There will be a space to show the finished projects at the Quilt Show. Members will be exchanging their Ohio Star blocks at the December meeting. Historian/Ambassador – Nancy Williams – At our meetings, Nancy tries to meet new people upstairs and help them find somewhere to sit downstairs. The Yearbook is being circulated for members to look at. Softcover copies can be made available for \$25 for an 8.5 x 8.5 copy or about \$35 for a 10 x 10. If there is enough interest, she will start a sign-up sheet at the next meeting

Membership – Helen Haun/Lois Moore – There were 57 members in attendance at this meeting, as well as one new member and two guests.

Philanthropy – Barbara Lewis/Barb Gleason – Barbara thanked everyone for the projects they brought in. Next Thursday, September 18th, will be our monthly Sew Day and they will also be trying to make kits. We had a request from Neshaminy Manor for fidget quilts. Items should be sewn on by machine so that they are secure, with fleece or flannel being used for backing. Barbara also thanked members who made Angel baby blankets. We can still accept more. The Baby Bureau would like them to be 35 x 35. She also requested anyone going to the Oaks Quilt Show to take letters to be given to vendors requesting donations.

Website – Marilyn Malik – Marilyn added directions at the bottom of the Philanthropy page for making fidget quilts.

Quilt Show – Marilyn Lopez/Marilyn Malik – A meeting has been set up for all the committees. A video has been made for folding fabric to be sold at the Quilt Show. It is at the bottom of the Philanthropy page. We will have a box for scrap fabrics, which do not need to be folded. Also, we have neons to distribute if someone can take some to the Oaks Quilt Show.

Crafts – Marilyn Lopez – The demo nights have been successful. The next one is scheduled for September 22nd. Dates to be determined for October, November and December.

Marilyn Malik asked that members remember to pick up their envelope of raffle tickets tonight. Also, remember to work on your mini quilts. The dimensions should be no more than 80 inches but can be any shape and should have a hanging sleeve as well as a label with your name and the year. For the boutique, we need shelves for displaying items. If anyone has anything, we would like to borrow it. Joyce explained that we would like to have a consignment space for items that you would like to sell. The details are still being worked out. The guild would receive 10% of what you get for the item. We would prefer that it be craft related; we will come up with a form to be used.

It includes tickets to sell and some neons & pictures to give out and promote our Quilt Show. 1 ticket for \$1 or 6 tickets for \$5 for a chance to WIN! the beautiful quilt that our own guild designed & created. Neon advertisements have been provided at the Oaks show and the Lancaster show, and will also be

given at the Allentown Show in October. If you haven't picked up your envelope yet, please check with Dee Carr, Mary Finley or Mary Beth Hoff at the next guild meeting.

Vendors & consignment ~

At this year's Quilt Show we will be offering a Consignment Shop. Members may bring quilting/craft related items they would like to sell. This includes kits, finished quilts, sewing supplies, machines, sewing chairs, etc. You will be given a seller number and will be asked to set the price for any item(s) you want to sell. All items must be securely labeled with your seller's number and the price of the item. Do not use any form of tape to price your item(s). You will be asked to complete a form with your seller number, name, contact information, description of the item, and the asking price. For those items over \$50 indicate whether the price is firm, and if not firm, the minimum price you are willing to accept. The Guild will be collecting 10% of the selling price. All unsold items must be picked up at the end of the show. Each seller will be provided a check or Venmo transaction after the Treasurer reviews the sales sheets. Suzette Trucksess will be working with Joyce Helstrom on the consignment shop.
