# COUNTY LINE QUILTERS GENERAL MEETING MINUTES 10-13-2025



The meeting was called to order by President Carol Cotter at 7:00 p.m. The

meeting was held at Doylestown Mennonite Church, Doylestown, PA. President Carol Cotter welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Nancy Williams said that she would be circulating a sign-up sheet during the meeting for anyone who would like to order a yearbook.

Denise Beck introduced Janneke Van Der Ree, the speaker for the evening.

Secretary – Vickie Detwiler – A Motion was made by Suzie Sergeant and seconded by Pat Clayton to accept the Minutes of the September 8, 2025 meeting. The Motion passed.

Vice Presidents – Denise Beck/Stella Bredin – Lori Leonardi will be the speaker for November. Sign-up sheets will be available next month for the holiday party in December.

Membership – Helen Haun/Lois Moore – There were 48 members in attendance at this meeting, as well as four members on Zoom and two new members.

Events – Marilyn Lopez – A potluck will be held on October 23rd at the

Church. If the weather is good, it will be outside in the pavilion; otherwise, it will be inside. We will have a table for books, magazines and patterns that you would like to trade. Sign-up sheets are in the back. If we don't have enough people, it will be canceled.

Moda Blockheads will be held this Saturday on Zoom. There will be a paper piecing workshop on November 22nd. A sign-up sheet is in the back. The class includes the pattern, which includes six different ornaments. Sue Edelman will be teaching this workshop. The cost is \$20.

There will be a Chubby Charmer tote bag workshop on December 13th. Pat Clayton will be teaching this class. The cost is \$20.

Sign-ups are still being taken for Tilly Mint's Tea; however, you must sign up tonight.

The December holiday dinner will be held at the Plumsteadville Inn again this year. This was the choice of three-quarters of the members. Next year, we will have a committee to investigate other venues so that we can choose a place that is more centrally located.

The newsletter contained an insert about the Dear Jane quilt. Marilyn

suggested that we could have a club to work on this quilt, similar to the Moda Blockheads. Please let her know if you are interested and she will come up with more details.

Newsletter – Jacob Kane – The newsletter deadline is October 25th.

Facebook – Kathy Acker – No report.

Philanthropy – Barbara Lewis/Barb Gleason – We have requests for fidget quilts from three different organizations. Materials were prepared for members to take home and work on these. We will also be working on them on Philanthropy sew day this Thursday. We also need placemats desperately. There are NICU quilt kits available as well.

Crafts – Liz Watson – There are samples on the back table of items that have been made for the boutique. There will be another demo night next Monday, October 20th starting at 5:00 p.m. Instructions for these items are on the website (or will be soon.)

Website – Marilyn Malik – There are various tabs on the website to look at. On the Philanthropy tab, there are instructions and links for items. There is also a new tab called "How to Make Stuff". There will be instructions for how to make some of the items that have been demonstrated, as well as how to make a hanging sleeve.

Challenge – Carol reminded everyone about the "Every Day is a

Holiday" challenge. Items are due at the December meeting.

Quilt Show – Marilyn Lopez/Marilyn Malik – Thank you for the donations for the boutique. The entrance fee for the show will be increased from \$7 to \$10. Please do not bring books, magazines or patterns until set-up day. They can also be brought to the potluck.

Please see Suzette to sign up for consignment. The deadline is January. The guild will get 10% of the sale price of any item that is consigned.

Mini Quilts – The size should not exceed 80 inches in total but items can be any shape. Please include a label with your name.

We will start volunteer sign-ups next month for the quilt show. There will be two-hour time slots.

Marilyn Lopez apologized for an error on some of the neons, which indicated that the quilt show would be in 2006. Please discard those if you have them.

Quilt registration will begin at the next meeting.

New Business – Carol said that the Church asked her to let us know that they have a video doorbell at the front entrance/porch. It has audio also, so if you have any conversation on the porch, it can be heard. If you have any private conversations, please have them in the parking lot rather than on the porch.

Yearbook – Nancy Williams said that only six people signed up for the yearbook. Unless more people sign up, we may not be able to order them.

Show and Tell – Pat Clayton showed a quilt that was a Spring pattern. Sue Edelman asked if she would be willing to teach it. Pat said she would.

Quilts for Kids – Denise Beck said that Quilts for Kids would be having an open house on Saturday, November 15 from 10:00 to 3:00. Fabric will be \$9 per yard. They will also have precuts and Superior thread. Drawings – Fat Quarters: Sylvia O'Neill Next month's color will be rose.



Your mini can be any shape or size as long it doesn't exceed 80 inches perimeter. Please attach a sleeve at the top back and a label/ or your name on the back. Don't be shy ... time to show off!

Raffle tickets ~ Everyone should have gotten or will be getting their ticket envelopes. It includes tickets to sell and some neons & pictures to give out and promote our Quilt Show. 1 ticket for \$1 or 6 tickets for \$5 for a chance to WIN! the beautiful quilt that our own guild designed & created. Neon advertisements have been provided at the Oaks show and the Lancaster show, and will also be

given at the Allentown Show in October. If you haven't picked up your envelope yet, please check with Dee Carr, Mary Finley or Mary Beth Hoff at the next guild meeting.

### **Vendors & consignment** ~

At this year's Quilt Show we will be offering a Consignment Shop. Members may bring quilting/craft related items they would like to sell. This includes kits, finished quilts, sewing supplies, machines, sewing chairs, etc. You will be given a seller number and will be asked to set the price for any item(s) you want to sell. All items must be securely labeled with your seller's number and the price of the item. Do not use any form of tape to price your item(s). You will be asked to complete a form with your seller number, name, contact information, description of the item, and the asking price. For those items over \$50 indicate whether the price is firm, and if not firm, the minimum price you are willing to accept. The Guild will be collecting 10% of the selling price. All unsold items must be picked up at the end of the show. Each seller will be provided a check or Venmo transaction after the Treasurer reviews the sales sheets. Suzette Trucksess will be working with Joyce Helstrom on the consignment shop.
