami. Approximately 18 people attended from HTLC and various user groups.

Christian Education: See report submitted by Pat Woods which encourages participation in breakfast and Bible study meetings throughout the summer months.

Social Care and Concerns and Care Team: See report submitted by Diane Fried. Diane provided a detailed review of the team's activities for the month. The outreach and service of this committee is very much appreciated.

Old Business: Pastor Ed's vacation is July 28-August 8. Pastor Steve will substitute August 3.

New Business:

- 1. <u>Approval of Amendment to Pastor's Employment Agreement:</u> Pastor Ed is awaiting information on completing classwork for NALC and he expects to complete by the end of this year. Pat made a motion and Dan seconded to accept and approve this Amendment. The motion was unanimously approved. The Amendment was signed by George and Sandy.
- 2. <u>Northgate Revival Concert, Wednesday, June 11, 2025:</u> This group is on tour in the NW and has offered to put on a concert at our church. Flyers will be distributed around the neighborhood on Sunday, June 1. Dan will contact Marcia Taes about using the same teams and routes used during the food drive.
- 3. <u>Summer Outreach Events:</u> Thursday, July 24 Neighborhood BBQ, Thursday, August 28 S'mores Night.
- 4. <u>Small Church Request to Lease HTLC Evenings:</u> Holy Trinity is being used at capacity by current user groups so this request will be denied.


