Now Is THE TIME TO REGISTER YOUR QUILT FOR OUR SHOW!

Our May show is fast approaching and we need you to submit your quilt registration forms so we can begin planning the show layout. Even if your quilt is not 100% finished, you should register it now. You'll have time to finish the quilting, binding etc. before May. Our goal is to have every member represented. Your entry doesn't have to be a really large quilt. We welcome wall hangings, table toppers, baby quilts, laps quilts, etc. We welcome quilters of all abilities, from beginners to professionals. So print out those forms and get them returned to Gloria Tafel or Barb Sarafinas!

At our February meeting, based on the number of registrations received, we'll let you know whether members can submit a second quilt. Also, all quilts should have some sort of label on the back. Large bed quilts are best hung by a sleeve. The sleeve can be temporary or permanent (see PDF instruction sheet from AQS for reference) Smaller quilts do not require a sleeve.

MYSTERIOUS QUILT PART 2

This article is a follow-up to the previous story about the mysterious quilt that was found in the closet at the Baptist Church where we hold our meetings. I spent most of the snow day we just experienced on the phone with older members and founders of our guild, pursuing the origin of the quilt, and who was responsible for the hand quilting. I think I have solved the mystery! In the process, I learned quite a bit about the early years of our Guild.

Helen Devlin was a delight to talk to. She is 96 years old and still quilting! She goes every Tuesday to Carversville Church and quilts with others on a quilt donated to the church. Louise Geesamen is 81 years old and has fond memories of the Crazy 12 group within the CLQ organization. She was also part of a group of just Montgomery County women called The Material Girls. She is a past president. Back then, when the Board met, it was a dinner meeting. She still goes to OC New Jersey with several of the ladies twice a year! Barbara Harrison is 85 years old and was part of group called The Charm Girls when charm squares were a new thing. They would meet and exchange them to increase their stash. She still is a very active quilter and didn't start quilting until she was 52! Her group within the guild was called The Time Travelers.

Back to the question of who quilted our mysterious quilt. There are two theories: Back then, when there was a quilt to be quilted, someone would take it home and hand quilt it as much as they could in one month. It was then returned the next month and another person would take it home and work on it. The other theory is that members met at someone one's home each month and quilted it

together. So, in the end, more than one person finished our lovely quilt. It was a collaborative effort! The quilt was designed by Pat Gottshalk around the year 1992-1993 and she created the logo in the center.

Quilt Exhibit at the Schwenkfelder Museum

Beginning September 22nd and running through May 2024, the Schwenkfelder Library and Heritage Center in Pennsburg PA will feature an exhibit of Nancy Roan's quilts: "A Loving Tribute To a Quilty Lady: Nancy Roan's Quilts"

Nancy was a prolific quilter, instrumental in documenting quilts of the Southeast Pennsylvania region through her book "Lest I Shall Be Forgotten", a founding member of the Variable Stars Quilt Guild, and documentarian of Pennsylvania German life and traditions. She passed away earlier this year and the museum is honoring her memory with this exhibit of some of her quilts.

Admission to the museum, located at 105 Seminary Street Pennsburg PA, is FREE with donations appreciated. Open daily except for Mondays.

<u>Do You Know Anyone That Could Use This Quilting Table?</u> Please email shortsfamily@aol.com

Gina doesn't need one of her quilting tables any more and we're wondering if anyone in the guild could use it. The left and right sides of the table can either be put up or folded down. If a side is put up, it's supported by a leg that can roll/fold to the center and out of the way when the side is put down. A picture is attached with the left side up and the right side down.

When the left and right sides are both up, it's 59 inches wide x 36 inches deep. When both sides are down, it's 13.25 inches wide x 36 inches deep. It's 35.5 inches tall.

If you have any questions about it, please let us know. Also, if nobody can use it, that's fine, we just wanted to check before doing something else with it.
