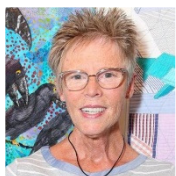

Light Background

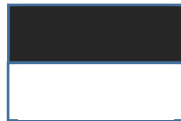


Dark Contrast

Gather 9 light and 9 dark strips. Sew 1 light and 1 dark strip together, 9 times, for a total of 9 strip sets.

Subcut each strip set by 6 ½"

Make 49 rectangle pair sets.
