### **COUNTY LINE QUILTERS GENERAL MEETING MINUTES 3-10-2025**



The meeting was called to order by President Carol Cotter at 7:00 p.m. The

meeting was held at Doylestown Mennonite Church, Doylestown, PA. President Carol Cotter welcomed everyone to the meeting.

Vice President Stella Bredin introduced the speaker, Lois Mease, who spoke about Color Confidence for Quilters.

Ellen Cicak spoke about the results of the Weigh to Go Challenge. Thirtythree members participated and made 1,019 items for Philanthropy, as follows:


