Happy Birthday Jesus, Jesus I Love You.







**Council Meeting Minutes: November 11, 2025** (Subject to approval)

**Present:** George Simon, Vicki Egesdal, LaLita Tadena, Diane Fried, Charlie May, Denel Ingraham, Pat Woods, and Nancy Purcell. Also present was Pastor Ed Backell. Sandy Hoveskeland was absent.

Call to Order: President, George Simon, called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m.

**Devotional**: Vicki led devotionals from the book *Help, Lord! I'm Having a Senior Moment,* by Karen O'Connor entitled "My Forgetter" based on Isaiah 43:25.

**Approval of Minutes**: A motion was made by Diane and seconded by LaLita to approve the October 14, 2025 minutes as presented. Motion was unanimously approved.

**Treasurer's Report**: Vicki presented the Treasurer's report.

We are 83% of the way through the year, and so far our income is a little higher and our expenses a little lower than we budgeted. Total assets are down about \$17,500, which is primarily the depreciation on the building, which is a paper loss. Our cash assets are a little higher than last year. Our plate offerings to date are \$17,000 greater than at this time last year. Our expenses are slightly higher this year because we now have a full-time pastor, but because of the increase in giving, our net loss so far for the year is only a small amount greater than last year. Our Budget Committee will meet November 18 to draft a budget for 2026.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ed preached and taught adult Sunday School class each week. He attended the weekly Wednesday morning Bible study, the Tuesday men's group, and the Friday morning breakfast and study. He also attended the Worship and Music monthly planning committee meeting. Pastor reported there were five attendees in the first membership class, which went great. He met individually with Joyce regarding questions about Lutheranism. He read to the second grade class at Valley Christian School, as well as helping the School to set up the sound system for the Veterans' Day Program and running the sound system for the actual program. He sent out a special prayer request for Virginia Boyles when she was hospitalized for an emergency artery stint. He visited with Sean, a guest at the Friday breakfast. Pastor helped Don Russell with a recording project. He also counseled with James, a mechanic. He met with RightNow Media. He took Cathie to surgery and performed a wedding for Heidi H., his sister in Ellensburg. There was one prayer request that was turned in on the yellow cards in the pews. Pastor reported there is a one-week delay if you listen to the service on You-Tube but you can watch the service live each week on Facebook.

**Properties and Maintenance**: See report submitted by Charlie May. Thanks to Bob McMahan for fixing the capacitor on the air conditioner. The bulb in the projector needs to be changed and the projector cleaned.

**Congregational Ministries**: No report submitted for November.

**Christian Education**: See report submitted by Pat Woods.

**Social Care and Concerns, and the Care Team**: See report submitted by Diane Fried.

Old Business: Charlie requested clarification for the Nominating Committee as to what positions needed to be filled on Council for 2026. George Simon indicated he would not seek re-election so we need to fill the position of President. LaLita indicated she would not seek re-election as Vice President. In order that the office of President and Vice President would not need to be filled in the same year and in the future the terms would expire in alternating years, Charlie May indicated he would be willing to serve as Vice President for one year. Sandy Hoveskeland's term as Secretary also expires this year and will need to be filled. Vicki Egesdal indicated she would be willing to fill a two-year term as Treasurer. Nancy Purcell has one year remaining on her term as a member-at-large and Pat Woods has two years remaining on his term. The terms for member at large for Denel Ingraham, Diane Fried, and Charlie May are all ending leaving three open positions for a member at large. LaLita Tadena indicated she would be willing to fill one of those positions.

#### **New Business:**

Speaker from Chosen People Ministries for Palm Sunday: Pastor Ed indicated that he had been contacted by Chosen People Ministries asking if we would be interested in having a special speaker come to our church on Palm Sunday. Dr. Daniel Nessim, Pastor and teacher of Messianic Congregation Kehilat (Zion Congregation) will be in our area during March and is available to lead an overview of the Passover and Spring Feasts. There are four different options available, each varying in length. After discussion, Diane made a motion and Vicki seconded it that Pastor Ed visit with Chosen People Ministries and arrange for Dr. Nessim to present a program to our congregation on Palm Sunday. Motion passed unanimously. The program would cover the Sunday School and worship time frame. Pastor Ed will determine which program will work best for us. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend. This will be a great way to learn more about the traditional elements of the Jewish Passover Seder. Cost is a love offering, plus \$200 to help cover travel costs, along with overnight lodging. Pastor Ed will check to see if the lodging could be provided by a member. Watch for further information as the Lenten season approaches.

Emergency Action Plan and Map: The Valley Fire Department is requiring that the church submit an updated floor plan of the building and a written "Emergency Action Plan." Council reviewed the floor plan and updated building usage where appropriate. Because the draft of the Emergency Action Plan (EAP) that we received to help us draft our own plan was for a business, not a church, Pastor, Vicki, Charlie, and George agreed to review the draft EAP and adapt it for our worship facility. They will report back to Council.

<u>Computer Issues</u>: Tracy has reported experiencing problems with the computer, especially when she is working remotely. After discussion Charlie made a motion to hire Gabe, from Vega Discoveries, to see if he can determine what is causing our issues. The motion was seconded by Vicki and passed unanimously. Gabe has assisted us before with computer problems.

<u>Christmas Outreach to South Pines Elementary</u>: In the hope of keeping our Christmas outreach more local than a family from UGM, Pastor Ed and Dan Olson are meeting with Paula Bonney, a teacher at South Pines Elementary, on November 12. In addition, they hope to be able to speak with the principal and explore ways Holy Trinity could reach out to the school.

HTLC Benevolence Fund: Pastor Ed has been contacted by people seeking assistance for food, gas, etc., and was wondering if HTLC had funds available for such requests. Because we want to be good stewards of our funds and still reach out to those in needs, it was suggested that rather than cash, we have vouchers available for food, gas, etc. Because Fred Meyer is more of a one-stop shopping center, including gas, Pastor Ed will contact them regarding vouchers. Charlie made a motion, seconded by Diane, to set up a discretionary fund in the amount of \$100 for Pastor's use, such fund to be replenished monthly to maintain a balance of \$100. Motion passed unanimously.

LCMC District Meeting: The Northwest District Meeting for LCMC will be held at Lutherhaven on April 23-26, 2026. Holy Trinity will be in charge of the Saturday evening service. If you would like to attend but need transportation, please let a member of the Council know. The National meeting for LCMC will be held in West Des Moines, lowa, on October 4-7, 2026.
