Fabric ID	Yardage	Cut
Inner Border: Contrast	¾ yd.	6 strips 3 ½" x 40"
Outer Border: Feature	1 ¼ yd.	7 strips 5 ½" x 40"
Batting	One package twin-size batting	
Backing	4 7/8 yd.	
Binding	2/3 yd.

Quilt themed programs through the Schwenkfelder Museum's Penn Dry Goods Market!

Great news! Although COVID restrictions prevent the Penn Dry Goods Market from happening in person, it will be held VIRTUALLY from June 4 -6 --- and has some terrific quilt-related lectures planned through Zoom.

Among others, noted quilt historian Barbara Brackman will be speaking on Civil War quilts! (One of the great things about Zoom is we can learn from noted people in the quilt world without having to travel)

Most lectures are 1 hour in length and cost \$15. As they are being recorded, they will be available for you to watch for several weeks after the event ends, so if you can't do the published date and time, you can still attend at your later convenience.
