The meeting was called to order by President Carol Cotter at 7:00 p.m. The

meeting was held at Doylestown Mennonite Church, Doylestown, PA. President Carol Cotter welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Denise Beck introduced the speaker for the evening, Lori Leonardi, who spoke about Quirky Little Quilts.

Kathy Webb appeared, dressed in various holiday garb, to encourage members to participate in the "Every Day's a Holiday" challenge. Ellen Cicak showed some suggestions of holiday quilts.

Vice Presidents – Denise Beck/Stella Bredin – Next month's meeting/holiday party will begin at 6:30. The doors will open at 5:30 for set-up. The meeting/event will not be on Zoom. January and February's meetings will be on Zoom and we have great speakers lined up. Speakers are booked through May.

Secretary – Vickie Detwiler – A Motion to accept the Minutes of the October 13, 2025 meeting was made by Suzette Trucksess and seconded by Dee Carr. The Motion passed.

Treasurer – Kathy Webb – A Motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was

made by Suzette Trucksess and seconded by Denise Beck. The Motion passed.

Communications – Jeanne Malone – The deadline for the Blast is December 3rd.

Newsletter – Jacob Kane – The newsletter deadline is November 25th.

Events – Joyce Helstrom – We had a wonderful potluck luncheon. Another one will be planned. The tea at Tilly Mint's was a very nice day. Moda Blockheads has been held on Saturdays. Joyce is still taking sign-ups for the Holiday Dinner at Plumsteadville Inn on December 1st. There will be a short meeting of the Executive Board beginning at 6:00 p.m. prior to the dinner.

Historian/Ambassador – Nancy Williams – We still need four more people so that we can order members' copies of the yearbook. Only six people have signed up so far.

Sunshine – Dee Carr – Dee has not heard of anyone that needs a card. Website – Marilyn Malik – Marilyn has been very busy putting Philanthropy and "How to Make Stuff" on the website. Also, there is a quick guide at the top of the calendar page which lists upcoming events/activities.

Publicity/Crafts – Liz Watson – There will be a sit and sew on November 13th. We will be making rope bowls, project bags and a boxy zippered bag. There are sign-up sheets in the back.

Barbara Lewis thanked everyone for making deliveries and helping out. Kit Holmes said that this would be her last meeting as her husband has asked her to sacrifice one of her activities. Carol said that she could join on Zoom since her dues have been paid for this year.

Quilt Show – Marilyn Lopez/Marilyn Malik – "M&M" thanked everyone for their donations for the boutique and expressed a special thank you to Bonnie Rice and Lois Moore for their amazing donations. Help is needed for folding and pricing fabric. Please contact Janet Liples if you can help. Janet will provide you with dates and times.

Please pick up your raffle tickets if you have not already done so. If possible, please return your ticket money at the December meeting.

Barb Sarafinas spoke about registering quilts to be displayed in the show. Last time we had about 90 quilts on display. Barb distributed forms for registering quilts. You can fill out as many as you wish but please designate a primary quilt as she can't guarantee how many quilts each can have included. We will display as many as possible.

Suzette Trucksess said that she and Joyce will be working on the consignment shop. They will take anything sewing related, such as sewing machines, chairs, accessories. She has forms for submitting items. For any item over \$50 you should put whether that price is firm or negotiable and put the minimum amount that would be acceptable. The guild will take 10% of the sale price. Sue Clark will be in charge of signing up volunteers. She will have sign-up sheets available at the December meeting. There will be teams of people to hang quilts and take them down.

Eileen Witowski showed some minis to give members ideas. We will do early ticket sales for guild members.

Marilyn Malik said there are also examples of minis on the website. There will be room for 80 minis at the show.

Old Business:

Carol spoke about the plan for exiting in case of a fire or other emergency. The Pastor told her that there is emergency lighting that comes on. Carol will also obtain three flashlights and pointed out which exits we would use. We will meet outside in the parking lot ten feet from the building.

Also, the membership committee will take with them the meeting attendance form so that we can check to make sure everyone is out of the building.
