NICU quilts can be made at least 40 in X 44 in rectangular, any design may be used, but must have a dark backing. These quilts will be donated to St Christopher's hospital. The dark backing will keep light from the isolet and disturbing the infant. There will be dark fabric and batting available at the Give and Take. The parents are able to take the quilts home when the infant is released from the hospital.

Forty-five NICU quilts have been donated.

Placemats are also needed; we would like to have 350 donated this year. Some walker bag and burp cloth kits are available.

Labels are available for any donations made.

2021-2 Budget for Philanthropy is \$500.

Fabric Requirements for Quilt Top

Feature Fabric	1 1/8 yard
Light Background	1 1/8 yard
Dark Contrast	1 1/8 yard

Pieced Top Size 50" x 60"

Fabric Requirements for Borders

Feature Fabric	Inner Border	5/8 yard
Feature Fabric	Outer Border	1 yard
Light Background	Middle Border	3/8 yard
Dark Contrast	Cornerstone Scraps	

Cutting instructions for borders will be provided with the last clue.

Finishing Requirements

Batting	Twin Size
Backing	4 3/4 yard
Binding	2/3 yard

Completed Quilt Size 66" x 76"

Okay, quilt detectives! It's time to get your quilt tools ready for your first clue. The title of this year's mystery quilt is ... "THE UNEXPECTED PLAYGROUND". That will get your wheels turning right?

CLUE #1

Feature Fabric:



Cut 5 strips 6 1/2" by width of fabric (WOF)

Sub cut each strip 6 1/2"

30, 6 1/2" squares total

Light Background:



Cut 15 strips 2 1/2" by WOF

From 2 separate strips cut 1 - 2 1/2" square from each strip for 2 squares

Using 2 new strips, sub cut each 6 1/2" for a total of 12 - 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles

Dark Contrast:



Cut 15 strips 2 1/2" by WOF

From 2 separate strips cut 1 - 2 1/2" square from each strip for 2 squares

Using 2 new strips, sub cut each 6 1/2" for a total of 12 - 2 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles
