



## **Bachelor of Divinity (B.Div) in Biblical Studies**

**Institution:** Lamad University

**Total Credit Hours: 90** Tuition: \$65 per credit hour



### Program Overview

The Bachelor of Divinity (B.Div) in Biblical Studies is designed for students who seek advanced scriptural knowledge, ministry application, and preparation for graduate-level or ministerial leadership.

This program deepens the student's understanding of Old and New Testament theology, biblical languages, doctrine, and church history—integrating spiritual formation with academic rigor.

Students who already hold an Associate of Divinity (A.Div) from Lamad University may enter the Accelerated Completion Track, requiring only six electives (18 credits) and a Capstone Project (6 credits) for graduation.

4	Systematic Theology I	The study of God, humanity, sin, and salvation from a biblical perspective.
5	Systematic Theology II	Explores Christology, Pneumatology, and Eschatology.

## **Capstone Project (6 Credits)**

Each B.Div student must complete a **Capstone Project or Mini-Thesis** (minimum 5,000 words) demonstrating theological depth and practical ministry application.

- **Topic Approval:** Must be approved by the Academic Board.
- **Presentation:** Oral defense or presentation before a 2–3 member faculty panel.
- Publication: Exceptional projects may be archived in the Lamad University Digital Library.

### Scholarship Opportunities

Students who maintain a 75% (C average) or higher in their courses qualify for the Adell Foundation Partial Scholarship, which can waive tuition for the Capstone Project or a portion of elective tuition.

### □ CLEP-Out Option (for Core Courses)

New students may **CLEP out of core courses** by completing a **\$65 Lamad University Credit-by-Exam** per class.

- Passing score: 80% or higher
- Includes study guide and email support
- Exams are **not timed**, allowing self-paced completion
- Successful CLEP-out can reduce tuition by up to \$3,510 and shorten degree completion time to 12 months
