

Step 12




The co-founder of AA, Bill W. mentions in his autobiography that for him it was a sudden, strong "white light" and life-changing event: "I stood upon a summit where a great wind blew. A wind not of air, but of spirit. In great, clean strength it blew right through me. Then came the blazing thought, 'You are a free man.'"

It gives me chills every time I read that, because after that moment, Bill never took another drink. Thanks to him there are many more free men and women today. For most of us, the "aha" moments, that may not be a white light, are regular events and part of the spiritual awakening that happens over time in a subtle and gradual way.

I am responsible when anyone, anywhere, reaches out for help, I want the hand of AA always to be there, and for that I am responsible.

The second part of the 12th step is about carrying the message of recovery to other people. This is not because AA is a cult, it's because "we keep what we have by giving it away." To keep it simple, when we work with others, our lives change. So, we don't help another alcoholic because they're sick—we help another alcoholic because we are sick, and part of our recovery is that we need to be helping others



#### A.A. PREAMBLE

Alcoholics Anonymous is a fellowship of men and women who share their experience, strength and hope with each other that they may solve their common problem and help others to recover from alcoholism.

The only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. There are no dues or fees for A.A. membership; we are self-supporting through our own contributions. A.A. is not allied with any sect, denomination, politics, organization or institution; does not wish to engage in any controversy, neither endorses nor opposes any causes. Our primary purpose is to stay sober and help other alcoholics to achieve sobriety.

## Unpacking the 12th Step

In <u>Al-Anon</u>, the 12th step reads, "try to carry the message to others," and in <u>Alcoholics Anonymous</u>, it says "to alcoholics." But the principle is the same. In order to work all 12 of the steps, we must try to help others.

Carrying the message to others by sharing experience, strength, and hope reinforces the spiritual principle of the 12 steps in the person being 12th-stepped as well as the one doing the sharing.

But step 12 also calls for members to put the spiritual growth they have found to work—not only within the fellowship but in all aspects of their lives. It requires practicing these principles in all our affairs. This, too, is doing the 12th step "work" and makes the program work as one of attraction and not promotion.

Step 12 allows people who have worked the program to work with others who are still struggling, which benefits both the person in recovery as well as those who are still going through the program. Being of service to others can:

- Remind us of the early days of recovery (and why we've worked so hard to move past that phase)
- Keep us accountable and prevent us from becoming complacent in our recovery
- Give us a sense of purpose
- Enhance our fellowship with others
- Inspire someone else to stay on the sober path
- Help provide insight to someone else in recovery

Allow us to become a trustworthy person for someone in recovery

Box 459 will become both the post office address and symbolic address of Alcoholics Anonymous. In its early days A.A. is an organization that must rely heavily on communication by mail.
