PHILANTHROPY

Thank you to everyone who came and took kits and returned quilts and blankets on our Give & Take Wednesdays over the summer . We are so very grateful. We made deliveries to The Baby Bureau, Cradles to Crayons, Neshaminy Manor and St. Christopher's Hospital NICU unit. We look forward to seeing all of you on Wednesday, September 15 from noon to one. (G&T is always the 3rd Wednesday of the month in the back Church parking lot of New Britain Baptist.)

We will begin to give out our lovely placemats to the 4 senior centers in October. I currently have 38 placemats from our summer G&T days, so we will need lots more in the days to come. We have traditionally given all 350 Meals on Wheels senior members two placemats a year. That's adds up to 700 placemats. The seniors love the mats and are so very happy to receive them. We do have a few kits, but we hope you can make some on your own.

NICU Isolette Quilt Covers Instructions

The NICU quilts cover the top of the babies' isolettes (incubators). The nurses have requested that the quilts be a minimum of 40 inches by 44 inches (this is a new measurement). The backs should be a dark fabric. We have several kits available. In the kit you will receive an assortment of compatible children's fabrics. You can use any design that you like. You will also receive a dark fabric for the back. If by chance your back is too small to meet the size requirements please add a border. Don't forget to add a CLQ label to the back of your quilt. These quilts go home with the babies when they are discharged.

I must thank Storm Evan's husband for the generous gift of yards and yards of dark fabric for the backs of our NICU quilts. Storm was a beloved teacher at the Round Bobbin for many years and recently passed away.

We hope to see lots of you on G&T Wednesdays, but for those who are unable to come, we would be happy to come to your house or meet you somewhere to pick up your philanthropic donations. Just give us a call!

Quilt of Valor Presentation

A Quilt of Valor was presented to Jeanne Malone's husband – William Malone on July 3rd. Pat Kennedy assisted me in the presentation. The Quilt of Valor mission is to honor our combat service members and veterans who have been touched by war with a Quilt of Valor. Since founded in 2003 over 273,353 quilts have been presented. We honored Mr. Malone for his many years of service in the United States Army Special Forces, Green Beret, and Special Forces A-Team. Bill was awarded 2 Bronze Stars for Valor, a Purple Heart and Air Medal (for numerous combat insertions plus various other rewards). We know that freedom is not free, and our quilts are meant to say Thank You for your choice to service this country.



I wanted to share this information with County Line Quilters. We had a sit and sew over a year ago to support our Veterans with Quilts of Valor. I hope and pray we will be able to continue to have these sit and sews to make more blocks and quilts. Looking forward to seeing everyone in the Fall.
